SCRIPTURE: 2 CHRONICLES 20

SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Remember that they are constantly in an ongoing spiritual battle between the kingdom of darkness and the kingdom of light.
- 2. Be determined not to defile themselves but to constantly fix their eyes on the Lord through worship and praise during a spiritual battle.

SERMON SUMMARY

The question is not whether are you in a spiritual battle; but are you winning the battle? As children of God, we have an unseen but real enemy (the devil and his evil forces) waging war against us; and it is up to us to stand our ground in this spiritual battle. Through the story of Jehoshaphat, four principles of spiritual warfare can be learnt:

- 1. The call to pray from the position of His presence and promise. (v 2-3)
- 2. The call to stand firm in the spiritual battle (v 17)
- 3. The call to worship and praise through the spiritual battle
- 4. The call to trust in God's deliverance and timing the battle belongs to the LORD (v 15)

SERMON RECAP

Introduction

Christians often forget that we are in the midst of a raging spiritual battle. We have an unseen but real enemy waging against us; thus, we are not to be unaware of this reality that is happening constantly in our lives.

"...for we are not ignorant of his schemes." - 2 Corinthians 2:11 (NASB)

The question then is not about if we are in a spiritual battle, but rather, are we winning the battle. Drawing from the example of King Jehoshaphat in 2 Chronicles 20, Ps. Joachim shared 4 principles concerning spiritual warfare that will help us as we approach the various spiritual battles in our lives.

#1 The Call to Pray from the Position of His Presence and Promise (v 2-3)

Even though Judah was facing a vast army that outnumbered them, King Jehoshaphat's first response was not to mobilise the troops for battle but to call for a fast throughout the whole nation (v 4-9). King Jehoshaphat's knew that God had made promises regarding the temple (2 Chronicles 5-6). Therefore, as Judah stood in the temple to pray sincerely to the Lord, God will deliver them.

#2 The Call to Stand Firm in the Spiritual Battle (v 17)

During an intense spiritual battle, it is easy for believers to lose hope, be discouraged and to give up. This can often lead to us relinquishing our authority to the leading of our flesh resulting in defilement or fear. When we allow ourselves to be defiled, or to bow down to fear during a spiritual battle, the enemy will have a stronghold within our lives rendering us powerless in a battle. 3 times in Ephesians, Paul encourages us to "stand firm" in the midst of the spiritual battles. Therefore, we must never allow the devil to have a foothold in our lives during the intense spiritual battle but rather, to stand firm!

"You will not need to fight in this battle. Stand firm, hold your position, and see the salvation of the Lord on your behalf, O Judah and Jerusalem. Do not be afraid and do not be dismayed. Tomorrow go out against them, and the Lord will be with you." – 2 Chronicles 20:17 (ESV)

"If you do not stand firm in your faith, you will not stand at all." - Isaiah 7:9b (NIV)

#3 The Call to Worship & Praise Through the Spiritual Battle (v 21-22)

King Jehoshaphat and Judah faced a real battle where people will die in battle. Instead of being in fear, King Jehoshaphat sent His "worship team" to the frontlines of the battle to proclaim the Lord's goodness and love to them. They allowed praise to be their battle cry and their spiritual weapon.

In challenging times, it can be difficult to look to God and to praise Him. But worship is the only thing we can offer unto the Lord that He has not first given to us. When we start to praise in the midst of our spiritual battles, God will work on our behalf. Praise fixes our eyes on God and not on the situation. Praise also declares to the heavenlies and to the situation who God is, what He has promised and His faithfulness to His people.

#4 The Call to Trust in God's Deliverance and Timing (v 15)

The battle belongs to the Lord and not to us. Sometimes, it is not about us fighting the battle and finding solutions on our own because the battle belongs to the Lord. Ps. Joachim encouraged those of us who have not seen God's deliverance in their situation, to trust in God's timing of things. He is faithful and good towards us. We must trust in Him!

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Was there a situation you encountered that made you realised that you are in a spiritual battle? Share with the cell regarding that experience.

Leader's Notes

We all go through spiritual battles on a daily basis. Some experiences are more real than others. Encourage your members to share an experience they had when they realised that the spiritual battle is really real.

Transition

Spiritual battles are real, and we should be aware. One common temptation that the enemy uses in the spiritual battle is defilement.

2. Ps. Joachim shared that when defile ourselves, the enemy will have a stronghold in our lives and that would render us powerless in the spiritual battle. What are the common "defilements" that we face regularly? How do we avoid being defiled by them?

Leader's Notes

We live in a world that is tempting us to be defiled. From the TV shows that we watch, to what we see on the internet, hook-up culture, sex outside of marriage – all of these can defile us and give authority to our flesh, thus rendering us powerless in our spiritual battles. We need to arm ourselves with a strong relationship with the Lord, to be sensitive to the voice of the Holy Spirit and to train ourselves to silence the voice of our flesh. Accountability of our lives will also play a key role in keeping us from being defiled.

Transition

Defilement and fear can definitely lead us to a place where the enemy can create a stronghold in our lives. But God has given us a powerful weapon to counter the attacks of the enemy and the flesh in the midst of these spiritual battles.

3. Ps. Joachim shared that praise can be a powerful weapon in the midst of our spiritual battle. Why do you think it is so hard for many of us to praise God in the midst of a spiritual battle? How can we make this a natural response for us?

Leader's Notes

Praise is a powerful weapon that God has given to us. The urge not to praise comes because of the conflict with the voice of our flesh, pressurising us to give into fear and defilement. Therefore, this is something that we need to train ourselves in during our spiritual battles – to intentionally praise (even when we don't feel like it). When we do that, we starve out the voice of the flesh and train our minds and heart to listen to the voice of the Spirit instead of the flesh.

Closing

We are in the midst of a spiritual battle, whether we like or not. How we live our lives each day matters because we are either gaining ground against the enemy in our lives, or we are losing ground. So, let us stand firm and be unshakeable in the midst of temptations and opportunities to defile ourselves. And let us learn to praise God in the midst of our storms as an act of faith and trust in His timing and His faithfulness toward us.

PRAYER

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- That we will be alert to the spiritual battles happening in our lives day in and day out.
- That we will not allow ourselves to be defiled, but will learn to be more sensitive to the promptings of the Holy Spirit.

2. RiverLife

- Pray for our church that as we have concluded the 21 days of prayer and fasting, we will determine to live in a new normal one that follows after the example of Christ.
- Pray for our upcoming mission trips, RiverLife Kindergarten Graduation Concert, as well as the Parents Gathering and Marriage Retreat that will be happening soon.

3. World

- Pray for Singapore as we experience a new wave of COVID-19 and haze.
- Pray for the conflict in the Gaza Strip between Israel and Hamas, that a peaceful resolution can be reached soon.
- Pray for Scotland and Scandinavia as the deadly storm Babet hits these countries.
- Pray for the bed bug infestations that are sweeling through France, Algeria and Africa.
- Continue to pray for the Russia-Ukraine war and the avoidance of using nuclear weapons.

4. Opportunities for Outreach

- Ask the Lord to bless us as we step out to reach a pre-believer.
- Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.

- 3. **Bible Equipping Sessions** by Pastor David Lim Book of Leviticus Set Apart for The Gospel: Encountering God's Holiness. "Rules and regulations" are unfortunately what go through many believers' minds whenever they encounter the book of Leviticus. In fact, its current name can be traced to a misconception that the book contained merely instructions to the priesthood, and thus was not relevant to the rest of God's people.

But why did God give this book to Israel right after the completion of the Tabernacle? How were the various rules related to the fact that God's holy presence was now dwelling among His people? The first half of Leviticus focuses on the significance of Israel's sacrificial system, culminating in the central theology of the atonement, while the second half explores the specific instructions concerning different aspects of daily lives and how they are meant to reflect the holiness of God.
