



# 26 JUN 2022 | SP BEN KC LEE | THE SPIRIT-FILLED MARRIAGE | EPHESIANS 5:21-33

## **SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES**

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Learn to apply the principle of mutual submission to one another;
- 2. Understand the roles and responsibilities of husbands and wives and that we need to be Spiritfilled in order for us to live out our roles;
- 3. Be reminded that God created marriage to be a living display of the loving relationship between Christ and His bride.

## **SERMON SUMMARY**

We are all disciples of Christ, called to unconditional love and mutual submission to one another. Both singles and married couples need to apply the principle of mutual submission. This is especially true for husbands and wives. If we live our lives to please Christ first, others second and ourselves last, we will be able to build Christ-centered marriages. The Holy Spirit will enable us to live out our roles as husbands and wives – husbands are to put aside your own interest to love and cherish your wives; wives are to willingly respect your husbands.

The earthly marriage between a husband and wife is a shadow of an eternal reality of Christ being wed to the Church. The highest meaning and most ultimate purpose of marriage is to put the covenant relationship of Christ and His Church on display. God has created marriage to be a living display of the loving relationship between Christ and His bride.

## **SERMON RECAP**

Ps Ben began the message by highlighting that marriage should be honoured by everyone. Marriage is defined as a lifelong covenant between one man and one woman. He encouraged RiverLifers to build marriages that will transform families and community. Singles can also grow to be a godly potential good spouse.

Ps Ben mentioned that <u>Ephesians 5:21-33</u> is the longest and most detailed Bible passage on the roles and responsibilities of men and women in a marriage. The context of this key scripture on marriage is in <u>Ephesians 5:18-20</u>. We need to continually be filled with the Spirit and power of God in order to live out an effective Christian life.

How does a Spirit-filled marriage look like? Ps Ben offered the following points:

## **1.** Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ (v.21)

- Submitting to one another is the standard for all Christians, including those who are married and those who are singles.
- This is the primary command for everyone before Paul talks about marriage in the passage.
- <u>Colossians 3:23-24</u> calls for everyone to submit to one another as we are submitted to Christ by placing each other ahead of ourselves.
- Honouring each other is a statement about our reverence and love for Jesus because we are all made in the image of God.
- If we live to please Jesus and live by the principle of mutual submission to one another, we will have the grace, power and anointing to build strong marriages.

## 2. Radical love and respect for a godly marriage (v.33)

- Wives, respect your husbands (v.22-24)
  - A wife's submission to her husband is expressed as respect and honour to him.
  - <u>Colossians 3:18</u> calls for wives to submit to their husbands.
  - Husbands feel loved when they are respected.
  - Wives are to meet the unique emotional need of their husbands to be respected.
  - Wives are to help their husbands to conform to the image of Jesus.
  - Encourage your husbands so that they can find strength to lead the family.
- Husbands, love your wives (v.24-30)
  - A husband's submission to his wife is expressed through loving (agape) her.
  - <u>Colossians 3:19</u> calls for husbands to love their wives.
  - Husbands are to meet the unique emotional need of their wives by loving them, to model the unconditional love between Christ and the Church.
  - God intends for husbands to nourish, cherish and give themselves up sacrificially for their wives.
  - Husbands are to help their wives to become all that God has destined her to be.
- Marriage is about holiness. When both husband and wife are Spirit-filled, godly and holy, we will have a happy, healthy and secured marriage.
- Marriage is a private discipleship arrangement, applying God's Word to sanctify one another.

## 3. Marriage is God's design

- Earthly Marriage: Oneness of husband and wife (v.31)
  - <u>Genesis 2:24</u> elements:
    - Prioritising your spouse and children (leave);
      - Total commitment to one another (cleave);
      - Physical intimacy (become one flesh)



- The earthly marriage is a picture of an eternal reality.
- The ultimate marriage is that Jesus loves the Church and the Church is His bride.
- God created marriage to be a living display of the loving relationship between Christ and His bride.
- <u>Acts 1:8</u> says that we need to be baptized by the Holy Spirit in order to transform our families.
- Singles: Marry, but do not marry with fulfilment as your goal.
- All: We do not deserve each other's agape but we are members of one body – members of one another.

## **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

1. Ps Ben mentioned that as disciples of Christ, we are all called to unconditional love and mutual submission to one another. How are our lives characterised by unconditional love and unconditional respect for each other?

#### Leader's Notes

This is a recap and reflect question for members to ponder on how we live out our lives to love and respect each other unconditionally. Members can share examples of how they have allowed the Holy Spirit to work in them to display unconditional love and respect when relating to their family and friends. Members can also share their struggles on how sometimes they love and respect each other with conditions instead. Leaders can encourage members to continue to reflect on how the Holy Spirit influences their lives to please God in the way they love others.

#### **Transition**

As we allow the Holy Spirit to work in us, let us consider what we can do to please God in our relationships with the people in our lives.

2. Ps Ben highlighted that husbands are to put aside their own interest to love and cherish their wives while wives are to respect their husbands. For those who are married, how can we do our part to obey our Heavenly Father with a joyful heart? For those who are single, how can we grow to be good potential spouses and how can you spur those who are married to be spouses that actively honour the marriage covenant?

#### Leader's Notes

This is a reflect and response question for members to share about what they have learnt from the sermon. For those who are married, they can share practical ways in which they can obey God by loving and respecting their spouses. Leaders can encourage members who are single to prepare themselves to love and respect their future spouses unconditionally and to seek out practical ways by which they can spur on married couples to actively honour their marriage covenant. This can include praying for them, encouraging them and to offer a listening ear to them when they encounter obstacles along their marriage journey. Leaders can remind members that the purpose of marriage is to put the covenantal relationship with God on display and that it is not a means to find fulfilment in life.

#### **Transition**

As we seek to fulfil God's assignments for us, let us ponder on how we can show God's love to the world through our marriages.

3. For those who are married, how do we want our marriages to be examples to the lost world of Christ's unconditional love for His Church? For everyone, how can we submit our relationships to God with an attitude of surrender?

#### Leader's Notes

This is a reflect and response question for members to ponder about what our spouses need from us so that we can show God's love to the people around us. Leaders can also encourage members to share about practical examples on how we can partner the Holy Spirit in order to transform our families and households. The cell can break into groups for further sharing and prayer.

#### Closing

As we submit to one another out of reverence for God, let us continue to seek the Lord and the continual filling of the Holy Spirit to enable us to love and respect each other unconditionally, especially in a covenantal marriage relationship.

## WORKS

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

#### 1. Sermon Application

- For God to grant us a deeper desire for Him and wisdom to live for Him in our families and in our circles of influence.
- For us to learn from our past regrets and to press on to what is ahead, keeping our eyes on Christ as our goal and prize

#### 2. COVID-19 in Singapore

- Praise God for the decrease in community cases in light of the recent surge.
- Pray for God's protection especially from the Omicron variant.

#### 3. In the World

- A swift end to the COVID-19 crisis globally, if not a reduction in cases in third world nations, and a stable environment where humans and virus coexist.
- A swift end to the Ukraine-Russian war

#### 4. Opportunities for Outreach

• Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.
