SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

1. Be encouraged to pray for spiritual harvesters;
2. Identify our person or persons of peace; and
3. Learn to be courageous to share the Gospel relationally.

SERMON SUMMARY

In this third sermon of the series “A River Flowing Outwards”, Ps Ben shared that many of us have the heart to share the Gospel but do not know what to do; we desire to see people come to Christ but do not know what part we can play.

Ps Ben encouraged RiverLifers to have a sense of mission, like the early disciples when they were sent out to tell the story about Jesus. He reminded us that:

1. We are sent by Jesus to represent Him relationally to the least, the lonely and the lost.
2. Harvesting involves working with God and the people He has already prepared to hear from us about Jesus.

We are to apply Ps Ben’s sermon in the following ways:

1. Pray for spiritual harvesters
2. Identify our person or persons of peace
3. Share the Gospel relationally

SERMON RECAP

Ps Ben began his message by recapping the recent sermons in the series. He reminded RiverLifers to be anchored in God and in the community, being awakened in our commission and being audacious to step out of our comfort zone. God’s presence will then flow in our lives and through us to solve the problems in our society. We are to be the salt to the society which is decaying and decomposing. As a church, we need to rise up in faith to be God’s change agent.

Ps Ben went on to describe having a mixed feelings of guilt and anxiety when we do not share the Gospel with whom we would want to. We all want to share the Gospel but we do not know how to. We want to see our family and friends come to know Jesus but we are not sure of our part in the process.

The sermon title, “A Sent People” is one of RiverLife’s core values. In Luke 9, Jesus sent out 12 disciples. In Luke 10, He sent out 72. In the Great Commission, He is sending out all of us. Our calling is to be a disciple, who makes disciples, who makes disciples. Jesus models for us in Luke 10 what we should do when we move into an environment where there are no or very few Christians.

Jesus is the One who sends us out (Luke 10:1). In John 20:21, God the Father sent His Son Jesus to deliver His message. Before He ascended to heaven, Jesus sent us to those who are not yet reconciled to the Father. But we are not going out on our own; we are representing the Son, with the Holy Spirit, to share the Gospel relationally to the least, the lonely and the lost. This is our Great Commission. Jesus sends us out two by two, through the buddy system.

The principles in Luke 10 that apply to us today are:

1. We need to intercede and pray for more disciples. (Luke 10:2)

- God has gone ahead of us to prepare the hearts of people to hear the story of His Son, hence the harvest is plentiful and ripe.
- In this First Step, we observe that:
 - the vision of the plentiful harvest. (v2a)
 - the need for harvesters. (v2b)
 - the command to pray for more harvesters (v2c)
- We are to pray for God:
 - To raise up and send people to join the harvest:
 - Our prayer is powerful and necessary.
 - We are gifted and equipped to respond to prayers for harvesters.
 - To lead us to go on missions (Acts 1:4-5):
 - God is refreshing our services, our times of worship, our response to God’s Word, and a hunger arising for God Himself.
 - As we encounter His nearness, we will feel His heartbeat.
 - God is calling us to go out and bring the other children home.
 - We are to go forth after we have been filled with power from On High. Any mission and evangelistic initiative that is saturated with prayer and led by the Holy Spirit will have impact.
 - Mission is about seeing the Cross, and in the process compelled by the love of God to share His goodness with others.
 - To work big things:
 - That God will do something special in our lives in 2023. To expect the unexpected.
 - That God will open more hearts to believe the Gospel (Acts 16:14).
 - That we reach people far away from God. Because evangelism is the only one thing we cannot do in heaven.
 - That as we pray, our burden for the lost will grow even deeper.

2. We are to go out to make disciples.

(a) *Go out* (Luke 10:3-4):

- We are to be like lambs among wolves.
- There is urgency.
- We are to go out depending on God’s provision.
- When we go out, we are to be saturated with prayer and led by the Holy Spirit.
- Someone has to be sent for another to hear and then believe (Romans 10:14-15).
- We who have experienced and tasted the goodness of Jesus must go out to people who need Him.

(b) *Find a person of peace* (Luke 10:5-8):

- We bring peace to every environment we go into so as to mend the broken Shalom in the world.
- Look for the person of peace as we go into new places (Luke 10:6).
- Once we find that person of peace, do not move until we have shared the Gospel.
- A person of peace is a seeker, someone whom God has already prepared in their hearts to hear the Gospel. He/she:
 - will welcomes us
 - is open to what you we have to say about Jesus
 - is open to the life that we live because of Jesus
 - serves or supports us in some way
- Question: Who is **your** person of peace? Are we praying and searching for this person?

(c) *Share the Gospel* (Luke 10:9):

- We proclaim the Gospel in what we do and what we say.
- Healing is an expression of the Kingdom and a proclamation of the Kingdom message.
- We meet felt needs (v9a) as well as real needs (v.9b).
- Share our story by starting with our own brokenness and failures, and then share how Jesus has helped us and how we have experienced the goodness of God.
- Offer to pray for them to show that we love them.
- As we do this, we are building relationships.
- Tell them that the Kingdom of God is near, through faith in Jesus.
- How do we prepare to share the Gospel:
 - Write a one-page testimony to share in one minute.
 - Share with our family, relatives, friends, colleagues, classmates, and neighbours.
- Our part is to share the story and God's part is to transform hearts.
- Our role is not to convert but to communicate. It is the Holy Spirit's role to convert.
- Evangelism is all about sharing the Gospel, empowered the Holy Spirit.
- Every conversation is an opportunity to remember how Jesus is the fulfilment of everything that we want from life.
- We are sent by Jesus to bring good news to the least, the lonely and the lost (Isaiah 52:7).

In conclusion, Ps Ben asked RiverLifers the following two questions:

1. Will we pray for harvesters (who may be ourselves) to rise up and to proclaim the Gospel to those who are waiting to hear the Gospel?
2. Are we willing to labour in the harvest field?

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. **Ps Ben preached that every Christian must have a sense of mission to go out and share the Gospel with people who have yet to receive Christ. How are you embracing this mission? How can you shake off apathy and develop a burden to pray for the harvest?**

Leader's Notes

This is a recap and reflect question for members to ponder on whether they are burdened by the call of mission in their lives. Leaders can encourage members to discuss honestly if they are enthusiastic to reach out to the lost or if they are lukewarm to this call. Members who are already witnessing actively in their daily lives can share their experiences when and how they have come to make the decision to embrace this mission. Leaders should be sensitive towards members who are less active in this mission and to nudge them gently and lovingly to embrace this call. Members should not feel less off or guilty for not embracing this call. Leaders can encourage these members to start by taking small steps, such as praying for their pre-believing family and friends.

Transition

As we develop a burden to pray for the lost, let us ask God to help us identify our friends, relatives, and even acquaintances whom God has already prepared to hear the Gospel.

2. **Ps Ben mentioned in his sermon that a person of peace is one whom God has prepared to hear about Jesus. Take a moment to pray and ask God individually who in your life are people of peace. Share with the cell group if there's any one God has placed on your mind, and pray for one another.**

Leader's Notes

This is a reflect and response question for members to pause, think and pray about who the people of peace are in our lives. They can be our family members, friends, neighbours, colleagues, and even acquaintances whom we meet in our daily lives. Leaders can break the cell up into smaller groups or pairs (if the cell is too big) for members to share with each other specific people whom God has brought to our minds and our burdens for them. Members can then pray for each other's people of peace and for members to have the opportunity, boldness and courage to share the Gospel with these people whom God has placed in our hearts.

Transition

As we ask God to help us develop a burden for our pre-believing family and friends, let us put into practice how we can share the Gospel effectively through our lifestyle.

3. **Ps Ben said that we proclaim the Gospel in what we do and what we say. How is the kingdom of God evident in your life? How will you prepare yourself to share the Gospel when God gives you an opportunity to do so?**

Leader's Notes

Leaders can encourage members to think and share about an area or areas in our lives that God has transformed in us since we have accepted Christ. This is to encourage one another of the power of God's hand in each of our lives as we follow Christ daily. Leaders can also group members into pairs to practice (role-play) with each other how we can share our testimonies in one-minute.

Closing

As representatives of Christ, we are called and sent by Jesus to go out to make disciples who will in turn make more disciples. We are to carry out this assignment together with fellow believers – to pray for the harvest, identify our people of peace, and go out to share the Gospel.

PRAYER

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- That God will help us in “forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, and pressing on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called us heavenward in Christ Jesus.” ([Philippians 3:13-14](#))
- That we will remember “we are God’s handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God had prepared in advance for us to do.” ([Ephesians 2:10](#))

2. World

- Pray for those affected by the aftermath of the Turkey-Syria earthquake.
- Pray for those affected by the aftermath of the Cyclone Gabrielle in New Zealand.
- A swift end to the COVID-19 crisis globally, if not a reduction in cases in third world nations, and a stable environment where humans and virus coexist.
- Pray for peace especially in areas of conflict (Ukraine) and potential conflict – China & Taiwan.

3. Opportunities for Outreach

- Ask the Lord to bless us as we step out to reach a pre-believer.
- Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.
