SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Understand that God desires us be a church and people that positions ourselves, to be drenched by the tears of Jesus.
- 2. Be challenged to discover God's tears for themselves and position themselves to become God's channel of love wherever they are.

SERMON SUMMARY

Catching the heart of God for Missions is just as important as getting involved in missions and reaching the nations. Have our hearts caught up with the very heart of God? We serve a God who grieves for His lost children. Have we been drenched by His tears and by what pains His heart as we see painful world events unfolding before us? How can we position ourselves to be drenched by God's tears?

SERMON RECAP

1. The Grieving God

- Have we ever been found in a place where we have been drenched by the tears of God, the tears of heaven?
- We serve a heartbroken God who grieves for His people. In fact, God outweeps His people!
- In Hebrews 5:7, we read while Jesus was on earth, he often offered up prayers and petitions with fervent cries and tears. In <u>Isaiah 53:3</u>, we read that Jesus was familiar with grief and sorrows.
 - The Greek meaning of the words "fervent cries" indicates a "cry birthed out of pure pain and anguish". It is a cry that is "rung out" of a person because of the state of pain the person is in.
- "If you are ever tempted to think that God doesn't care about your sorrow and your suffering, you don't know the God I know." Skip Heitzig

2. The Occasions Jesus Wept In The Gospels

• Jesus wept for a sinful, fallen world at the Garden of Gethsemane (Luke 22:39-44).



- Gethsemane means "Olive press". It was the place where Olives were being crushed or pressed to produce olive oil. Here, Jesus was in the "garden of crushing, of pressing". To the point sweat like drops of blood began to flow and fall to the ground.
- Jesus agonized as the entire weight of the world was placed on him. He agonized with utter distress for the prospect of bearing the sins of all mankind.
- The garden was a place of agony and pain, but the garden was also a place of great intercession and prayer. Are you in a garden of pressing today? This is also the time to start praying.
- Jesus wept for the City of Jerusalem (Luke 19:41-44).
 - The way Jesus wept for the city of Jerusalem was different from the way he wept for His friends (at the tomb where Lazarus died in John 11).
 - In <u>John 11</u>, the Greek word used means "to shed a tear with gentle emotions involved."
 - In <u>Luke 19</u>, Luke used a far stronger word to describe the pain and grief Jesus felt. Luke used the strongest possible word here in <u>Luke 19</u> to describe the agony and the pain that stemmed from Jesus' cries. The meaning of weeping in <u>Luke 19</u> was to "sob bitterly, uncontrollably".
- What was Jesus crying for?
 - Jesus wept for those who had rejected Him and who did not recognize him
 - Jesus wept for the agony of a fallen and broken world.
 - Jesus wept for the judgement that was about to come upon Jerusalem (which happened in AD 70).

3. 3 Heartfelt questions Jesus is asking his church today

- Have we positioned ourselves to be drenched by the tears of God?
 - Are we close enough to Jesus to receive His heart, pain, anguish, and tears for the world and for His people? Can we feel His pulse and His heart? Or are we still far away from His heart?
 - A weeping God demands a weeping people. God wants His church to learn how to cry again; to weep over the sufferings and the pain of this fallen world.
 - "It seems to me that the more I long for the coming of Christ, the more I long to see His kingdom extended, the more I shall weep when things go wrong, when I see Christ blasphemed, His cross trampled in the mire, and the devil's kingdom established." Charles Spurgeon
- Have we found our calling yet?
 - We find our calling when we find the tears of Jesus. When you find ourselves being drenched by the tears of God – that is where you find your calling.
 - E.g. Isaiah heard the voice of God calling "who shall we send and who will go for us?" Isaiah stood at the very place where he was drenched by the tears of heaven.
 - True miracles occur when the tears of God meet willing and surrendered lives.
 - O Go where the tears are found!
 - What will you do, with the tears of Jesus?



4. Conclusion

- God wants His church to learn how to weep over the sufferings and pain of this fallen world.
- Miracles and transformational change happen when we (the church) walks into dark places and go where Heaven's tears are found

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. We serve a weeping, grieving God. The gospels detail occasions of Jesus weeping (<u>Luke 19:41-44</u>, <u>Luke 22:39-44</u>) for the sufferings of people and a sinful world. When was the last time you felt the pain and anguish that God feels concerning His lost children? Share an occasion where you found yourself drenched by God's tears and what pains His heart.
- 2. God wants His church to learn how to weep over the sufferings and pain of this fallen world. For those who desire to discover their calling in life, Ps Joachim urged us to go where the tears are found. Are you close enough to Jesus to feel His pulse and His heart for the lost? How can we position ourselves to be drenched by God's tears and feel his heart regardless of where we are?
- 3. "Change happens when we (the church) walk into dark places" Steve Brown. Ps Joachim shared how various initiatives by RiverLifers in 2021 (e.g. Missions From Home) had deeply impacted the poor and hungry in our neighbouring countries, helping them tide through the COVID-19 crisis. What can we do in 2022 to be a channel of God's love to the lost and needy, both individually and as a cell?

WORKS

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- God to help us be a church and people that positions ourselves, to be drenched by the tears of Jesus.
- God to help us discover His tears and do something about them by e.g. placing ourselves in estates and homes of those in need, where we find the tears of God

2. COVID-19 in Singapore

- Praise God's protection on our nation from the virus.
- Pray for God's strength on our nurses and healthcare workers as they manage the influx of cases.

3. War in Ukraine

• Pray for Russia and Ukraine to enter into peace negotiations.



- Pray for the safety of all Ukrainians especially the churches there.
- Pray for a swift end to the invasion.

4. Opportunities for Outreach

• Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.
