



21 AUG 2022 | LAM ZHENGXIN PRESENCE CENTRED WORSHIP | 2 CHRONICLES 29:20-36

SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- Be reminded that we can enter into God's presence because of Jesus' sacrifice.
- Recognise the importance of both personal and communal worship.
- Commit to rebuilding our corporate altar.

SERMON SUMMARY

King Hezekiah re-established the temple when he became King. In the same way, the re-building of the corporate altar begins with consecration.

- 1) We can enter into God's presence because Jesus died for us Because Christ died for us, we are cleansed of our sins and are able to come before God with purity and cleanliness. We must be careful not to treat the Cross with casualness.
- 2) We enter into God's presence as a community, not just as individuals Biblical worship is both personal and corporate.
- 3) Worship is presence-centred the focus is not meant to be human-centric on the worship team. The entire congregation is the worship team and the focus is on God's presence and giving Him the praise due.

Rebuilding our corporate altar is a Biblical mandate and no less important than rebuilding our personal altars.

SERMON RECAP

Zheng Xin preached from 2 Chronicles 29-31 regarding the life of Hezekiah.

Our identity as Christians is intimately connected to our rootedness in a local Christian community. Rebuilding our corporate altar is a biblical mandate and no less important than rebuilding our personal altars.

The first thing Hezekiah did when he became King was to re-establish the temple. The rebuilding of the corporate altar begins with consecration.



1) We can enter into God's presence because Jesus died for us (2 Chronicles 29:20-24)

When we look at the Old Testament, we are reminded of our own sin and sinful nature and how the basis of worship is about purity and cleanliness. It shows us how Jesus' sacrifice has redeemed us and there is a danger when we treat the Cross with casualness. Zheng Xin led us in the Holy Communion to remember the sacredness of His death for us (1 Corinthians 11:23-26).

2) We enter into God's presence as a community, not just as individuals.

Worship to God has two dimensions – as individuals and together as the people of God. Biblical worship is both personal and communal. We cannot isolate worship to simply a personal act (2 Chronicles 29:28-29, Hebrews 10:24-25). Zheng Xin also shared about the horizontal component to corporate worship where we encourage one another through our songs and devotion. (Colossians 3:16, Ephesians 5:18-20)

3) Worship is presence centred

Hezekiah also took reference from David's tabernacle when he reformed the temple (1 Chronicles 16:4, 1 Chronicles 25:6-7, 1 Chronicles 23:5). Everyone came ready to bring a sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. The entire assembly orientated themselves around the presence of God. Worship is meant to be centred around God, not our needs or preferences. We need to change our perspective of worship from one that is human-centric to God-centric.

Christian growth and maturity are not measured by how much we receive, but by how much we give and offer to His kingdom.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Worship is Presence-Centred. We can enter into God's presence because Jesus died for us. Share your own experience of worship – were there times when you were focused on self or the worship team vs focused on God? What were the differences?

Leader's Notes

Members can share a personal lesson from a moment where they focused on God. The question aims to let members identify times when we may be focused on ourselves or what is around us vs coming before God to worship Him and make Him our focus. Though we may be affected by many things, we find safety and peace that transcends all understanding as well as the fullness of joy in spite of our circumstances when we look to Him. We are reminded of His greatness and goodness, and are convicted to change to live for Him.

Transition

We are reminded that the focus of worship is God, why then do we need both personal and communal worship?



2. Imagine a pre-believing friend asking you about the reasons for the need for both personal and communal worship. What answer would you give?

Leader's Notes

This question aims for members to ponder on the importance of both personal and communal worship, and what better way than to reflect on our own experiences and to imagine sharing it with someone who has yet to know God! Leaders can also ask members to consider how they would describe worship — personal and communal — and to share how these two have contributed to their growth in God. Members can also share how they may be encouraged by communal worship.

Transition

We have recognised the importance of both personal and corporate worship. Let us consider how we can support one another as a community.

3. Biblical worship is both personal and corporate. How can we as a community encourage one another to worship God together as we rebuild our personal altars?

Leader's Notes

Leaders can invite members to share on reasons people may struggle with coming to worship God together and corporately. What are the hindrances? Is it due to distance or tiredness? Or is it due to a disconnect from community, past hurts, or grievances we have had in our interactions with one another? Or is it due to a disconnect from God? Is it a perspective of the church that we will need to review?

Closing

Worship is a great privilege. As we come before Him and rebuild our altars, may we be open to be living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to Him. May we see how we can pour out our love to Him and worship Him in how we live our lives and love one another.

PRAYER

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- For us to rebuild our personal and corporate altars before God to come before God for forgiveness for our sins, submit to Him our burdens and failings, and to enthrone Him as King
- Pray for RiverLife Church as we come together to build our corporate altar to God.

2. COVID-19 in Singapore

- Pray for God's protection especially from the Omicron variant.
- Pray that the community cases will be low.



3. World

- A swift end to the COVID-19 crisis globally, if not a reduction in cases in third world nations, and a stable environment where humans and virus coexist
- Pray for peace especially in areas of conflict (Ukraine) and potential conflict
 China & Taiwan.

4. Opportunities for Outreach

 Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness
