TOPIC: GOD WILL RETURN | SCRIPTURE: LEVITICUS 23:23-44

## **SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES**

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Understand the significance and symbolism of the autumn feasts.
- 2. See the importance of the Jewish festivals in God's divine calendar

### SERMON SUMMARY

The final 3 feasts are critical in order to understand God's divine calendar. All 3 of these feasts are yet to be fully fulfilled. The return of Christ will kick start the full fulfilment of these 3 feasts. The 3 feasts begin with the sounding of the trumpets – this brings Israel into a time of prayer and fasting, as they approach The Day of Atonement, 10 days later. The Day of Atonement symbolises what Christ has done at His first coming and what will fully do at His second coming. The feasts end with the Festival of Tabernacles, signifying the coming of God's presence in Christ on the earth.

### **SERMON RECAP**

Last week, we examined the 3 Jewish springtime feasts (Passover, Unleavened Bread, First Fruits) and Pentecost that were fulfilled at Jesus' first coming and the outpouring of the Spirit. The final 3 Jewish feasts occurred during the Autumn months and are collectively called Tabernacles (Leviticus 23:24, 27 & 34). The feasts of the Tabernacles involved great rejoicing in the ingathering of the fruit of the land. This is a prelude to the joyous last days where the nations will flow into Jerusalem to worship Christ in the Messianic age as prophesied in Zechariah 14:16.

- 1. **Trumpets** (Leviticus 23:24) This is the first of the autumn feasts. The only Scriptural command for the Jewish people is to blow the trumpets. The blowing of the trumpets was an alarm of sorts (Joel 2:1) and marked the beginning of 10 days of consecration and repentance before the Lord in preparation for The Day of Atonement which fell on the 10<sup>th</sup> day. This feast also marked the end of the agricultural and festival year. The Feast of the Trumpets foreshadows the 2<sup>nd</sup> coming of Christ what is accompanied by the sound of a trumpet, (1 Thessalonians 4:16-17) as well as the future Day of the Lord (Joel 2:1).
- 2. **Day of Atonement** (Leviticus 23:27) The Day of Atonement was the most solemn of all the Jewish festivals and feasts. Described in detail in Leviticus 16:1-34, the High Priest on this day will undergo an elaborate purification ritual as well as put on special garments as this is the only day in the whole year he is allowed to enter the Holy of Holies. The High Priest will then bring two goats. The 1<sup>st</sup> goat will be sacrificed as a sin offering and its blood sprinkled on the Ark of the Covenant. The High Priest will then place his hands on the head of the 2<sup>nd</sup> goat and confess the sins of the whole nation before the altar of the burnt offering. The 2<sup>nd</sup> goat will then be released outside of the camp into the wilderness. Symbolically, this "scapegoat" would carry away the sins of the people.

The 2 sacrifices brought reconciliation between Israel and God. The Day of Atonement is associated with the redemption of the entire nation of Israel (Revelation 1:7, Zechariah 12:10, Daniel 7:13-14). While Jesus fulfilled many elements of the Day of Atonement at His 1<sup>st</sup> coming, The Day of Atonement will be ultimately fulfilled when Christ returns to bring judgment on His enemies, forgive and save the nation of Israel, and completely pour out His wrath upon the wicked.

3. **Tabernacles / Booths** (Leviticus 23:34) – The Feast of Tabernacles or Booths or Sukkot, is the last feast that the Lord commanded Israel to observe. This feast takes place 15 days after the blowing of the trumpets. This feast was a time of joyous celebration as the Israelites celebrated God's continued provision for them in the current harvest and remembered His provision and protection during the 40 years in the wilderness. During this feast, Jewish families construct a hastily built hut/booth (Sukkah) in which meals are eaten in throughout the 8 days of the feast. The huts/booths were not to be nailed or built in any way that suggests permanence. The tabernacle of God symbolises God's very presence and the feasts of the Tabernacles symbolises the global restoration process which will start with the return of Christ. This feast will be fulfilled at the 2<sup>nd</sup> coming of Christ when there will be literal rest for the earth and all its inhabitants.

The final 3 feasts will only be fully fulfilled when Christ returns again. Our posture should be one of solemn examination of our lives, and anticipation of His glorious return. God will return!

# **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

1. The feasts and festivals marked a time of celebration and remembrance of God's provision for the Jewish people. Likewise, what have you harvested this year? What has the Father given you to be thankful for?

### Leader's Notes

This is a reflection question. In busy Singapore, we often times fail to stop and acknowledge God's hand in our lives. Encourage your members to reflect on God's fingerprints in their lives this year – how have they experienced God's goodness and hand on their lives? It may be something that we often take for granted. Or, it may be something that is very evident in our lives this year. Take the time to acknowledge God's hand in our lives and to once again depend on Him as our Source.

### **Transition**

The feasts and festivals we ordained by God for Israel so that they will always remember that God is their Source and that He is a good Father to them, in spite of them not fully understanding the magnitude of what God has done and was going to do in their lives.

2. After going through this and last week's sermons, why do you think the Jewish feasts and festivals are so critical for us Christians today?

### Leader's Notes

The festivals and feasts points to the 1<sup>st</sup> coming of Christ as well as to His future coming where He will make all things new. It also points to a coming time where judgment will come on the earth. As shared during the sermon, the final 3 feasts are yet to be fulfilled. Therefore, while grace has been lavished on us at Christ's first coming, we must never take that grace for granted. We must constantly examine ourselves and live lives that are worthy of His return. We must not hold on too tightly to our earthly homes and possessions (booths). There is a more glorious home and hope that is coming at His return. God will return! And we say, Maranatha!

### Transition

It is one thing to understand the significance of these feasts and festivals. The more important thing for us is to translate that knowledge into practical living – what does that mean for us today?

- 3. One big theme that arises out of the feasts and festivals we have studied so far is the return of Christ. Two questions arise as a result of this theme:
  - a) Are you ready to give an account for how you have stewarded your life and the resources God has given to you on judgment day?
  - b) Do you look forward in anticipation for the Lord's return? Or are you indifferent about it?

### Leader's Notes

This is a practical question for members to translate the knowledge into practical living. If you scroll through the news today you will discover a few things – the decay of morality, the abundance of lawlessness, the fragility of relationships between nations, extreme climate changes, radioactive pollution in the seas, extreme drought and famine, etc. All of these can be seen as indicators of Scriptural prophecy (trumpet call) pointing to one thing – the coming of Christ. What if we are the generation that experiences His return? Will we be ready to meet our Bridegroom and Judge? Guide your members to a time of reflection on the attitudes of their hearts as we approach the impending return of Christ.

#### Closing

Jesus is coming again. This is not a wish but a coming reality for everyone that declares Him as Saviour. May the posture of our hearts and lives not be one that makes this world our permanent dwelling place. Rather, let us constantly examine our ways and live in light of eternity. Jesus is our coming hope and salvation. He is also our coming Judge. Therefore, may we all learn to live in light of that!

### **PRAYER**

Consider dividing the group into sub-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

### 1. Sermon Application

- Ask the Lord if there are any areas of your life that seems to want to build a permanent home here on this earth. Surrender that area of your life to the Lord.
- Ask the Lord to fix your eyes on His return rather than what is fading away here on this earth.

### 2. RiverLife

- Pray for our church that as we have concluded the 21 days of prayer and fasting, we will
  determine to live in a new normal one that follows after the example of Christ.
- Pray for our mission teams that are heading to the nations in this season.

#### 3. World

- Pray for Koh Samui that is experiencing chronic water shortages.
- Pray for New York that is experiencing flash floods.
- Pray for the situation in Japan as more radioactive water is being released into the oceans.
- Pray for God's protection on Singapore as there is a recent increase in hotspots all over Sumatra.
- Pray for Canada's rocky relationship with India in light of the murder of a high-profile Sikh figure.
- Pray for the situation in Pakistan where a suicide bomber killed 50 people and wounded many others.
- Continue to pray for the Russia-Ukraine war and the avoidance of using nuclear weapons.

## 4. Opportunities for Outreach

- Ask the Lord to bless us as we step out to reach a pre-believer.
- Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.
