SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Reflect on God's goodness, love and mercy
- 2. Recognise that despite man's sinfulness, God is a merciful and a good Father, and no one is too far for Him to reach.

SUMMARY OF SPEAKER'S TESTIMONY

Pastor Don shared his own testimony of how Jesus transformed him from an ex-convict, to a become a respected pastor, mentor and the executive director of The New Charis Mission, a non-profit organisation which provides a rehabilitation programme for former convicts who hope to reintegrate back into society.

Pastor Don joined the gang when he was 13 years old and was already involved with drugs before he reached the age of 14. He dropped out of school and mixed with friends who went to parties where they would take marijuana and mixed pills. At 14, he had his first taste of heroin, a move he said "ruined the next 20 years of his life". From the age of 16, he became heavily involved in gang rioting which led to his first brush with the law - a two-year probation sentence with a 7pm curfew. Shortly after, he was imprisoned for 6 months after his urine tested positive for drugs.

He recalled that when his parents came to visit him in prison, he promised his parents not to take drugs again. He lifted his hand and swore to them that he was done with drugs. But after being released at 1pm, he was high on drugs again by 3pm. Within just three months, he was sentenced to 1½ years in prison.

Ps Don thought that his life would change after he came out from the army. However, mixing around with the same gang of friends and having nightlife – he soon went back to drugs again. This time, he not only consumed drugs, he was also involved in trafficking drugs and illegal activities like gambling dens and loan sharks.

He thus began a cycle which saw him going in and out of jail nine times over two decades. Ps Don shared that when he was caught by the police just 1½ months before his wedding, he came to a point where he contemplated taking his own life. He thought to himself: "If I can't change, why don't I end my life instead of hurting my loved ones?"

But one day, when he attended chapel service, he felt God speaking to him through the words of the Bible. He began to feel so ashamed of the life he took so much pride in.

His life only started to change in 1993 when he not only accepted the Lord as his Saviour, but as the Lord of his life. That's where he started to have victory in life – by surrendering himself to God and reading His Word. He began to understand the purpose of life, got out of the gang and out of drug addiction which he had been in bondage for 20 years. It was both the Christian faith and the support and guidance of mentors that gave him a change of heart and made him determined to kick his old habits. Pastor Wong shared that the first two years were tough and there were many times when he wanted to go back to his old life again. But with the help of his mentors, something in him changed.

He shared: "When you believe in somebody and that person feels it, a miracle has already started in his heart. That's what happened to me and that motivated and inspired me, as my mentors helped me built a new, solid foundation.

Leaving his past behind, Pastor Wong then dedicated himself to giving back to society and providing ex-inmates with the support they badly need. In 1995, he joined the Community of Praise Baptist Church as a pastoral intern and also cofounded The HighPoint Halfway House. In 2005, he was ordained as a pastor. The New Charis Mission was subsequently set up in 2006 and is made up of staff members and volunteers who are also ex-offenders like him.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Having heard Pastor Don's testimony of his radical transformation and how God turned his life around, can you recall your own journey of how God changed your life or a time where God turned a difficult situation in your life around? Share your own experience to encourage one another.

Note to leaders

This is a recap and reflect question for members to reflect on the goodness of God in their lives. While not all of us may have experienced such a radical transformation like Pastor Don, all of us have sinned, and have experienced God's transformation and goodness in certain aspects or areas of our lives. Members can share how they experienced God's goodness in their own lives/situations. Member can also share their reflections of Ps Don's life testimony.

Suggestion: If you have pre-believers visiting your cell, you may consider getting one of your cell members to share their testimony during this time as a witness to the pre-believing visitors.

Transition

God is a good and merciful Father. No one is too far for Him to reach.

2. Despite many attempts to change for the better, Ps Don failed each time. He shared that his life only started to turn around when he accepted Jesus not only as His Saviour, but <u>as the Lord of his life</u>, surrendering his life to God and reading God's word. Are there sins or addictions in your life that you find yourself going back to again and again? What can we learn from Ps Don's life testimony, on overcoming our own sins and addictions?

Note to leaders:

This question is a reflect and respond question. Leaders can refer to Ps Don's testimony of how he finally overcame his drug addiction. Like Ps Don, many of us may still struggle with certain sins or addictions despite being a Christian. Members can share if there are areas they are struggling to overcome, or where they need to fully surrender to the Lord, to experience His victory and transformation. Leaders can invite members to share their struggles and pray for one another.

Transition

We can experience victory over our sins and circumstances, when we surrender our lives to Jesus and allow God's word to renew and transform our minds.

3. Ps Don shared that it was partly his mentors' belief in him, that gave him a change of heart and made him determined to kick his old ways. Today, Ps Don is a mentor who dedicates his life to mentoring ex-offenders and providing them the support they need. There are also many in our midst (including Christian brothers /sisters) who need someone to believe in them and mentor them. As a cell, how can we journey with each other and also reach out to those around us who are struggling?

Note to leaders:

Mentors not only provide support, they also ensure accountability in our journey towards change and transformation. This is a response question for members to consider: (i) how they can better support and journey with each other in their struggles, and (ii) how the cell can reach out to those around them (including pre-believers) in their own community and in the marketplace.

WORKS

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- Pray that we will remember God's goodness and mercy, and how He has transformed our own lives
- Pray that we will surrender our lives fully to God, including areas of sin and addiction we may have
- Pray that God will give us a heart and burden for those who are struggling, including pre-believers in our community

2. COVID-19 in Singapore

- Praise the Lord for the removal of the vaccinated-differentiated measures.
- Pray for God's protection in the midst of a high number of community cases.
- Pray for protection against reinfection and the ill effects that it may bring.

3. World

- A swift end to the COVID-19 crisis globally, if not a reduction in cases in third world nations, and a stable environment where humans and virus coexist.
- Pray for peace especially in areas of conflict (Ukraine) and potential conflict China & Taiwan.

4. Opportunities for Outreach

- Ask the Lord to bless us as we step out to reach a pre-believer this Christmas.
- Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.
