(1 Corinthians 12:12-30)

Spiritual Objectives

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Embrace one another as uniquely designed and gifted by the Holy Spirit for building up the church.
- 2. Recognise that there is no unimportant member in the body of Christ. All have equal value in the eyes of God.

Sermon Summary

- 1. The physical body is one unit made up of many parts. Likewise, the body of Christ is one entity made up of many members.
- 2. Don't underestimate or overestimate your importance to the body. God gives special honours to the seemingly unimpressive parts, and He gives no special treatment to the clearly presentable parts.
- 3. The diversity in the body works towards unity and fulfillment of God's purposes. We are to desire every gift, not for personal gain, but to bless the body of Christ.

Sermon Recap (Full Summary)

1. As the physical body is one unit made up of many parts, the body of Christ is one entity with many members making up a whole (vv 12-13). When we become Christians, we become "one with Christ", and consequently we become one with everyone else who is one with Christ. Just as the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit are one in the Trinity, and a married couple becomes one in the flesh, we are baptised by one Spirit into one body.



The Holy Spirit now dwells in us as we dwell in Christ. (See Romans 6:3-5)

- 2. Never underestimate your importance to the body (vv 14-20). Don't think lowly of your part in the body. Every part of the body is needed. Even if you are old or ill, and whether you work in the public eye or behind the scenes, you have an important role in God's Kingdom. God knows where we best fit in the body. Every part is critical to fulfilling the mission of God. (See 1 Peter 4:10-11)
- 3. Never overestimate your importance to the body (vv 21-26). There is no room in God's Kingdom for spiritual pride. What we do will affect others in the body of Christ. We are not better because our gifts are more public. We are not less important because our gifts are more behind the scenes.. God gives us the honours as He chooses. When one part of the body is honoured, every part rejoices. When one part suffers, every part grieves.
- 4. The working diversity of our gifts fulfills God's will in the body (vv 27-31). After showing us from the preceding verses that no gift is less important than another, Paul seems to contradict himself by ranking three gifts in order of importance in verse 28. He also says to "eagerly desire" the "greater gifts" in verse 31. To make sense of these verses, we need to recognise that apostles and prophets were essential in the founding of the early church, and teachers were needed to establish believers in the faith, and "greater gifts" were vital for building up the young church.

Conclusion

- 1. We are baptised in one Spirit into one body and given one mission, i.e. to make disciples of all nations.
- 2. We must do away with both a spiritual inferiority complex and a spiritual superiority complex in the body of Christ. There are no nobodies and there are no "super" Christians. We must celebrate the diversity and work for unity in the body.
- 3. Our spiritual gifts give a clue to our calling. But we cannot know what God has given us unless we start to serve. At the same time, we are to desire gifts that will bless one another and build up the church.

Discussion Questions

1. On average, a church typically has only has about 15-20% of its members serving in a ministry. What do you think are some reasons why people shy away from serving in a ministry? What do you think the church would look like if 70% of its members are serving in a ministry? [15 min]

Leader's Notes:

This question serves as an introduction to the topic of diversity of gifts. Encourage your members (those who are not serving) to share on their struggles to serve in a ministry. This is not a time to shame those who are not serving but to understand their struggles. The reasons maybe genuine – nature of job, family life, sicknesses, etc. Also, we want to acknowledge that there are reasons that may not be the best - too busy with life pursuits, serving is for those who are more talented, "I'm not the serving type.", etc.

The second part of the question is to paint the picture of a glorious church. If all of us are



serving regardless of position and strengths – meeting the areas of needs within the church, the church will grow from strength to strength. Which means, more people are built up, more people are reached out, more cells are birthed, more people to meet pastoral needs, etc. In short, the church moves closer to her fullest potential.

Encourage those who are not serving with this – sometimes, we make a decision before trying it out. In a sense, we admit defeat even before we begin. Encourage them to try out serving in a ministry – they might be surprised to learn that they can actually manage their current life-load as well as their ministry. Also, they would then discover the joys of ministry – growing by serving others and participating in the mission of God more. (You can mention the various ministry needs in the church as indicated below)

<u>Transition (Wrapping Up & Moving to The Next Question)</u>

The church can be glorious if all gifts within the house are at use. That is why God gave a variety of gifts so that everyone can be involved in His work in the church. Therefore, last Sunday's message is important for us - no one should feel more important or less important as a result of their gifts.

2. Read 1 Corinthians 12:12-31. Paul addressed two groups of Christians in this passage: Those who underestimate their spiritual gifts and those who overestimate theirs. Have you ever felt like an unneeded or unimportant part of the cell or team? What did you do about it? What would this passage be teaching you to do? [15 min]

Leader's Notes:

This is a reflect and relate question for members to look in the mirror and share how they see themselves in the cell or in the church context. Verses 15-20 are addressed to those who think their gifts are inferior and unimportant. The more spectacular gifts such as speaking in tongues and healing may have been glorified in the church, causing those without these gifts to feel inferior, which may result in the person not serving or even leaving church. Encourage members in this group to never believe this lie but instead embrace all their gifts as equally important in the sight of God. Verses 21-26 are addressed to those who think their gifts are superior and more important. If there is anyone in this group who is willing to confess - first commend the person for being honest! - then exhort everyone to exercise all their gifts, not to appear "spiritual", but for the good of the whole. See 1 Peter 5:1-3 and Hebrews 10:24-25.

<u>Transition (Wrapping Up & Moving to The Next Question)</u>

Everybody is somebody in Christ's body. There are no unimportant or unnecessary parts in a body. All parts, however diverse, have roles to play in building up a unified body to fulfill the purposes of God. Let's commit to play our roles.

3. In light of today's discussion, what mindset do you need to change when you see these 2 groups of believers in the church - those who are talented and very visual, and those who are seemingly less talented and behind the scenes? [15 min]

Leader's Notes:

This is a response question for members to commit to change their patterns of thinking



in reagrds to these 2 groups of people. For the first group, the general response should be not to "idolise" them or to think that they are "more anointed". All the gifts in the house contribute to the purposes of God to build the church. For the seconnd group, the general mindset should be not to overlook these individuals in the church (carpark marshalls, communion preparers, Children's Ministry teachers, etc). Their roles are important for the church to function. Therefore, our hearts of gratitude should extend to them as well; not just to the super-talented few.

RiverLife Church does not stand on just the talents of a few, but on the sacrifice, faithfulness and willingness of the many!

Transition (Wrapping Up, Vision Casting to Cell & Closing The Discussion)

Conclude by reminding members that we are to earnestly desire spiritual gifts (v 31), not for ourselves but to bless others. Although the Holy Spirit gives us the gifts, it is good and proper for us to desire them, and to ask for them, all in submission to the purposes of God.

You might also want to consider doing a cell roster where different members can serve in different aspects of cell (leading worship, leading word, refreshments, prayer, etc) so that we can all use our gifts to strengthen the church!

Let's pray:

- 1. We will grow in unity of purpose and relationship in the cell and in church.
- 2. We will increase in diversity of gifts and calling to bless the body of Christ and the nations.
