SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

1. Understand what the orphan heart is and identify the spirit of the “Elder Brother” in them.
2. Learn what is brokenness and desire for God to bring them there.

SERMON SUMMARY

The response of the older brother towards the repentance and celebration of the younger brother revealed the true condition of his heart – he had an orphan spirit. The older brother represented the pharisees (Luke 15:1-2) – despite doing all the rituals and their righteous works, they were distant from the Father and did not embrace His heart for sinners. The older brother also had a transactional relationship with the father. He expected to be rewarded for his dedication and hard work. Thus, the elder brother lived as an orphan in the home. He too was lost.

The Father’s heart is not just for the prodigal, but also for the “Elder Brothers” – those who are self-righteous. The way to overcome a religious spirit is through brokenness (Psalm 51). There is no authentic relationship with the Father if there is no brokenness within us.

SERMON RECAP

The Reveal

- When the older brother found out that they were celebrating the younger son’s return and had killed the fattened calf, he became angry and refused to participate in the celebrations (v28).
- He was angry because part of his inheritance was used for the celebration (v27).
- But mainly he was angry with his father.
 - He didn’t enter the house because he disagreed with the father’s decision to welcome back his younger brother.
 - He felt that his father’s treatment towards both of them was unfair (v29).
 - He expressed his anger by using “Look” instead of addressing his father first. It was highly disrespectful (v29).
 - He also termed his younger brother, “this son of yours”, which in effect is disowning his younger brother (v30).
- The response of the elder brother revealed the true condition of his heart:
 - He had a Pharisaic attitude towards sinners – believing himself to be better and more deserving than his younger brother because he remained and worked hard for his father.
 - His relationship with his father was transactional (v29). He expected to be rewarded based on what he has done for his father, his family.
 - We too can have a transactional approach towards God when we expect Him to bless us if we pray enough, do enough good works, take on a lot of activities in church, etc.
 - He was more interested in the father’s things than the father. He had a religious spirit (like a Pharisee).

The Orphan Heart

“Being saved does not automatically mean feeling secure, loved and accepted as a son or daughter of God. The new birth in Christ makes you a son or daughter of God, but that does not mean you will enter automatically into the full personal experience of that love relationship with Him as Father. When you close your hearts to receive love, you close your hearts to intimacy. We take on an independent, self-reliant attitude. A closed and isolated heart manifests itself with an attitude that says, “If anything is going to get done around here, I’ll have to do it myself.” This results in superficial relationships, and you will begin chasing after counterfeit affections.” – Jack Frost, *Spiritual Slavery to Sonship*

- As a result of having a transactional approach towards the father, the elder brother lived as an orphan in the home. He too was lost and needed to be found.
 - He never mentions “celebrate with the family” but with his friends (v29).
 - We need to be wary of isolation in the family of God. It may actually reveal ourselves to be the older brother – one that approaches relationships transactionally.
- Four signs of an orphan heart:
 - Unforgiveness/Easily Offended
 - High Expectations
 - Rejects Correction/Authority
 - No Deep Relationships

The Father’s Heart

God’s love is not just for the sinners, but also for the self-righteous.

The Father’s Response

1. The father tried to bring both brothers home.
 - In Middle Eastern culture, this would have been shameful for the Patriarch. For the older brother, it shows that the Patriarch had an un-submissive son.
2. The father broke all societal norms in order to bring both sons home.

Our Context

1. Many of us have a bit of the elder brother within us. There is a religious spirit / transactional approach towards God. We feel that God owes us.
2. Also like the Elder Brother, our pride dictates that God should needs to serve us – what we think, how we feel, what we want.
 - We have elevated ourselves to the place of God.
 - That is why, most “Elder brothers” find it very difficult to receive discipleship from leaders, or there is a critical spirit (anger) within us when things don’t go according to how we want it to be.

The Appropriate Response (Psalm 51)

To overcome the spirit of the “Elder Brother” within us, brokenness is necessary.

Brokenness causes us to:

1. Remember that we are wretched sinners saved by grace (Psalm 51:3)
2. Live in humility – having a posture of openness towards God’s work (Psalm 51:4)
3. Realise that our only hope is in God (Psalm 51:8-12)

There is no authentic relationship with the Father if there is no brokenness within us. Apart from brokenness, we will not be capable of authentic worship.
