SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

1. To learn from Israel's example and desire to walk in God's victory
2. To desire to remain in covenantal faithfulness to God.

SERMON SUMMARY

Taking reference from how Israel entered the Promised Land, God is also bringing RiverLife into the Promised Land and into spiritual revival. We need to pay attention and to respond to God's call and return to covenantal faithfulness before the Lord.

1. The place of weeping: The people of Jabesh Gilead were taken captive ([v1-4](#))
They were stuck in 400 years of spiritual decline and oppression by their enemies and they cried out for help.
2. The place of deliverance: A reversal of the cycle of sin and oppression ([v5-11](#))
Saul heard the cry of the people and the Spirit of God rushed upon Saul to unite Israel to deliver Jabesh Gilead from oppression.
3. The place of revival: Gilgal, the launchpad of Israel's conquest ([v14-15](#))
Gilgal was where their identity as sons and daughters of the Most High was re-established

As we continue to seek after God, may we learn from the lessons Israel went through as important reminders to keep our zeal and to serve the Lord with all our hearts ([1 Samuel 12:20-25](#))

SERMON RECAP

Elder Ee Yang shared about how God has been doing an ongoing work in RiverLife and exhorted us to continue pursuing after God.

He preached from 1 Samuel 11 on how Israel moved from captivity to conquest, from defeat to victory.

1. The place of weeping: The people of Jabesh Gilead were taken captive ([v1-4](#))

In 1 Samuel 11:1-4, the Israelites wept for the predicament of the people of Jabesh Gilead as they were under sieged by Nahash the Ammonite. Prior to this, In Judges 2:1-5, The Israelites also wandered away from Gilgal to a place called Bochim where they were reminded of God's covenant and sacrificed to the Lord. The Israelites had been caught in a "downward spiral" of rebellion / disobedience, oppression, petition and deliverance. As there had also been no king during the day of Judges, anarchy and civil war had also broken out.

2. The place of deliverance: A reversal of the cycle of sin and oppression (v5-11)

Saul then heard the cry of the people and the plight of Jabesh Gilead. He was filled with the Spirit of God and rallied the 12 tribes of Israel to fight the Ammonites. Elder Ee Yang brought above the comparisons between Judges 19 – 21 and 1 Samuel 11. Israel’s deliverance came when they identified the real enemy.

Judges 19-21	1 Samuel 11
Benjamites raped and killed Levite’s concubine and Israel almost wiped out tribe of Benjamin	Saul, a Benjamite, united the whole of Israel to deliver a group of Israelites
Israel killed the men of Jabesh Gilead and stole 400 virgins to be wives of the Benjamites	The whole city of Jabesh Gilead was delivered by the Israelites from the real enemy, the Ammonites
There was no king and everyone did what was right in their own eyes	Saul, the appointed king, was filled by the Spirit to deliver his kindred
Civil war and internal strife	Unity and victory over the real enemies

3. The place of revival: Gilgal, the launchpad of Israel’s conquest (v14-15)

Gilgal has great significant to Israel. It was the first place in the Promised land the Israelites set foot on after wandering in the wilderness. It represented their identity as slaves being extinguished (“rolled away”) and their identity as sons and daughters of God being established.

It was at Gilgal that the sons of Israel first tasted of the goodness, promises and blessings of the Promised Land. It is the place where the sons of Israel circumcised and consecrated themselves to God and trusted God to heal them in enemy territory. It was also a military base for the Israelites’ past conquests ([Joshua 10:12 – 15, 40 – 43](#))

Elder Ee Yang also shared the shifts Israel experienced as she moved from captivity to conquest.

Lastly, Elder Ee Yang exhorted the Church to walk in covenantal faithfulness ([1 Samuel 12:20-24](#)).

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Elder Ee Yang shared about the places of weeping, of deliverance and of revival. Share with your cell about your experience about being in similar places, be it now or in the past. What was your experience and how did you turn to God for a breakthrough?
2. From Israel's example in Judges, we can see how they were stuck in a vicious cycle of rebellion / disobedience, oppression, petition and deliverance. As a cell, consider what Israel did well and what may have been some reasons they continued in this cycle. Is this example also mirrored in our lives? Share with the cell.
3. What is an area you are believing God for victory over?

PRAYER

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- Pray that we will continue to remain faithful in God even as we seek, obey and pursue Him
- For wisdom to walk away from compromising situations and distractions.
- For God to continually revive our hearts and lead our Church to where He wants us to be

2. RiverLife

- Pray for our church that as we have concluded the 21 days of prayer and fasting, we will determine to live in a new normal – one that follows after the example of Christ.

3. World

- Continue to pray for the Russia-Ukraine war and the avoidance of using nuclear weapons.
- Pray for Hawaii as catastrophic wild fires are sweeping through the various islands.

4. Opportunities for Outreach

- Ask the Lord to bless us as we step out to reach a pre-believer.
- Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.
