Last week's sermon was the inaugural message for 2019. Pastor Ben Lee exhorted the church to have a fresh start with God, and to look ahead to greater things in God.

This week's sermon kicks off a four-part series on the book of Haggai, which was a call to the Israelites – a call to build.

Background - Return from exile

In 606 BC, the Israelites were exiled from the kingdom of Judah by the Babylonians. In the process, the Temple was destroyed. In 538 BC, the first group of Israelites returned to Judah, and work soon commenced to rebuild the Temple. However, there was Samaritan opposition to the rebuilding effort and the work stopped for 15 years. Meanwhile, the Israelites continued building their own houses and settling down in their own lives. Rebuilding the temple was no longer a priority. It was in this context that Haggai brought a message from God to the Israelites: it was time to rebuild God's Temple.

Pastor Ernie drew three lessons from this passage.

1. Discipline

Verse 6 describes the plight of the Israelites: They sow but harvest little. They eat and drink but are never filled. They are clothed but are never warm. They earn wages but lose it very quickly. In short, they were ineffective in whatever they put their hands to do. This was the consequences of the Israelites not putting *first things first*: they neglected to rebuild God's Temple. Instead, building their own houses, they focused on their own comfort.

Pastor Ernie used his own household as an illustration of what discipline means. When his children do not obey him, there are consequences to bear. It is similar in God's household. When the Israelites failed to obey the Lord, they bore the consequence of that failure. God disciplines those He loves, just as a good father should

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(Heb 12:6). However, Pastor Ernie encouraged us, saying that the purpose of God's discipline is not to make us suffer, but to mature us into His likeness.

Are you experiencing repeated failure or not getting the breakthrough that you desire? Maybe God wants to grow us into His likeness. Dear friend, do not despise His loving discipline.

2. Priorities

Why was the Temple so important to God that He disciplined them for not rebuilding it? In Exo 25:8, God specifically commanded the Israelites to build Him a Temple "that I may dwell among them". The Temple was central to the Israelites' worship of God. Even so, when the Israelites returned from exile, they neglected to rebuild it. Pastor Ernie drew our attention to the self-deception of the Israelites: the Temple was simply not a priority to the Israelites.

What about us? Are our priorities in the right place? Are we deceiving ourselves about the priorities in our lives? Do we focus on building our careers, always wanting to earn more money to improve our standard of living, to the extent of ignoring to build God's house? None of these ambitions are wrong in and of themselves, but if the house of God is neglected due to this, then we do not have our priorities in the right place. Pastor Ernie exhorts us to awaken from self-deception. God must always take first place in our lives.

How does it look like when we put God first? Pastor Ernie gave us two thoughts to reflect and act upon:

- 1. <u>Build your spiritual house</u>. 1 Cor 3:16 reminds us that we are God's temple and that His Spirit dwells in us. We build our spiritual house when we make God the focus and centre of our lives.
- 2. <u>Build your church</u>. In this day and age of consumeristic Christianity, Pastor Ernie encouraged us to not be a consumer, but a builder. Commit to building your church. Commit to building RiverLife Church.

3. The Glory of God

In verse 8, God says to the Israelites to build the temple "that I may take pleasure in it and that I may be glorified". The reason why we want God to take first place in our lives is so that **He may be glorified**. This must be our primary motive. Do people see God in our church, in our personal lives?

As we put first things first, God will be glorified and we will delight in Him.

Discussion Questions

1. It has been 2 – 3 weeks since the beginning of 2019. What are some things that you want to thank God for in 2019, so far? [10 min]

2. Read Haggai 1:2-4. God drew a contrast between what is being done for God's Temple and their own houses. The Jews got their priorities wrong. Reflect and share on how our choices and actions can sometimes similarly reflect this. [10 mins]
