# **SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES**

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. To learn from Israel's example and desire to walk in God's victory
- 2. To desire to remain in covenantal faithfulness to God.

# **SERMON SUMMARY**

As we begin Part 2 of the series, we will be looking at Hannah. Hannah was a barren Jewish woman who was consistently oppressed in the family as well as in society. She did not have an understanding husband and God did not answer her prayer. At the lowest point in her life, Hannah came to the place of surrender - she acknowledged God as sovereign over all things and that everything belongs to Him. In that light, she surrendered and dedicated her child to the Lord. Her son, Samuel, would go on to anoint David as King over Israel. David would lead Israel through one of the greatest revivals in Israel. Hannah's actions impacted not just her but the whole nation of Israel. Like Hannah, we all have our paths assigned by God to walk – some barren and some not barren. Regardless, we are called by God to bring glory to Him through the path assigned to us. When we walk in a way that brings glory to God, we become signposts for others to follow, and our actions/decisions can have a great impact on the subsequent generations after us.

### **SERMON RECAP**

### **Introduction: Heart of the Series**

We are currently starting part 2 of the series "In the Wake of Awakening." The goal of this series is to look at examples from the Old Covenant on how to sustain a work of God in our lives – how do we live in a new normal after God has touched our lives, so that we can grow from strength to strength.

In this sermon, we looked at the story of Hannah and what are some of the lessons we can learn from her life on how to live in a new normal.

### #1 The Setting (v1a)

This was the 3<sup>rd</sup> generation from the Moses generation. This generation was already living in the inherited Promised Land. However, as the Israelites did not fully drive out all the inhabitants of the land, their culture, religious life and value system were greatly influenced by the nations they did not drive out.

"In those days there was no king in Israel. Everyone did what was right in his own eyes." – *Judges 17:6* (ESV)

It was in this spiritual climate that the story of Hannah begins. Hannah was the first wife of Elkanah. Elkanah's second wife was Peninnah.

## #2 The Situation (v1b - 8)

Hannah's main problem is that she was barren while Peninnah had sons and daughters (v 1b). Hannah's barrenness was a big problem for a women in Ancient Israel because women depended greatly on the men for provision and resources. On top of that, Hannah also had a few other challenges:

- a) She was greatly oppressed by Peninnah (v 6-7)
- b) Hannah had a faith crisis because God was the one who closed her womb and was not answering her prayer. (v 5)
- c) Her husband was insensitive towards her situation (v 8)

All of these challenges led Hannah to be in depression (v 7).

### #3 The Vow (v 9-18)

In the lowest point of her life, Hannah ran to where God was – the tabernacle (v 9). There, she poured out her heart to the Lord and made a vow to God.

Hannah's prayer has a few significant points:

- a) Hannah confessed the sovereignty of God the phrase, "Lord of Host", is used for the very first time in Scripture; and it is found in Hannah's prayer. By acknowledging Yahweh as "Lord of Host", Hannah was putting God in His rightful place as owner of everything. In doing so, she also recognise who she was in the sight of God.
- b) Hannah vowed to return the blessing of God fully back to Him if she is blessed by Him In essence, she is returning everything she wanted motherhood, to God. This is despite the fact that the corrupt Levitical priesthood in the tabernacle where Eli and his sons served.
- c) Hannah made things right for her family. When Hannah vowed to dedicate her son to the Lord, she was making things right between the family and the Lord. Elkanah was from the Levitical line and was required to be in service of the Lord. However, there is no evidence in Scripture that he was an active serving Levite. By dedicating her child, Hannah ensured that the Levites in her family continued to fully serve the Lord.

Because the posture of her heart changed (from one of desperation to one of surrender) while she was in God's presence, Hannah's countenance changed as well the moment she finished her conversation with Eli.

# #4 The Fulfilment (v19-28)

The Lord blessed Hannah with a son. She named him, Samuel which means "the Lord has heard". After Hannah fully dedicated Samuel to God's service, the Lord blessed her with 3 more sons and 2 more daughters.

#### **#5 The Impact**

Hannah's actions were significant not just for her and her family, but also the nation of Israel. Samuel would go on to be one of the greatest prophet and judge for Israel. And, it was he that anointed David to be the king of Israel. David led Israel towards a great revival – returning to the ways and worship of the Lord. Thus brought about the greatest period of peace and prosperity in the kingdom of Israel. Little did Hannah knew of the impact of her actions.

### **#6 The Conclusion**

We all have our paths that God has destined us to walk through – some barren and some not barren. The point is not in the level of difficulty of the path. We are place in these paths to bring God glory.

At times, after God has done a work of revival and awakening in our lives, we return to face the same "barren" situations in our lives. How do we walk then so that we can sustain God's work in our lives? We must learn not to walk in defeat but to walk victoriously, and with the purpose of bringing God glory even in the midst of the challenges we face so that all can see and glorify God. We must stop comparing and envying those who are not "barren". Rather, we should have faith within us that we are able to walk victoriously on this path for God's glory and to be a signpost for many others who are in similar situations.

# **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 1. Are there any parallels between your life currently and Hannah's life?
- 2. Share with the cell your "go to pattern" when you encounter challenges or trials in your life. Do you listen to your flesh and indulge (eg. Binge watching TV, food, computer games, drinking, etc.)?
- 3. How does a change of heart and attitude impact the way we walk our paths ordained by God especially if it is a barren one?
- 4. If you are struggling through a trial at this moment, share with the cell what that trial is (if you are comfortable) and process with the cell what it means for you to live victoriously through the trial or this path that God has chosen for you to walk through for His glory.

### **PRAYER**

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

#### 1. Sermon Application

- That there will be spiritual tenacity within us to walk the path of "barrenness" victoriously in order to glorify God.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to help you to be honest with the Lord on areas of unanswered prayers, and ask Him for a renewed strength to walk this path faithfully.

#### 2. RiverLife

- Pray for our church that as we have concluded the 21 days of prayer and fasting, we will
  determine to live in a new normal one that follows after the example of Christ.
- Pray for our upcoming mission trips, RiverLife Kindergarten Graduation Concert, as well as the Parents Gathering and Marriage Retreat that will be happening soon.

#### 3. World

- Pray for Singapore as we experience a new wave of COVID-19 and haze.
- Pray for the conflict in the Gaza Strip between Israel and Hamas, that a peaceful resolution can be reached soon. Pray also for the situation in various nations where the pro-Israeli and pro-Palestinian groups are protesting and using violence to vent their frustrations.
- Pray for the bed bug infestations that are sweeling through France, Algeria and Africa.
- Continue to pray for the Russia-Ukraine war and the avoidance of using nuclear weapons.

#### 4. Opportunities for Outreach

- Ask the Lord to bless us as we step out to reach a pre-believer.
- Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.
