SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Understand why boldness is needed today
- 2. Commit to being bold in today's day and age

SERMON SUMMARY

As the church, we need to be end-time ready. Part of being end-time ready is to be bold for God's kingdom.

- The Context of Boldness is Persecution and Suffering The early church, as prophesied by Christ (Matthew 10:22), underwent persecution and suffering.
- 2. The Characteristics of Boldness are the Filling of the Holy Spirit, and Obedience The early church was baptized in the Holy Spirit. This gave them boldness (as seen in the life of Peter). Boldness also comes through obedience.
- 3. The Call to Boldness is Demonstrated by the Early Church as a Pattern for the End Time Church to Follow

There will be difficult times to come for the disciples of Christ. There is a strong cultural persecution on the church. Scripture shows us that before the return of Christ, the church will undergo great persecution. Therefore, there is a call for the church not to shrink back in fear of the difficult times, but to pray what the Early Church prayed: that we would be given boldness to continue to speak His Word.

SERMON RECAP

Introduction

Prior to Acts 4, the early church encountered the resurrected Christ and received the Baptism of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost which saw 3000 men added to the church. This was followed by the growth of the thriving church in Acts 2 - they met in small groups, devoted themselves to the apostle's teachings, and met the needs of those around them. As a result, God added to their numbers daily. This "awakening" is followed by persecution in Acts 4.

Sometimes, God teaches and shapes the church not by teaching, but by experience. This was the case in Acts 4.

1. The Context of Boldness is Persecution and Suffering in the Early Church

- The church grew as a result of Peter's 2nd sermon and the miracles that the Apostles performed.
- This led to intense persecution by the religious leaders.
- The word witness in Greek is "mártyras" which has parallels to the word "martyr". Being a witness involves being bold to stand up for what one believes, till the point of persecution and death.
- Matthew 24:9 Jesus warned the early church to expect persecution as they step out to become witnesses.
- 2 Timothy 3:12 Paul warns Timothy that those who desire to live godly lives will face persecution.
- Why is it important for the church to be in tune with the issue of persecution?
 - So that we will have a right and robust theology and suffering in the face of persecution
 - $\circ~$ So that we will not be disconnected from the parts of the body of Christ that is suffering persecution.
- The posture of the early church towards persecution sets forth an example for us to follow especially in the seasons to come prior to the return of Christ.

2. The Characteristics of Boldness in the Early Church

- The word *boldness* in the Greek is *parrhēsía*, and carries the meaning of "to tell it all". Not holding anything back.
- Peter and John had great boldness as a result of the Baptism of the Holy Spirit, as they addressed the Sanhedrin (4:13). This caused the religious leaders to recognise that they had been with Jesus.
- This resulted in the religious leaders forbidding the sharing of Christ.
- However, the early church:
 - Asked for boldness from the Holy Spirit to continue proclaiming Christ (4:29)
 - Continued to proclaim Christ as a result of obedience to Jesus's instructions in Acts 1:8.

3. The Call to Boldness

- In the midst of persecution, the early church continued to proclaim the Good News, trusting in God's sovereignty over their lives.
- God desires to do a new thing in RiverLife, especially in the area of reaching out to the community. What if this "new thing" requires boldness from the church?
- We need to renew our relationship with the Holy Spirit and to pray like the early church "And now, Lord, look upon their threats and grant to your servants to continue to speak your word with all boldness, while you stretch out your hand to heal, and signs and wonders are performed through the name of your holy servant Jesus."

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What does it mean for the church (you and me) to be bold in today's day and age in Singapore? Describe some situations in which boldness is needed.

Leader's Notes

One of the most dangerous strategies of the enemy is the "slow fade" – tempting us bit by bit to compromise our faith. Before we know it, there is more of the world within us, than God. The biggest problem is this – we see nothing wrong with it when we've reached that state!

Compromise is a big issue especially in today's day an age. If this generation of the church continues to compromise, the next generation will see as acceptable what is detestable before the Lord. Therefore, there is an urgency for the church to rise up and be bold in the area of ethics, family, sex and faith.

Typical situations that require for us to be bold are – white collar lies, unethical business practices, "it doesn't matter which God you believe in", pre-marital sex, abortion, the definition of family, etc.

Resource

Transition

If we are honest with ourselves, we will find that we are leading very compromising lifestyles. There is more of the world in us that God. Therefore, we need supernatural help so that we do not fall into the enemy's wishes for our lives.

2. We need to constantly ask the Holy Spirit to grant us boldness for the various situations that we face which requires us to stand up for what we believe in. How then can we become more aware of the Holy Spirit's activity in our lives?

Leader's Notes

The Holy Spirit is a person. When you journey through life with Him, you'll need to communicate with Him all the time. That's how we "pray without ceasing" (1 Thessalonians 5:17). When we have this "open channel" with Him all the time, we acknowledge His presence, and are more sensitive to what He may be whispering to our spirits.

Apart from that, extended time in God's Word and in prayer will help us to align our hearts to God's ways and character. When something comes at us that is contrary to His Word, the Holy Spirit can use what we have read to remind us of God's ways and character.

Transition

A cultural persecution is on the verge in Singapore. With the abolishment of article 377A, a door is open for the enemy to come in and corrupt our society and persecute the church. This shouldn't surprise us as Jesus warns us that we will be hated by all nations. Therefore, what is needed is for us to be bold for such a time as this, and to be an example for every subsequent generation of believers, so that God will be glorified and the church will be triumphant in these times.

3. God is doing a new thing in RiverLife – He is desiring His church to be a Light in the neighbourhood around us and to host His presence. How can you be bold and participate in what God wants to do through RiverLife?

Leader's Notes

This question is a response question. Encourage your members to see how they can participate in what God is doing in our church and in the world. Encourage your members to be bold to step out in faith, trusting in God's goodness and sovereignty. The areas in which your members can be bold to step out in are serving in the community through RL Cares and RCS, as well as participating in the churchwide 21 Days of Prayer and Fasting.

Closing

In this day and age, there is a call for the church to be bold – to step out and make a difference and proclaim the good news in our communities and to our loved ones that do not know Christ. Let us be that church – one that does not only hear the Word, but also to act on it!

WORKS

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- Share with the cell the various areas of your life that you will need to be bold in order to stand up for God's ways. Pray for each other, for God's boldness to come into your life.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to constantly prompt us to be bold as we do our lives each day.

2. World

- Pray for peace in the Russia-Ukraine war and the avoidance of using nuclear weapons.
- Pray for the grieving families that are affected by the implosion of the OceanGate submarine.
- Pray for India as the heatwaves are killing many of its people.
- Pray for the famine that North Korea is experiencing.

3. Opportunities for Outreach

- Ask the Lord to bless us as we step out to reach a pre-believer.
- Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.
