SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Recognise the importance of Oneness in God and with each other
- 2. Commit to building the unity of the Church by loving God and each other as Christ does

SERMON SUMMARY

Circumcision in the Old Covenant was practiced as a sign that an individual is in covenant with God. It symbolises the Jewish identity as well as a commitment to walk in the ways of Yahweh, and to cut off anything that is unclean/sinful to God all the days of their lives. In the New Covenant, we are taught to circumcise our hearts. While this is not physical in nature, God desires His church to cut off anything that is displeasing to Him. He desires a church whose heart is solely on Him, and a church that walks in His ways, unpolluted by the world and its culture. When we live a lifestyle of heart circumcision, we will begin to walk in God's destiny for our lives.

SERMON RECAP

Introduction

One of the most important questions that a believer needs to ask is — "who am I?". In order for this question to be answered, another bigger question needs to be asked — "who is God?". One we know who God is, we know who we are. When we know who we are, we then will know how to live.

For the Jewish people, since the time of Abraham, their key identity is found in circumcision. We will examine the very first circumcision recorded in the Bible, in the story of Abraham.

Circumcision in the Old Covenant

#1 Circumcision is the sign of the covenant (v 10)

- Circumcision indicates that one is in covenant with God.
- It indicates one's willingness to be "all in" in the covenant with God to not worship other gods, and to walk in the ways of God all the days of his life.

#2 Circumcision transforms one's identity (v 5)

- In ancient times, when a greater king makes a covenant with a lesser king, the lesser king will often times circumcise himself as a symbol of willingness to participate in the covenant.
- The moment the lesser king is circumcised, his status immediately gets elevated to an equal of the greater king's household. (Psalm 23:5)
- It symbolises that the lesser king has access to the greater king's power and protection.

• Often times, this is accompanied by the changing of the lesser king's name (Abram to Abraham)

#3 Circumcision serves as a covenantal reminder (v 15)

- While circumcision is a sign required by God, circumcision is a sign for man.
- It serves as a reminder for the individual to walk blamelessly before God all the days of his life.

Circumcision in the New Covenant

#1 Circumcision is no longer required for Gentile believers. (Acts 15, Romans 2:25-29, Galatians 3:28-29)

• This was the conclusion of the apostles in the early church.

#2 Our identity as believers is found in the circumcised heart (2 Corinthians 6:17-18)

- Since the circumcision of Abraham, God has always desired that His children are circumcised in their hearts. (Jeremiah 4:4)
- This means the "cutting off" of anything that displeases Him from our lives, and to embrace His ways of living.
- The Holy Spirit prompts and empowers believers to cut off those things that separate us from God (the ways of the world).
 - Sexual immorality
 - Constantly being in a position of temptation
 - Worldly work practices that are not God's ways
 - o Expectations of children

#3 When we choose to walk in the circumcision of our hearts, God's call for our lives will come to pass (Genesis 17:18-21, 21:1-4)

- Abraham's destiny came to pass at 100 years old when Isaac was born; this was 1 year after he was circumcised.
- When we are in the posture of a circumcised heart, God's destiny for our lives will come to pass.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Why do you think circumcision of the heart is such an important identity for a Christian?

Leader's Notes

This is a recap question. The circumcised heart symbolises that we are in covenant with the Lord. It also the posture by which we live — cutting away anything that is displeasing to the Lord in our lives. A heart that is not circumcised is equivalent to an unbeliever's heart. Therefore, we must constantly be in the posture of removing things within our lives that displeases the Lord — worldly practices and values, intentional sin, sin of omission, etc.

Transition

A circumcised heart sets a believer apart from the world. It is our spiritual identity as sons and daughters of God. We must therefore be intentional to live "set apart" lives on a daily basis.

2. What does a lifestyle of the circumcised heart look like for your life? What will you be doing more and what will you be doing less?

This is a practical question – translating the concept of a circumcised heart into practical living. Encourage your members to share with the rest of the cell what their life would look like if they walk in the circumcision of the heart.

Transition

This is the lifestyle that we should aspire towards. This is God's destiny for our lives – to live a life that is pleasing before Him.

3. Physical circumcision is painful. Likewise, spiritual circumcision is painful as well. It at times will cost us. What are some of the "worldly areas" in your life that you struggle to cut off?

Leader's Notes

This is a question that turns the concept of heart circumcision into practical steps we would like to take. Encourage your members to examine the various aspects of their lives: lifestyle, spending habits, parenting styles, relating with the opposite sex, the type of entertainment they choose to watch, business practices, etc. Which of these areas have more of the world in it than God? What is their struggle in cutting the worldly practices off from their lives and embrace God's ways? Facilitate for the cell to share deeply in this area and to support one another in prayer.

Closing

A heart that is circumcised is a heart that is set apart for the Lord. It is our identity as believers in Christ. Let us not grow weary of cutting off those areas of our lives that are worldly and not of the Lord so that we need not be ashamed when we stand before Him at His coming.

PRAYER

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- Ask the Lord for areas in your life that needs His circumcision
- Ask the Lord to grant you the strength to cooperate with His Spirit as He cuts those things in our lives that are displeasing before Him

2. RiverLife

Pray for our church that as we have concluded the 21 days of prayer and fasting, we will
determine to live in a new normal – one that follows after the example of Christ.

3. World

- Continue to pray for the Russia-Ukraine war and the avoidance of using nuclear weapons.
- Pray for Hawaii as catastrophic wild fires are sweeping through the various islands.
- Continue to pray for Thailand as they elect a new Prime Minister.

4. Opportunities for Outreach

- Ask the Lord to bless us as we step out to reach a pre-believer.
- Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.
