SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

1. Reflect on God's sovereignty and His purpose in our lives
2. Recognise that God's healing power is real.

SUMMARY OF SPEAKER'S TESTIMONY

Pastor Jason shared about his own testimony of pain and suffering from brain cancer and how Jesus miraculously healed him.

In his teens, Ps Jason was a rebellious teenager who often got into trouble with fights, smoking and drinking. Even his own family gave up hope on him. He had first heard the name of Jesus in a church kindergarten, but God caught his attention when his father was about to pass away. As his father was on his deathbed, Ps Jason called on the names of every god he knew but nothing happened. However, when he called on the name of Jesus, his father's eyes opened and he asked his father to follow Jesus. From that point, Ps Jason gave his life to Jesus.

He met his wife, Judith in church, attended the same cell group and started going out together as a couple. Judith had a difficult first marriage and Jason was concerned about taking care of her child with special needs. Two years into their marriage, in 2004, Ps Jason was diagnosed with a rare form of brain cancer. It was so rare then that Ps Jason was the only one in Singapore who had such a brain tumour and there was no known cure nor medication. It felt like a death sentence to Ps Jason. It was a dark time of fear for Ps Jason and Judith. They then spent a lot of time praying and seeking the Lord.

The doctor recommended surgery to remove the tumour. After much prayer and seeking God, Ps Jason took the doctor's advice and went for surgery as he believed that God also heals through medication and surgery. After the 20-hour surgery, the doctors told Ps Jason that he only had 6 months to live as the cancer had already spread to the main artery. He was also left deaf in one ear due to the damage caused by the tumour. Nonetheless, Ps Jason was thankful to God that he could eat, talk and see despite the operation. 6 months later, Ps Jason went back to see the doctor and he was surprised that Ps Jason was still alive. But there was a 95% chance of relapse, hence the need to go for annual check-ups.

From 2004 to 2007, the Lord told Ps Jason and Judith to go into the nations to glorify His Name. The first country that God brought them to was Pakistan. He gave his testimony there that he was going to die but he still chose to say that God is good and that Jesus is His Lord. The people in Pakistan were very encouraged as the Pakistanis faced a lot of persecution.

In 2007, Ps Jason had a relapse and the doctor told him that everything must be removed, hence he would not be able to swallow, talk nor see and would have paralysis on his entire left side. That was not an option for Ps Jason as it would mean that he could not do ministry anymore. Even though he had to endure increasing pain and suffering, he continued to work even harder for missions work. This was also the time when Ps Jason and Judith started their business, Olive Vine, which the Lord led them to setup to finance their missions all over Asia, where they work with the hungry, poor, widowed and fatherless. Ps Jason continued to thank God that He had sustained him all the way over the 10 years of fighting cancer, without getting into depression. Even in pain, Ps Jason would be thanking Jesus and accepted his condition.

From 2007 to 2013, Ps Jason and Judith continued with a lot more mission work, saved many more children and worked very hard. However, Ps Jason's condition continued to deteriorate until he was bedridden. One day, while he was having his quiet time, Ps Jason shared that Jesus said to him, "I am moved by the tears of your wife and I will heal you."

In 2013, he underwent surgery again and after the surgery, he could not see and was in a lot of pain. After 10 years of fighting brain cancer, Ps Jason was at his end, at the bottom. He asked Judith to let him go back and return home to Jesus.

That night, lying on his hospital bed, Jesus came and healed Ps Jason in a miraculous way. He testified of the presence of Jesus and of His holiness when Jesus came, and when Jesus touched his forehead, he fell asleep. The next morning, he was able to get up from his bed and take a bath. His doctor examined him and said it was miraculous to see someone recover so quickly. He was discharged from hospital on the 4th day.

Today, Ps Jason can praise the Lord for His healing. Even as the tumour is now dormant, Ps Jason continues to serve the Lord, to do missions and feed the poor and needy. He shares "To live is Christ. To die is gain", simply put is that his life is not his own and that he has chosen to live this life to be a blessing to many others, and so to live is for Christ. To die is gain means that when he dies, Ps Jason knows that he will be forever in the presence of Jesus.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. After his first surgery, Ps Jason was given only 6 months to live. Yet, he continued to serve the Lord in missions work, going out into the nations saying "Even though I'm going to die, I still choose to stand and say "God is good!". How should we choose to live our lives for Jesus amidst pain, sickness and suffering? How do we trust in the sovereignty of God even when He does not heal immediately?**
- 2. Ps Jason shared his powerful testimony of Jesus' healing. Have you, or someone close to you, experienced healing from a sickness or injury? It could be through prayer or a healing ministry. It could also be through medication or surgery as Ps Jason shared that God also works through medicine. What is important is our trust is God's sovereignty and Jesus' healing power. Share this experience to encourage one another.**
- 3. There is resurrection power in the name of Jesus to bring healing! Do you have any prayer needs for healing of physical illness, emotional pain or mental distress? Break out into smaller groups to pray for one another.**

WORKS

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- Pray that we recognise God's sovereignty in our lives and for us to trust in Him
- Pray for healing in the Cell where there is sickness and pain.

2. COVID-19 in Singapore

- Praise the Lord for the removal of the vaccinated-differentiated measures.
- Pray for God's protection in the midst of a high number of community cases.
- Pray for protection against reinfection and the ill effects that it may bring.

3. World

- A swift end to the COVID-19 crisis globally, if not a reduction in cases in third world nations, and a stable environment where humans and virus coexist.
- Pray for peace especially in areas of conflict (Ukraine) and potential conflict – China & Taiwan.

4. Opportunities for Outreach

- Ask the Lord to bless us as we step out to reach a pre-believer this Christmas.
- Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.
