## BIBLE READING PLAN [10 min]

Take some time to talk about the Bible Reading Plan. The time of sharing can include the following:

- a) How's everyone's progress so far?
- b) What are some things that God has spoken to you through the various readings?

## WORD [45 min]

#### **Spiritual Objectives**

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Be reminded that we have been saved by Love to love others.
- 2. Take steps to show God's Love to those around us.

#### **Sermon Summary**

The following are the key points of the sermon:

- 1. Jesus will return one day, and we will be judged by how we love.
- 2. We are saved by grace through faith in Christ Jesus, and we who are redeemed by God will manifest our faith in love and action.
- 3. Jesus identifies with the very least and calls us to do the same.

#### **Sermon Recap (Full Summary)**

Pastor Joachim shared from Matthew 25:31-46 and spoke about the imminent return of the King (v31) and the eternal, irreversible judgment that we will face (v32-33).



While it writes that we will be judged by how we love, we must be mindful that doing these acts of love is not a way of earning our salvation. We are saved by grace through faith in Christ Jesus (John 3:16, Ephesians 2:8-9) and we who are redeemed by the Father will manifest the Father's characteristics of love. We are saved by Love to love.

Jesus intimately identifies himself with the very least (v40) when he points out that a deed of love to the poor and hurting is a deed to Christ Himself. Jesus expects us to love and care for the least and the poor among us (v34-36; v41-43)

Faith without action is dead and it is important for the Church to care and love the poor and the least significant amongst us.

Pastor Joachim shared about the first steps we can take

- a) Let us serve the poor by giving to the nations
- b) Let us be involved in #RiverLifeCares
- c) Let us ensure no one in our spiritual family is in need.

#### **Discussion Questions**

1. In the Bible passage (Matthew 25:31-46), Jesus intimately identifies Himself with the very least. What were the ways of love shown in the examples He mentioned? How did Jesus love them and how can we learn from His example? What is the posture of our hearts when we choose to love those around us? [15 min]

#### **Leaders' Notes**

This is a recap and reflect question. Jesus loves the poor, the broken and the very least in society by meeting them at their need. Leaders can take time to ask members to prayerfully seek God to bring to mind a loved one or someone that they have not met for some time whom they can bless. What would it be like to love them and meet them at their need? Leaders can also ask members to examine their heart posture as they love those around them. Members can share about their struggles and joys in expressing love through actions.

#### Transition (Wrapping Up & Moving to The Next Question)

We have been saved by Love to love. Jesus meets us at our need and grants us the same privilege to love those around us. Though there are times it can be difficult, we can look to God to grant us the grace, strength and love we need to love like Him.

2. Share when you were a recipient of someone's love during a time of need, or when you had the opportunity to love someone with God's love. Relate that experience. What were the lessons you learnt from it? [15 min]

#### Leaders' Notes

A relate and reflection question for members to reflect and share about a time when they were blessed by or had blessed others. Members can also share about experiences they may have had serving the poor and needy, be it in the local community or in overseas missions. Leaders can encourage members to share more about the experience. How did they feel when they were the recipients of someone's love and faithful acts of service? How did that inspire them in their own walk? When they were the givers, were there times of difficulty to keep loving (e.g., without outward



appreciation or reciprocal returns)? What kept them going? What did the experiences teach them (as givers or recipients) about the love of God?

## Transition (Wrapping Up & Moving to The Next Question)

We have been blessed to pour out blessings. Pastor Francis Chan shared that True Faith manifests itself through love and actions. The desire to love others is a natural outflow of our faith in Christ. It is not just a command to obey, but a privilege to serve.

3. As a cell, what are some ways we can live out our faith? Also, share some ways we could come together and be involved in the RiverLifeCares initiative. [15 min]

#### Leader's Notes

A response question. Leaders can ask members to think of ideas that they could do to bless others. It could be simple things e.g. taking time to pray for the people in the rental flats or other things (e.g. taking time to bless in practical ways and know a family. Leaders can encourage members also to serve the poor by giving to the nations and looking out for one another in our spiritual family).

#### Closing

This pandemic has affected all of us in different ways. However, we do not need to suffer alone and all of us can be a support and cheer during these difficult times. In these times, may we as a Church rally together, love one another and continue to turn and look to God who is faithful and true, and live out a faith the pleases Him because He loved us when we were one of the least of these, and gives us the privilege to join in loving others like He did.
