SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- Have a better understanding of why we work and how we should work
- Have practical steps on how to turn their work into worship.

SERMON SUMMARY

As believers, we should have a correct view (theological framework) of work:

- a) Work is good, it is part of God's perfect design for us. (Genesis 2:8 & 15)
- b) As a result of the fall, Scripture says that work became burdensome, especially because we work with fallen people (<u>Genesis 3:17-19</u>). Work is not the curse. The thorns and thistles of work is the curse.
- c) Because of the cross, the motivation, purpose and character we carry in our workplaces should carry a redemptive nature (<u>Romans 6:18-23, 2 Corinthians 5:17</u>)
- d) In heaven, there will still be work. But the work will be enjoyable, fulfilling and life-giving (<u>Revelation 21:1-5</u>)

SERMON RECAP

We are disciples of Christ not just on Sundays, but on Mondays to Saturdays as well. Just as our church services and cell group meetings are meant to be holy ground, our workplaces are also meant to be set apart for God.

Your work would make no sense to you, unless you put it into some kind of narrative. Our society provides a few cultural narratives:

- 1. Work is a means to an end Its only value is to provide income and bring food to the table.
- 2. Work is a necessary evil I work so that I can look forward to the weekend.
- 3. Work as self-fulfilment/self-actualisation I find my worth in my work/I find my identity in my work.
- 4. Secular work has value to the degree it supports sacred work.



Scripture gives us a Biblical narrative for our work – Creation, Fall, Redemption and Restoration. The speaker provided us with a theological framework of work:

a) Work is good, it is part of God's perfect design for us. (Genesis 2:8 & 15)

- In the original creation, God made man to work. Creation was not presented as a finished product in Genesis.
- From God's perspective, the world needs work: it needs to be filled, to be ruled over, to be subdued, to be placed in order. And God has appointed man to do this important work.
- Therefore, work has always been part of God's perfect creation.
- b) As a result of the fall, Scripture says that work became burdensome, especially because we work with fallen people (<u>Genesis 3:17-19</u>).
 - As a result of the fall, Scripture tells us that work will now become burdensome.
 - Work is also difficult because we work with fallen people, and we ourselves are fallen.
 - Work is not the curse. The thorns and thistles of work is the curse.
- c) Because of the cross, the motivation, purpose and character we carry in our workplaces should carry a redemptive nature (<u>Romans 6:18-23, 2 Corinthians 5:17</u>)
 - Jesus has set us free from the power of sin this should transform the way we work the character we carry into our workplaces, the motivation for our work and the purpose of our work.
 - As a new creation, we are already part of God's restoration plan to bring all of creation back to what it once was, where work would be a gift, without the thorns and thistles that sin has corrupted work to be.
- d) In the new heaven and earth, there will still be work. But the work will be enjoyable, fulfilling and life-giving (<u>Revelation 21:1-5</u>)
 - At the end of history, there will be a new heaven and a new earth.
 - We will continue to rule and reign with Christ stewarding this new creation with God and working to bring about its prosperity and well-being.
 - There will be work in the new heaven and new earth.

There are 2 application points that were provided during the sermon:

a) Our work becomes worship when it is done unto the Lord (Colossians 3:22-24)

- When we work, we need to remember the bigger story line, that we are participating in the creation mandate.
- We need to understand that the work we do pleases God, and that is why we can do this unto the Lord. This is why we can work, as working for the Lord, and not for human masters

b) Our work becomes worship when it is done with kingdom values

- This means that God is our ultimate master, and the way we do our work should be aligned to his value system, the value system of the Kingdom of God.
- God desires us to do our work excellently, with all of our heart, because we are working for Him.



DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. Share with the cell your current approach towards your work. Do you look forward to it? Do you think you are being God's "light" in your workplace? Is there a purpose in your work in light of the kingdom?
- 2. Zheng Xin shared that as redeemed people, we have been set free from the power of sin and this should transform how we work. Why is it then that so many believers still struggle to work in a way that brings glory to God?
- 3. In light of that, what is one thing you need to change in your approach towards work in order to turn your work into worship?

PRAYER

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- For us to turn our work into worship be instilling kingdom values in our work
- For us to have a kingdom motivation towards our work.

2. COVID-19 in Singapore

- Pray for God's protection especially from the Omicron variant.
- Pray that the community cases will be low.

3. World

- A swift end to the COVID-19 crisis globally, if not a reduction in cases in third world nations, and a stable environment where humans and virus coexist.
- Pray for peace especially in areas of conflict (Ukraine) and potential conflict
 China & Taiwan.

• Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.
