SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Understand how ungodly behaviours are developed.
- 2. Desire to deal with their ungodly behaviours and inner hurts (through RTF) so that they can be free and whole.

SERMON SUMMARY

For many Christians, their growth in maturity is halted because of their inner hurts. Inner hurts can form ungodly beliefs and emotions (which serve as open doors for demonic oppression), resulting in ungodly behaviour. Our inheritance from Christ's death and resurrection is abundant life and authority over the kingdom of darkness. Our

inheritance is not lust, rage, pride, addiction, etc. These are bondages that Christ has overcome for us. Inner healing and wholeness from inner hurts is a right we have as children of God.


SERMON RECAP

Our goal as disciples of Christ is to become like Him. Christ is perfect, whole and free. A relationship with God still rooted in bondage to unforgiveness, ungodly beliefs, demonic oppression is not a thriving one. Jesus died on the cross to set us free from all these.

The spiritual formation of a disciple towards maturity-in-Christ is often hindered by unattended emotional hurts, unresolved inner struggles, ungodly beliefs in their minds, spiritual oppressions and footholds, and other entrenchments.

1. How We Develop Inner Hurts

When a hurtful event happens, we develop a painful memory. If this memory is not dealt with properly,
it creates ungodly beliefs and ungodly emotions. These can open the door for demonic oppression in
our lives. Ultimately, all of these will develop ungodly behaviours in an individual.



- Ps Ernie gave the example of Saul and David (<u>1 Samuel 18:6-10</u>). Saul was hurt by the comparison between him and David (thousands vs ten of thousands). Jealousy then develops (ungodly emotion), and Saul suspects that David wants to be king and usurp him (ungodly belief). It then became a stronghold for demonic oppression "harmful spirit" (v10) which resulted in a murderous intent towards David (ungodly behaviour).
- Sin is not just wrong actions. It is also a state. It involves un-surrendered areas of our minds and emotions to God, such as holding on to sinful beliefs and emotions and thus, rejecting the transformative healing power of the Holy Spirit. This is what it means to live in a state of sin.

2. Our Spiritual Inheritance

- When Adam and Eve sinned, they forfeited their dominion over this earth, and Satan became the holder
 of authority. However, Jesus defeated Satan at the cross and at His resurrection (<u>Matthew 28:18-19</u>),
 reclaiming back believers' authority.
- Believers are in the midst of a spiritual war for authority in our lives. Satan steals, kills, and destroys us

 his only goal is to deceive us to keep us in bondage so that we cannot experience the abundant life that Jesus has bought for us (<u>John 10:10</u>). The devil does all that he can to deceive us to surrender our authority and stay in bondage. If we do not acknowledge this war, we have already been deceived. Believers have the authority to evict the demonic spirit/stronghold so that real change can take place. We must exercise that authority.
- "Healing and restoration" is about going to God with the hurtful memories, healing the painful emotions, and removing the ungodly belief system, thereby releasing the person to act in ways Christ desires (liberty). This is our right and inheritance as God's children.

3. Fruits of Inner Healing

- When healing occurs, the individual is slowly released from dysfunction and brokenness, possible demonic bondage and oppression, and sinful behaviour. This frees the individual to respond to continuous transformational work of growth by the Holy Spirit towards Christlikeness.
- As the individual submits to the work of the Holy Spirit, he/she will live in the spirit and not in the flesh. He/she will then experience the fruits of the Holy Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23).
- Freedom always leads to greater intimacy. Having the freedom to be open to God enables us to experience the intimacy with Him that we were made for.

4. Conclusion

- Ps Ernie ended the sermon with the restoration of Peter (<u>John 21</u>). Peter was greatly ashamed after he denied Christ thrice, and he returned to his old life (fishing). He probably thought that he was not worthy enough to be a follower of Christ. However, Christ restored Peter by acknowledging his inner hurt and ungodly beliefs and behaviour and then working in him. Christ was willing to come down to Peter's level and to start with where Peter was.
- No matter how bad our ungodly behaviours and inner hurts are, Jesus is willing to meet us there and to start His work of restoration and healing. Go to Jesus for your healing!

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. What are some possible hurts you experienced as a child that has shaped certain behaviours today? [10 Mins]
- 2. What prevents you from dealing with the behaviours you know are ungodly and not pleasing to the Lord? [10 Mins]
- 3. How should you live knowing that there is a war in the spiritual realms for your mind, emotions, and body? [15 Mins]



Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- We will desire to deal with ungodly behaviours and inner hurts to be free and whole.
- We will walk alongside the Holy Spirit and use our God-purchased authority to persevere in our healing.

2. COVID-19 in Singapore

- a. The sudden rise in community infections to be halted (esp. the Bukit Merah cluster).
- b. Pray that the spread of the Delta variant will be stopped as well.
- c. Continued progress in Singapore to overcome the negative economic and social impact of the current crisis.
- d. Pray for those whose livelihood have been directly impacted by this pandemic especially those in F&B.

3. COVID-19 in the World

- a. A swift end to the COVID-19 crisis globally, especially in India and the rest of South Asia.
- b. Healing and comfort for those who are sick and suffering.
- c. Protection and guidance for healthcare professionals at the frontline; giving them wisdom, courage, and strength to confront this crisis.
