SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Reflect about spiritual authority in the context of church and the responsibility of leadership
- 2. Reflect about the importance of our response to leadership

SERMON SUMMARY

Pastor Zheng Xin preaches from Hebrews 13:17, and speaks regarding the spiritual authority of Church leadership and how leaders and members should relate to each other as they live in obedience of God's call and kingdom.

The responsibility of leadership:

- 1. Church leaders are to keep watch over your souls.
- 2. Church leaders are ultimately accountable to God, not to man.
- 3. Church leaders are not to lord over those entrusted to them.

Two challenges

- 1. We live in a culture that prioritises self-determination and we need humility to submit to leadership.
- 2. We live with the possibility of leadership abuse however there are also good leaders that have led us well.

Our response to leadership

Let us learn how to "have confidence in your leaders and submit to their authority." - Hebrews 13:17 (NIV).

As a church:

- 1. Submit yourself to be led by your leaders
- 2. Seek to understand the heart of your leader

SERMON RECAP

Ps. Zheng Xin spoke about spiritual authority in the church. For the church to move in step with God, leaders must be willing to lead and members must be willing to be led. He shared two points of leadership.

#1 The Responsibility of Leadership

In the book of Matthew, it says that we are to make disciples of all nations, and all of us are called to disciple, even if it's just one disciple

- 1a. Church leaders are to keep watch over your souls
 - Keeping watch means being sleepless, being constantly awake so that no harm will come over the person.
 - Leaders are to keep watch about our spiritual health
 - How we view our spiritual condition can be diff from the way our leaders see it. Those are spiritual blind spots and it justifies its own blindness because it cannot see what it is unaware of
 - Pastor Zheng Xin shared about his own experience and how spiritual knowledge is not spiritual maturity (1 Cor 13:2)

1b. Church leaders are accountable to God, not to man

- Church leaders are ultimately accountable to God. They seek to please God, not man
- Church leaders must be God-pleasers, and not man-pleasers



- 1c. Church leaders are not to lord over those entrusted to them (1 Peter 5:2-3)
 - We are not to impose authority, nor to serve our own agenda (Mark 10:45)
 - Our leadership becomes safe when our posture is to serve

Ps. Zheng Xin also highlighted 2 challenges we face in this day and age:

- 1. We live in a culture that prioritises self-determination
 - Such a culture is in direct conflict with the spirit of submission
 - We have also slowly seen how the church is becoming a service provider instead of Church being the body of Christ
- 2. We live with the possibility of leadership abuse
 - While we recognize that a church leader's authority is not absolute, for one leader that falls, there are still many faithful leaders (1 Tim 5:19-20)

#2: The Response to leadership

1. Ps. Zheng Xin encouraged us to learn how to submit and be led by our leaders

It is important for us to learn how to obey and submit. Both speak about dealing with the heart:

- Obey: Peitho (Which means to be persuaded, to have faith in, to trust, to have confidence, and in that context, to listen, to obey, to yield to, to comply with.)
- Submit: Hypeiko (Which means to yield to authority and resist no longer).

Submission is not a passive word but is an active word. Submission is a choice and we must be willing to submit to our leaders.

Scripture also exhorts us to make leadership joyful for our leaders and we need to reflect if our leaders find it a joy to lead us. We can do so by celebrate our leaders' strength, give grace to their weaknesses. In doing so, we become versatile followers. We learn more when we are hungry to learn

2. Ps Zheng Xin encouraged us to seek to understand the heart of our leaders.

He shared that there must be alignment and resonance across the chain of leadership in God's design. Following the form is not true submission as it is lukewarm and self-centred. He shared his own experience in his wrestle with God in trying to understand the heart of revival and shared his breakthrough through the wrestle. He encouraged RiverLifers to see how a desire to see healings and miracles take place stem from a heart for the lost to be saved.

Discussion Questions

1. What is your understanding of spiritual authority or spiritual leadership in the church, and how do you relate to it? Share your experiences – the joys and challenges in relating with leadership (if any).

 - c. South East Asia Heatwave across various countries
 - d. Canada (Wildfire)
 - e. Guangdong, China Flash floods
 - f. India Heatwave
- Pray for Singapore
 - a. Pray for PM Lawrence Wong and his cabinet as they begin a new chapter for Singapore
 - b. Pray for a stability in the cost of living in Singapore
 - c. Pray for those affected by the Singapore Airlines's SQ321 turbulence incident
- Other Global Issues
 - a. Pray for the United States of America as they gear up for this year end's election
 - b. Pray for the heatwave that is affecting many Muslim pilgrimages in Saudi Arabia
 - c. Pray for those affected by the shooting in an Arkansas supermarket in the US.

- Ask the Lord to bless us as we step out to reach a pre-believer.
- Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.
