SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Understand that God still works miracles and signs and wonders today.
- 2. Commit to witness and minister to others in the power of the Holy Spirit.

SERMON SUMMARY

We are called to minister in the name and power of Jesus. We are not just called to morality; we are also called to move in the power of the Holy Spirit. The Gospel is not just proclaimed with words; it is also demonstrated through the supernatural as well. We come to know God not only through His Word but also through His works.

The purpose of healing is three-fold:

- 1. To restore our physical bodies
- 2. To demonstrate the Gospel
- 3. To reveal the glory and wonder of God

SERMON RECAP

We are called to minister in the name and power of Jesus.

There's a story about Thomas Aquinas when he met the Pope, he found him counting a pile of money. The Pope bragged, "Thomas, the church can no longer say, 'Silver and gold have I none.'" Aquinas replied, "True, but neither can the church now say, 'Arise and walk." Has the church today become wealthy but powerless?

There are **three ways** to approach Acts 3 - As a textbook, a museum, or a path to follow – to be studied but not applied, as history to admire but no longer relevant, or as a way of life for Christians today. How we treat this scripture determines how we view God and live as followers of Christ.

There are **two options** for us as we are confronted with this key passage: We can either bring our theology down to match our reality or to bring our reality up to match biblical theology. We are not just called to morality; we are also called to move in the power of the Holy Spirit. (See James 5:14-16 and 1 Corinthians 12:7-9)

The Purpose of Healing is three-fold

1. To restore our physical bodies (Acts 3:7-8). Healing is also part of the Gospel. Death and sickness have been defeated. But God does not owe us an explanation for why He heals some and not others today. Nevertheless, He will ultimately heal every child of God in the end. A Biblical approach to healing is *faith* and *hope* – faith that still believes that God still heals today, and hope that we will be healed in heaven.

- **2. To demonstrate the Gospel** (Acts 4:4, Mark 2:9-11). Healing attests to the reality of God. Healing should be accompanied by the sharing of the Gospel. Healing and preaching go hand in hand. The Good News of Jesus is not just proclaimed with words; it is also demonstrated in His power.
- **3. To reveal God's glory and wonder** (Acts 3:9-10, Psalm 66:5-7). We come to know God not only through His Word but also through His Works. When we encounter the miraculous and the supernatural workings of God, they point alone to His glory and power, and our knowledge of Him will change us forever.

When God heals us, it is always intended to glorify Jesus and point us to believe in His Gospel. We need to avail ourselves as vessels of God and as instruments of the Holy Spirit to minister to others in the power of Jesus and love them into His Kingdom.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Share a healing you've received supernaturally, or a miraculous healing you've witnessed. Did you ever doubt what you've experienced or what you've seen?

Leader's Notes

An open sharing of personal experiences with supernatural healing and how this impacts us in our relationship with Jesus and how we view the Bible. This is not a time to debate doctrine or theology, but an honest heart-to-heart on their shared experiences in the realm of the supernatural – both the good and the not-so-good encounters.

<u>Transition</u>

Laying aside our differences in opinions, we focus on the Bible and what Jesus has taught us and what the church in Acts has revealed to us about signs and wonders.

2. Should we all pray for the healing of others? Why or why not?

Leader's Notes

When asked to pray for the sick, people are often heard to respond: "I can't. I don't have the gift of healing." Some individuals may be more effective (gifted) in praying for the healing of others. However, the effectiveness is not 100% for everyone they pray for. The healing of an individual is still subject to the will of God, not the will of the one praying for healing. Our prayers for healing should never stem from the place of "giftedness". Rather, it should come from the place of Christ's compassion and love for His hurting children.

Every Christian – whether you feel "gifted" or not – must be encouraged to pray for those who are sick because God cares for them. However, we leave the "healing" to God. Only God is able to supernaturally manifest Himself through healing as a sign of His goodness and faithfulness.

Transition

We should continue to pray for the sick in our midst as well as those who are yet to come to Christ. This is in accordance with the examples of Christ and the early church. Jesus laid his hands on the sick (Luke 4:40), as did the early church (Acts 9:17; 28:7-8).

3. How are you currently seeking the Holy Spirit's power as you witness (whether in word or in the supernatural) in your spheres of life?

Leader's Notes

Allow everyone to share how they can put into action their God-given authority (Luke 9:1) to pray for others in the power of Jesus. After discussion, take a moment to pray that God would speak to individuals in the spheres of life God has put them in and the people He has placed around them who don't yet know Jesus. Have them share who God has laid upon their hearts to pray for or to share the Gospel with.

Closing

We must avail ourselves to be instruments of the Holy Spirit wherever He calls us to. The Holy Spirit still moves in power because that is who He is. Therefore, we must be open for Him to use us to move in power as a sign of the reality of our God to non-believers.

WORKS

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- Pray that we will be open to the Holy Spirit when He moves in power
- Pray that we will be open for the Holy Spirit to use us to move in power.

2. World

- Pray for good weather in Singapore during this hot season.
- Pray for the families of the two individuals who died while canoeing in South Africa.
- Pray for peace in the Russia-Ukraine war and the avoidance of using nuclear weapons.
- Pray for those in India and Pakistan that are affected by the Biparjoy Cyclone.
- Pray for peace in the Gaza strip (Israel) as violence erupts between Israel and Islamic Jihad.

3. Opportunities for Outreach

- Ask the Lord to bless us as we step out to reach a pre-believer.
- Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.
