SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Examine areas in their lives that are out of alignment of God's will, design and purpose
- 2. Desire to cultivate the Fear of the Lord in their lives

SERMON SUMMARY

Although the early church was experiencing revival, Ananias and Sapphira's lives grew out of alignment from God's ways and direction for that season. They sought to maintain a public image that did not match the condition and desires of their hearts. As a result, they lost their focus, their integrity and the fear of the Lord in their lives.

Likewise, our lives must be in constant alignment with God's will and purposes. In order to do so, we must learn the cultivate the Fear of the Lord in our lives. It is a healthy type of fear where we do not approach God on our own terms, but in holy reverence. Then, we will be able to maintain our focus on God and His purposes, as well as maintain integrity in our lives.

SERMON RECAP

Acts 5:1-11 is an abrupt halt to the momentum of the early church. It is important to remember that God purifies His church in times of revival. Times of revival is when God exposes things in our hearts that are sinful. Here are 3 observations about Ananias and Sapphira:

a) They Lost Their Focus (Acts 4:32-35)

- Both of them started spiritually well and were in the think of the revival of the early church.
- However, Ananias and Sapphira's attention soon shifted from God to man. They withheld a
 portion of the proceeds that they pledged to give because they wanted to attract the praises
 and affirmation of people without them really doing so. They started to pursue their image in
 front of people.
- Our motivation matters who we are and what we want to be known as must be the same.

b) They Lost Their Integrity (Acts 5:3-4)

• Their unholy motivation to pursue and image in front of people opened a door for Satan to come in.

- Satan filled their hearts and this caused them to lie. They were deluded into thinking that it is ok to lie to the Holy Spirit.
- Are we putting God's stamp on the things that are not right in our lives? God desires honesty in our innermost parts.
- c) They Lost the Fear of the Lord (Acts 5:9-10)
 - Sapphira had the chance to confess, but she did not because she had lost the fear of the Lord.
 - The Fear of the Lord involves reverence a healthy type of fear. We must never approach God on our own terms.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. Share with the group your relationship with your parents when you were much younger. Then answer these questions:
 - a. Did you have a "fear" of your parents? What does that "fear" mean?
 - b. How does this "fear" of your parents differ from the "Fear of the Lord"?

Leader's Notes

This is an introduction / ice-breaker question. This question helps to examine what it means to have the Fear of the Lord. One of the best examples of how to understand the Fear of the Lord is see how we relate to our parents, especially when we were younger. By examining how we (should have) related with them, we can draw out some similarities with how we should relate with God.

Transition

For most of us, we do have fun with our parents – we laugh with them, play with them, joke around with them, and at times treat them like our buddies. But at the same time, all of us would have a certain "fear" of them – we would honour and pay attention to what they have to say, we do not want to offend them or go against their instructions, we try and walk in their ways and instructions, etc.

Our relationship with the Lord is very similar with how we (should) relate with our parents. Yes, He is good, He loves us and is our Friend. But at the same time, He is holy and righteous – He cannot tolerate sin, disobedience, injustice and self-centeredness.

So, having the fear of the Lord means that although we can come to God as we are, we cannot approach Him on our own terms. We cannot live the life He gave us according to what we desire. God is to be behold, revered and not offended. This in a sense is what the fear of the Lord is.

2. Bible teacher, Derek Prince, once commented, "True wisdom is inseparable from the fear of the Lord." Why do you think that is so?

Leader's Notes

One of the fundamental beliefs for Christians is this – God is good! Not only that, He is the source of all that is good. God is the definition of goodness. Nothing that is the opposite of good will come out from Him. Therefore, every instruction, command and discipline that He gives to mankind comes out of His goodness.

To fear the Lord means to have a reverence for Him by walking in His ways (His instructions). Therefore, when we choose to walk in God's ways, we are doing what is best for us and the people around us. When we do so, we are being wise.

So, wisdom and the Fear of the Lord cannot be separated.

Transition

Indeed, wisdom and the Fear of the Lord cannot be separated. So, let us examine how this can be applied in our lives so that we can live as the wise and not the unwise.

3. Read Proverbs 28:14. In Scripture, the Fear of the Lord often corresponds with humility and lowliness and sensitivity of heart. Reflect on these characteristics. Share with the group which areas of your life you think are missing these characteristics. Then, pray for one another so that the Fear of the Lord may return to these areas and you will then walk as the wise.

Leader's Notes

This is an application question. It is not enough to just know and understand what the Fear of the Lord is. It is so much more important for us to apply it in our lives. Encourage your members to examine honestly so that they can live as the wise. The areas that one can examine are:

- How we approach our relationship with God
- How we approach cells and services
- How we steward our work
- How we parent our children
- How we steward our marriages / singlehood
- How we steward our finances
- How approach questionable business practices

<u>Closing</u>

The Fear of the Lord is a critical element in our lives as disciples. When Christ return may we be found to have the Fear of the Lord in our lives such that God would exclaim to us – "Well done, good and faithful servant!". Let us posture to have the Fear of the Lord in our lives.

WORKS

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- Pray for each other that the Fear of the Lord will be present in every area of our lives.
- Pray that we will encourage each other to fear God and not men / the world.

2. RiverLife

• Pray for our church that God will revive us individually as we go through the 21-Days of Prayer and Fasting.

3. World

- Pray for good weather in Singapore during this hot season. Pray also that there will not be any haze.
- Continue to pray for the Russia-Ukraine war and the avoidance of using nuclear weapons.
- Continue to pray for the heatwave that is affecting India and Mexico
- Pray for South Korea as they face torrential rain that has caused flooding and the evacuation of hundreds of families.
- Pray for riots/protests that are affecting France at the moment

• Pray for Japan as they release the Fukushima radioactive water into the ocean

4. Opportunities for Outreach

- Ask the Lord to bless us as we step out to reach a pre-believer.
- Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.
