SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Recognise that we are in persecution and separate ourselves from the world.
- 2. Remain faithful amid persecution even though it will cost us.

SERMON SUMMARY

There are two types of persecution that a true believer might go through – physical or cultural. The Singapore Church is going through a cultural persecution. The warning of Christ is to "remain faithful" amid persecution. Many Christians in the world today live in countries where they are persecuted. May their steadfastness in the midst of persecution cause us to examine our own lives, and inspire us to be faithful to the end.

SERMON RECAP

1) Persecution of the Early Church

• The early church was persecuted by 3 groups of people:

• The Jewish Community:

- A group of Jews who turned to Christianity went around proclaiming that Jesus is the Messiah and the resurrection of Christ, and included the Gentiles into their faith. This offended and angered the non-Christian Jews.
- The Jewish Christians were looked down upon, ostracised and treated badly by the Jews and their life was incredibly difficult.

• The Roman Empire:

- There have been many people who claimed to be the "Messiah" in the history of Rome's occupation of Israel. It always led to a revolt against the Roman Empire.
 Therefore, the Romans are very wary and did not like the Christians who proclaims that Jesus as their Messiah.
- The Romans also persecuted the Christians because of their refusal to participate in the worship of Caesar.

Society in General:

- Christianity is a threat to traditional values. Many in society were offended by Christian beliefs.
- Therefore, the Christians were ostracised as they abstained from common social practices such as idol worship (religion, family and work are intertwined and inseparable during those times).

- The early church was persecuted because of their beliefs, the way they lived, and the things/practices they chose to abstain from.
- The end goal of persecution is to force or pressure a believer to deny his/her faith or to conform to the world's values so that God's work in the world is disrupted.

2) Smyrna: Physical Persecution (Revelation 2:8-11)

Smyrna's Persecution

- "... Be faithful, even to the point of death, and I will give you life as your victor's crown." Revelation 2:10 (NIV)
- The persecution by the Jews (a significant presence in Smyrna) was intense:
 - o Thrown out of the synagogue
 - o Beatings, flogging, imprisonment
 - o Cast out by family, friends, and trade associates
 - Martyrdom of many disciples through stoning
- Smyrna comes from the Greek word myrrh: When myrrh is crushed, a beautiful fragrance is released. When the Christians in Smyrna in being persecuted (crushed) and they remained faithful even unto death, it was a sweet-smelling aroma and God was pleased with the Church.
- Story of Polycarp's Martyrdom
 - Polycarp is a bishop of the Church of Smyrna. During the time of persecution, 86-year-old
 Polycarp refused to escape. He was faithful all the way till his death.
 - After the death of Polycarp, another 2300 Christians were martyred for their refusal to denounce Christ. They were inspired by Polycarp.

Relevance to Today

- Singapore is very fortunate not to face open persecution, but in many other countries, Christians are persecuted.
- Remembering our brothers and sisters in persecution (statistics from Christianity Today)
 - o Every day, 13 Christians worldwide are killed because of their faith.
 - o Every day, 12 churches or Christian buildings are attacked.
 - And every day, 12 Christians are unjustly arrested or imprisoned, and another 5 are abducted.
 - o 360 million Christians in 76 countries suffer high levels of persecution (Open Doors, 2022)
 - Death, honour killing, rape, kidnapping, slavery, abduction, imprisonment, refusal of aid (Forbes, 2022).

Christians all over the world are simply being persecuted because of their chosen belief and their choice to live counterculturally. Yet they remain faithful and unafraid. When we see such strong faith on display, doesn't it prompt us to reflect on our own faith? What version of Christianity are we living today – one that is Biblical or one that is shaped by our fleshly desires?

3) Philadelphia: Cultural Persecution (Revelation 3:7-13)

Philadelphia's Persecution

- "I know your deeds. See, I have placed before you an open door that no one can shut. I know that you have little strength, yet you have kept My word and have not denied My name." – Revelation 3:8 (NIV)
- The suffering of the Church of Philadelphia is different from that of Smyrna. But the point is not on the types of suffering, but on how faithful the Christians are.

- There are false Christians (Revelation 2:9, 3:9) ones who compromise their faith and worship both Christ and other gods. They blended worldly practices with Christian beliefs. They influenced and pressured believers to conform.
- There was great pressure to compromise one's values, beliefs, lifestyle, and character.

Relevance to Today

- There is an intense cultural persecution to bring more of the world into the church to compromise the way and values of Christ.
- Satan's primary weapon against the Church is deception (2 Corinthians 11:14). Bondage is disguised as freedom freedom to do whatever you want.
- Spiritually, cultural persecution forces you to listen to the voice of your flesh. And some of these deceptions have entered into the church. Examples:
 - Sunday Worship is optional
 - Sex before marriage is acceptable
 - o Your faith and deeds need not match because God loves you
 - Churches become places of entertainment and not worship
 - Leaders have lost their spiritual authority to speak into their sheep's lives
- The world is pressurising us to conform. The truth is that many of us have.
- The churches that were rebuked in Revelation 2 and 3 their standard of Christianity might be
 higher than ours. Our standard has become so low that we do not recognise lukewarmness. That
 is why our witness is not effective it has become optional. We need to once again come out and
 be separate from the world, whatever the cost we may bear.
- Jesus is coming back. We do not know when. But we must constantly be found ready, to be able to stand before Him and not be ashamed/regret the life that we lived.

"You adulterers! Don't you realise that friendship with the world makes you an enemy of God? I say it again: If you want to be a friend of the world, you make yourself an enemy of God."

– James 4:4 (NLT)

"Therefore, 'Come out from them and be separate, says the Lord. Touch no unclean thing, and I will receive you.'" – 2 Corinthians 6:17 (NIV)

4) Closing

As RiverLife starts a new season, let us examine our lives. We have our individual races to run, let us run it well for the glory of God.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. In what ways do you think we are being culturally persecuted today?
- 2. Am I lowering my standards of what it means to follow Christ, and conforming to the world's standards, especially in the areas of family and sexuality?
- 3. How can our persecuted brothers and sisters encourage us amid our own persecutions and sufferings?

WORKS

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- Pray for us to separate ourselves from the world its values, lifestyles, and mission.
- Pray for the strength to remain faithful in persecution.

2. RiverLife

Pray for our church that as we have concluded the 21 days of prayer and fasting, we will
determine to live in a new normal – one that follows after the example of Christ.

3. World

- Pray for good weather in Singapore during this hot season. Pray also that there will not be any haze.
- Continue to pray for the Russia-Ukraine war and the avoidance of using nuclear weapons.
- Pray for Singapore as we approach the presidential election that a Godly president will be elected.
- Pray for the heatwave that is affecting many countries in Europe and Asia.
- Pray for Hawaii as catastrophic wild fires are sweeping through the various islands.
- Continue to pray for Thailand as they elect a new Prime Minister.

4. Opportunities for Outreach

- Ask the Lord to bless us as we step out to reach a pre-believer.
- Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.
