SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Understand the significance and symbolism of the spring feasts.
- Remember what God has done for us and what is to come.

SERMON SUMMARY

The first three feasts of the Jewish calendar pointed to the coming of Christ and the fulfilment of the feasts through His work on the cross. These spring feasts remind us that God is indeed "Emmanuel" – God with us.

SERMON RECAP

The Hebrew word for feast (*moed*) literally means "the appointed time". The annual feasts that are celebrated by the Jews are set times appointed by God. Through the lens of the New Testament, we believe that the first three feasts (which occurred during the springtime) have been fulfilled by Jesus's first coming. Let us behold Jesus through the Jewish Spring Feasts.

1. The Feast of Passover and Unleavened Bread (Exodus 12:1-3, 5-13, Leviticus 23:5-7)

- This first Passover and Unleavened Bread happened in Exodus to remember how God freed Israel from captivity in Egypt.
- It pointed to Jesus as our Passover Lamb whose blood has been shed for our sins (1 Corinthians 5:7). The same day the Jews slaughtered the lambs in preparation for the Passover was the same day Jesus was crucified.
- This feast pointed to Jesus' sinless life (yeast/leaven is the symbol of sin), making Him the only one who qualifies to pay the penalty for our sins.
- Today, the Passover signifies our deliverance from bondage to sin and death. The Passover and the Feast of the Unleavened Bread point to a life free from the effects of sin and compromise.

2. The Feast of First Fruits (Leviticus 23:9-14)

- This feast is celebrated the day after the 7th day of Passover. The first sheaf of the harvest is to be presented before the Lord. They would not be able to harvest or eat the rest before they presented the first sheaf.
- There is a significance to the first. God calls Israel His firstborn son (Exodus 4:22). The first fruit is the best, and it is a giving back of the best from what we have as a thanks offering to the Lord as a declaration of our faith in Him.
- Jesus was resurrected on the Feast of First Fruits. This points to Jesus' resurrection as the first fruit of the righteous (1 Corinthians 15:20). We live with the confidence that Jesus'

resurrection guarantees ours. Because He rose, we too will rise. Because He lives, we also will live.

3. The Feast of Weeks (Shavuot/Pentecost) (Leviticus 23:16)

- This feast occurs 50 days after the feast of First Fruits. It was the end of the grain harvest, and the Israelites would take two loaves of the finest wheat and offer it to God.
- Shavuot happened on Mount Sinai giving the law to the people of Israel. Pentecost happened on Mount Zion giving of the Holy Spirit to believers.
- This feast pointed to the gift of the Holy Spirit for both the Jew as well as the Gentile. It is also a prophetic promise of a great harvest that is coming.

All these feasts point us to the blood of the lamb. That without the blood of Jesus, there will be no salvation for us. It also points us to the second coming of Christ, when He returns to save us again and make permanent His victory and glory.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Why is it important for us, as believers, to know about the feasts that the Jews celebrate yearly?

Leader's Notes

These feasts are God-ordained for the Jews, to remember what God has done for His people, to celebrate His love and faithfulness to them, and to point to the future when we would be reunited with the Bridegroom and be part of His family for eternity.

Transition

As we are part of the family of God, what He has ordained we should know. We are concerned with the things He is concerned about.

2. Why are we tempted to rebel against God and seek help apart from Him?

Leader's Notes

This question calls us to reflect on why we repeatedly rebel against God.

Like the Israelites, we tend to forget about God and His goodness and faithfulness towards us. We rebel against Him and in times of trouble, we look elsewhere for help. When God allows us to face the consequences of our sinful actions, we repent and reunite with Him. Then, the whole cycle of rebellion begins again. The Israelites constantly ran from God because they chose to place their faith in other things such as idols.

Transition

Let us learn from the Israelites and not repeat their mistakes.

3. Since we do not celebrate/observe these Jewish feasts, how do we remind ourselves of what God has done for us and will do for us in future?

Leader's Notes

This is an application question. The Jews observe these feasts as an act of celebration of remembrance for what God has done for them and what is to come. So, what can we do practically to remember all that He has done for us? One practical application is to read through the relevant passages during these feasts/festivals and to reflect on how Christ is found in these festivals/feasts.

Closing

We can remember what God has done for us in our own ways and keep the hope of what is to come.

PRAYER

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- Take some time to thank God for sending Christ to be the sacrificial sinless lamb in our place.
- Ask the Lord to help you not to lose the wonder of this amazing love of God He is forever with us.

2. RiverLife

- Pray for our church that as we have concluded the 21 days of prayer and fasting, we will determine to live in a new normal one that follows after the example of Christ.
- Pray for our mission teams that are heading to the nations in this season.

3. World

- Pray for Morocco that just experienced a devastating earthquake with more than 2000+ fatalities and almost 2.8 million people affected.
- Pray for our new President that the Lord will bestow upon him wisdom to lead the country in alignment with the ways of God.
- Pray for Hong Kong and Southern China as they battle Super Typhoon Saola, Black Rain and flooding.
- Continue to pray for the Russia-Ukraine war and the avoidance of using nuclear weapons.

4. Opportunities for Outreach

- Ask the Lord to bless us as we step out to reach a pre-believer.
- Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.
