SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Acquaint ourselves with the characteristics of Jesus.
- 2. Experience the abundant life when we worship God daily.

SERMON SUMMARY

Through this sermon, RiverLifers will discover four aspects of who Jesus is – Saviour, Healer, Provider, and the Coming King – so that we may live life in its fullness, as promised in John 10:10.

"The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full." – John 10:10

SERMON RECAP

We worship Jesus Christ. Christ is not a name, but a description. It means Messiah and Deliverer. Jesus is the One who delivers the world from the curse of sin and all its consequences.

To experience the abundant life Jesus purchased for us, we need to look at four aspects of who He is.

1) Jesus is SAVIOUR

"As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins, in which you used to live when you followed the ways of this world and of the ruler of the kingdom of the air, the spirit who is now at work in those who are disobedient. All of us also lived among them at one time, gratifying the cravings of our flesh and following its desires and thoughts. Like the rest, we were by nature deserving of wrath. But because of his great love for us, <u>God, who is rich in mercy</u>, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved." — Ephesians 2:1-5

Jesus came to save us and wipe our sins away so that we can be reconciled to God and live an abundant life. Not a life without trials, but even with trials we are overcomers in Jesus' name. We are still sinful, but that is our condition (in this fallen world), not our position. It is our position, as children of God, that we achieve salvation.

2) Jesus is HEALER

Jesus spent 60% of His ministry healing the sick and setting demonised people free. It is God's nature to heal. Jesus still heals today.

3) Jesus is PROVIDER

"And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus." – Philippians 4:19

There are three keys to His provision: work diligently, give generously, and steward wisely.

Jesus is the Good Shepherd that looks after His sheep. The dire global economic outlook causes fear and anxiety. But let us remember that Jesus is the Provider. Declare over your household that recession is not a friend of mine.

4) Jesus is the COMING KING

"For we believe that Jesus died and rose again, and so we believe that God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in him... For the Lord himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will be with the Lord forever. Therefore encourage one another with these words." -1 Thessalonians 4:14, 16-18

Jesus will return. The resurrection of Jesus our Messiah is a guarantee that He will. When He returns, we are raised from the dead and given glorious new bodies. All evil is eradicated. God creates a new earth and a new heaven.

Things are tough now, and life on earth is difficult. But how we overcome the troubles of this life will determine our reward in the next.

"For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all." -2 Corinthians 4:17

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Jesus is Saviour, Healer, Provider and the Coming King. Reflect and share one of these aspects of Jesus that seems most distant/abstract to you and that you have difficulty relating to/understanding.

<u>Leader's Notes</u>

Sometimes we struggle to understand or relate to certain characteristics of Jesus. Share which of these aspects of Jesus that you cannot relate to. Then, try to help each other to understand each aspect better and how they appear in our lives – relating real-life experiences/examples is a good way to make it more concrete.

Transition

Getting to know Jesus and His characteristics is fundamental to living life in its fullness.

2. God rescued us sinners out of His deep love for us by sacrificing Jesus on the cross. How can we express our gratitude to Him daily?

Leader's Notes

God made us, loves us, and rescued us. He is worthy of all praise.

May the Holy Spirit stir us to give Him the honour He deserves through <u>daily worship</u>. Rejoice each day that God has made and gifted to us. Be careful not to complain, but to thank Him for everything. Even all creation praises Him.

Transition

God deserves all worship, praise, and gratitude. When we are thankful to Him, we are naturally contented with what we have.

3. How we overcome the troubles of this life will determine our reward in the next. How do we live this out? How does knowing the characteristics of Christ enable us to overcome our troubles in this life?

Leader's Notes

"Do not be afraid, little flock, for your Father has been pleased to give you the kingdom. Sell your possessions and give to the poor. Provide purses for yourselves that will not wear out, a treasure in heaven that will never fail, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." – Luke 12:32-34

It is often in difficult times that we put down deep roots. Despite what we are facing, we can trust in God. Put your hope in God, fix your eyes on Him and keep trusting and obeying Him. It is counterintuitive to our human nature but persist! Here's how knowing the characteristics of Christ can serve as an encouragement to us during difficult times:

- a) Saviour We have a God who cares for us. He reached out to us and saved us at His expense before we even knew Him and did anything for Him.
- b) Healer Christ's name is more powerful than any disease or circumstance. And because He cares for us, we can go to Him in prayer when we face sicknesses in our bodies and in our souls.
- c) *Provider* God has provided so much for us as we journeyed through this life, especially through the pandemic season. If He has seen us through in the past, He will see us through in the future because He cares for us.
- d) Coming King Although this life is filled with suffering, pain, and injustice, we can take heart as we go through this journey on earth because there will come a day when Christ returns and remove every consequence of sin and the presence of evil in creation!

Knowing that we have a good Father who cares for us gives us strength and hope as we go through the difficulties of today and tomorrow.

Closing

Remember that Jesus has resurrected and will return. This truth gives us so much hope. Our troubles are temporary and will pass! Look up and look ahead.

WORKS

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

• Pray for us to fix our eyes on Jesus, remembering His resurrection and victory over sin, the consequences of sin, and the kingdom of darkness.

2. World

- Pray for those affected by the aftermath of the Turkey-Syria earthquake.
- Pray for those affected by the school shootings in Nashville, Tennessee.
- Pray for a swift end to the COVID-19 crisis globally, if not a reduction in cases in third-world nations, and a stable environment where humans and virus coexist.
- Pray for peace especially in the Russia-Ukraine war and in the US-China conflict.

3. Opportunities for Outreach

- Ask the Lord to bless us as we step out to reach a pre-believer.
- Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.
