SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Remember that our resources are entrusted to us for God's purposes.
- 2. Turn our faith into faithfulness by using our resources to expand God's kingdom.
- 3. Be prepared to give an account to our Master on the day of His return.

SERMON SUMMARY

Jesus calls for our faithfulness as we await His return. His parable of the talents (or spiritual opportunities) in Matthew 25:14-30 contrasts faithfulness and unfaithfulness. The first two servants are faithful. The third servant is not. Our faithfulness or lack of faithfulness reveals the true nature of our relationship with God. Jesus generously rewards those who faithfully steward what He has entrusted to us for His purposes on earth, and He rebukes those who do not. What we do now determines how we will spend eternity.

As disciples of Christ, we:

- 1. Have received opportunities from God (vv14-15)
- 2. Are called to be faithful (vv16-17, 20-23)
- 3. Will be held accountable when He returns (vv18-19, 24-30)

SERMON RECAP

Pastor Ben continues in this end times series with a focus on Jesus' third parable in Matthew 25. Called the parable of the talents – or the parable of spiritual opportunities – Jesus is using this story to call us to prepare for His return.

This parable is a call to action. But many in the church are sleeping. Many are saying, "Jesus is not coming back any time soon. I'll do my own thing and only do just the minimum to get by." But Christ is calling for faithfulness now, not later. But being faithful is not a natural part of our human heart. Our heart has been corrupted by sin. We are tempted to flirt with the world. We are tempted to play church. Life lulls us into complacency and laziness. However, faithfulness is an attribute of God and He requires the same from us. His steadfast dependability and loyalty to us should motivate us to be stay faithful to Him. Let us keep our hearts tender and responsive as we learn three important lessons from Jesus' parable.

1. We've Received Opportunities From God (vv14-15)

Every Christian is given a personal responsibility by our Master. We are the servants in the parable. He assesses the abilities of the servants and He matches His resources and opportunities to their abilities. "To whom much is given, much will be required" (<u>Luke 12:48</u>). No one is better than the other person in God's eyes. We are all equal and we are called to be faithful in using all that He has given us.

The "talents" in the story are our God-given opportunities to do good works for Him. They can be our spiritual gifts, influence, privileges, money, health, time, knowledge, intellect, abilities, etc. These are resources entrusted to us as "capital for the family business", i.e., the Great Commission (Matthew 28:16-20). We are responsible to make the most of what we have been given. It's not how much we have, but what we do with what we have that matters.

2. We Are Called To Be Faithful (vv16-17, 20-23)

The three servants fall into two categories – faithful and unfaithful. The first two servants were faithful. They took their resources and immediately went to work. They were enthusiastic about their friendship with their master and they were grateful for the privilege to serve him. And they made full use of the opportunities. Both were faithful in the sphere they were placed in, and they did the best with what was given them.

For their faithfulness, the two servants received the same commendation, regardless of their production. They were rewarded with more responsibilities in the kingdom and in eternity. They started out as servants but God promoted them to rulers. Faithful servants will experience the Master's joy and enjoy the Father's rewards. "Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with much" (Luke 16:10). For those of us who don't enjoy serving the Lord in faith, we will not enjoy Heaven. Our eternal destiny depends on what we do now. If we are faithful to make every moment count, serving the Lord while we wait for His return, and using our spiritual gifts, then we will be rewarded.

3. We Will Be Held Accountable (vv18-19, 24-30)

The core of the parable focuses on the third servant. Like the first two, God holds him accountable as well. This means there is a day of accountability for all of us. This will happen when Jesus returns, and He will examine our hearts. As the third servant gives his account, he exposes the attitude of his own heart. He excuses his doing nothing

by blaming his master. In the same way, we sometimes shift the blame to God for our own inaction by complaining of our lack of resources. In His assessment of this servant, Jesus is talking about people who appear to be His servants, but in their lives, do not live like servants of the King. This is Jesus' warning to those who say they are Christians but do not live like followers of Christ. He will then remove all opportunities for service from them.

There is also a deep tension found in <u>verse 30</u> where Jesus talks about the images of hell. No one likes a message about hell. No one likes to hear that they might be going to hell. But in RiverLife, we preach every verse in the Bible, not just the popular ones. In this shocking verse, Jesus sends the servant to eternal torment in darkness for his unfaithfulness. But hell is never meant for humans – it's designed for Satan and the demons. Therefore, we must take Jesus' warning seriously. He will not judge us based on someone else's unfaithfulness. He will judge us based on our own unfaithfulness.

Conclusion

As the Bride of Christ, we do not want to be a part-time lovers. Some of us may not be the most gifted people on earth, but whatever we do have, we want to give it fully to God. We want to live for Him, not for ourselves. Let us turn our faith into faithfulness, because faithfulness always acts. When Christ returns, may He find us active, working for the Kingdom, walking by faith, stewarding every resource He has given us for His kingdom. Our faithfulness or unfaithfulness will reveal the true nature of our relationship with God.

- 1. What do you think are some of your own God-given resources and gifts? (Time, money, education, witness opportunities, etc.) How have you utilised these resources for God's kingdom, and how have you sharpened your gifts over the years? [15 Mins]
- 2. Take a few minutes to do this self-evaluation in the cell. [15 Mins]
 - a. Estimate the percentage of your opportunities (spiritual gifts, privileges, education, abilities, etc.) that you're using right now for God.

3. What stewardship step is God calling you to take right now? (In your family, career, community, church) What may be holding you back?



Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- We will evaluate all that God has given us and steward them faithfully for God's Kingdom.
- We will increase the urgency of our watchfulness and the intimacy of our worship.
- We will witness to our lost loved ones and disciple them to await with us for Jesus' return.

2. COVID-19 in Singapore

- God's intervention as we experience a sharp increase in the number of community cases and a return to tighter social measures in society.
- God's hand to alleviate the sufferings, and for practical help to arise and be rendered to these suffering communities, especially the old and the vulnerable.

3. Exam Period

- Pray for all our children who are going through their exams.
- Pray for the parents of these children as well for strength, wisdom and grace.

4. COVID-19 in the World

- A swift end to the COVID-19 crisis globally, if not a sharp reduction in cases, and a stabilised environment where humans and virus coexist.
- Healing and comfort for those who are sick and suffering.
- Protection and guidance for healthcare professionals at the frontline, giving them wisdom, courage, and strength to confront this crisis.
