



12 JUN 2022 | LAM ZHENGXIN | HOSTING GOD'S PRESENCE EXODUS 40:33-35; PSALM 132:3-5; EPHESIANS 2:19-22; 1 PETER 2:5; PSALM 27:4

SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Reflect on the privilege on being set apart to be His temple.
- 2. Take steps to actively host the presence of God in our lives

SERMON SUMMARY

From Moses to King David, and from King Solomon to the prophets, the tabernacle and the temple have been the central features of the Israelites. God has purposed us as His people to host His presence. As RiverLifers, have we embraced our identity as the temple of God?

- We are the Priesthood and we host the presence of God by worshipping Him (1 Peter 2:5)
- We are the temple of God and host His presence by keeping the temple holy (1 Cor 3:16-17, 2 Cor 6:14-17)
- We host the presence of God by seeking His face and not His hand (Psalm 27:4)

SERMON RECAP

From Moses to King David, and from King Solomon to the prophets, the tabernacle and the temple have been the central features of the Israelites.

The Bible notes how God desires to dwell with man once again. God called Abraham in <u>Genesis 12</u> and Abraham's family grew to a huge nation. In Exodus, Moses issued God's command to let His people go for the purpose of worship (<u>Exodus 8:1b</u>) God reminded them of their purpose (<u>Exodus 19:5-6a</u>) and instructed them to set up the tabernacle (<u>Exodus 40:1-4</u>; <u>33-35</u>).

When David became King, he brought back the Ark of the Covenant. He recognised that the nation of Israel hosting the presence of the living God set them apart from the rest of the nations (<u>Psalm 132:3-5</u>, <u>2 Samuel 7:2</u>). The temple was completed during Solomon's reign (<u>1 Kings 8:10-11</u>).

Though the temple was later destroyed, we learn from the prophets Ezekiel and Isaiah that God's Spirit would now dwell in human flesh (<u>Ezekiel 36:26</u>, <u>Isaiah 44:3</u>). Zhengxin exhorted us to embrace our identity as the temple of God (<u>Ezekiel 47</u>). We are the Temple of God and our purpose is to host His presence.

How we can host the presence of God:

1) We are the Priesthood and we host the presence of God by worshipping Him (<u>1 Peter 2:5</u>). As we embrace this identity, it changes us to orient to a life of worship unto God. Worship begins with the orientation of our hearts and with beholding God (<u>Psalm 27:4</u>). We can also behold God in His Word.



- 2) We are the temple of God and host His presence by keeping the temple holy. When we live in unrepentant sin, we treat the sacrifice of God with contempt and we no longer walk in His holiness (1 Cor 3:16-17, 2 Cor 6:14-17). There is a call on our lives to be clean and holy. We must be quick to repent and there needs to be sincerity in our repentance. We must walk by the Spirit (Ezekiel 36:26-27).
- 3) We host the presence of God by seeking His face and not His hand (Psalm 27:4).

Brother Lawrence wrote the following:

"That we might accustom ourselves to a <u>continual conversation with God</u>, with freedom and simplicity. That we need only <u>to recognise God intimately present with us</u>, to address ourselves to Him every moment, that we may beg His assistance for knowing His will in things doubtful, and for rightly performing those which we plainly see He requires of us, <u>offering them to Him before we do them</u>, and giving Him thanks when we have done."

- Fourth conversation in The Practice of the Presence of God.

David wrote Psalm 27 in difficult times. He prioritised seeking God's face over seeking God's hand. May we be a Church that chooses to host His presence and live His calling for us.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. Have you hosted someone or was a guest of someone hospitable? What was your experience? What are the attitudes we need to have as we choose to host the presence of God? [15 mins]
- 2. How have we been as stewards of God's temple? What are the things in our lives that hinder or help us in being a good steward? [15 mins]
- 3. What does it mean to live a lifestyle of worship and holiness and of seeking God? How can we as a cell encourage each other in this journey? [15 mins]

WORKS

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- Thank God for the privilege we have to be His temple
- For us to walk in step with the Spirit and with each other as we grow in our faith.

2. COVID-19 in Singapore

- Pray for God's continued protection from the virus.
- Pray for lives and businesses that have been impacted by the pandemic.



3. Russia-Ukraine War

- Pray for a swift end to this war and for the principalities that are influencing this situation to be broken.
- Protection for the people of Ukraine especially those who are believers.

4. Mass Shootings in USA

- Pray for God to comfort the affected families.
- Pray for a change in gun laws in US to facilitate a safer environment in the USA.

5. Opportunities for Outreach

• Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.
