SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 2. Commit to living a life wholly devoted to Him

SERMON SUMMARY

King Ahad had married Jezebel, a Sidonian princess, who championed the worship of Baal and Asherah in Israel. The Israelites added these gods into their choices of worship to improve their chances of a better life. God was angry with this widespread worship of pagan gods and there was drought upon the land for 3 years. God intended to use this drought to draw Israel back to Himself.

SERMON RECAP

The people of Israel had been introduced to Baal and Asherah, the gods of Queen Jezebel. In 1 Kings 18 Elijah was sent to proclaim to King Ahab that there would be rain after a 3 year drought. Elijah challenged the people to make a stand and decision on which God to follow. He also challenged the prophets of Baal and Asherah.

Israel added Baal and Asherah into their worship list to improve their chances of a better life. Baal was deemed as the supreme God and could give good weather and boost their harvest. Asherah could increase fruitfulness to their flocks and families. Both deities enhanced their sensuality and sexual appetite through temple prostitution.

3. Application Today

 - Money / Materialism
 - Prestigious Degree
 - Good Job / Career
 - Physical Appearance
 - Children / Family
 - Comfort / Good Life
 - Entertainment / Fun
 - Sex
- b. Spiritual strongholds still exist today (1 Cor 10:3-5) Examples of spiritual strongholds:
 - Pride
 - Ungodly Belief
 - Lofty Knowledge
 - Self-Righteousness
 - Carnal Desires
 - Depression
 - Unworthiness
 - Irrational Fear
 - Distrust
 - Insecurity
- c. How do we demolish spiritual strongholds? (Luke 11:20-21) 4 Steps to take:
 - i. Recognize your idols and strongholds. Desire to demolish them with Jesus' help.
 - ii. Repent from your idolatry and other sins. Seek God's forgiveness.
 - iii. Resist the Devil's work in your life (James 4:7). Take up your spiritual authority and break these strongholds in Jesus' name.
 - iv. Rejoice in your freedom. Walk in steps with the Spirit in daily obedience

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. The Israelites had been introduced and influenced by the gods that had been introduced into their culture. Share with the cell if this is a similar experience you have in the settings you have been placed in. What are the overt and covert un-Biblical influences you have been exposed to? How can we be mindful not to be swayed by it but to remain devoted?

Leader's Notes

The question aims to let members take a step back to reflect on the influences they may have been exposed to, and to consider how they can choose to reflect God wherever God has placed them. In the case of 1 Kings 18, members can also reflect about the influence of leadership on communities, and to also ponder how they can also influence each other to live a devoted life and to point others to Christ.

Transition

While we become aware of the influences around us and how it may impact us, let us also consider how good things can become idols when they take the place of God in our lives.

2. Idols are things or people that become more important to us than God. Are there areas that have become more important to us than God? What are some subtle ways these things or people take the position of God? What is God's intention of us recognizing these idols and how can we find biblical balance?

Leader's Notes

This is a relate and reflect question. Some identified "idols" are not bad in itself, however it takes the form of idols when it becomes more important than God. This question aims to allow members to reflect on the subtle ways we may allow these to take the place of God. What are some markers that we can be mindful of e.g., the thin line of stewarding and nurturing our children or gifts vs allowing such things to become what we base our identity on. The later part of the question is for members to consider the heart of God for His people and how He desires for us to find everlasting satisfaction in Him instead of what is temporary.

Transition

God desires for us to be a people wholly devoted and surrendered to Him. He desires for us to trust Him and He will empower us to grant us what we need.

3. All of us will experience spiritual strongholds in our lives. Share with the cell an experience of a time where Jesus destroyed the spiritual stronghold, or a current area that you are trusting Jesus for breakthrough for. How can we also resist the work of the evil one in our lives?

Leader's Notes

This is a relate and reflect question for members to share their testimony of breakthroughs in their lives and for members to share and commit areas that they are trusting God for breakthrough for. As a cell, members can also consider how we can be aware of the work of the evil one and to be mindful against it.

Closing

While there are many things competing for our attention and devotion, we can find assurance in God. May we fix our eyes on God and trust Him wholeheartedly.

PRAYER

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- That we will be sensitive to God's leading and be aware of the things or people that have taken the place of an idol in our lives.
- That we can trust God wholeheartedly and find our identity in Him as we surrender these things to Him.
- For breakthrough in the areas of spiritual strongholds.

2. RiverLife

- Pray for our church that as we have concluded the 21 days of prayer and fasting, we will
 determine to live in a new normal one that follows after the example of Christ.
- Pray for our upcoming mission trips, RiverLife Kindergarten Graduation Concert, as well as the Parents Gathering and Marriage Retreat that will be happening soon.

3. World

- Pray for Singapore as we experience a new wave of COVID-19 and haze.
- Pray for the conflict in the Gaza Strip between Israel and Hamas, that a peaceful resolution can be reached soon.
- Pray for Scotland and Scandinavia as the deadly storm Babet hits these countries.
- Pray for the bed bug infestations that are sweeling through France, Algeria and Africa.
- Continue to pray for the Russia-Ukraine war and the avoidance of using nuclear weapons.

4. Opportunities for Outreach

- Ask the Lord to bless us as we step out to reach a pre-believer.
- Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.

- 4. **Bible Equipping Sessions** by Pastor David Lim Book of Leviticus Set Apart for The Gospel: Encountering God's Holiness. "Rules and regulations" are unfortunately what go through many believers' minds whenever they encounter the book of Leviticus. In fact, its current name can be traced to a misconception that the book contained merely instructions to the priesthood, and thus was not relevant to the rest of God's people.

But why did God give this book to Israel right after the completion of the Tabernacle? How were the various rules related to the fact that God's holy presence was now dwelling among His people? The first half of Leviticus focuses on the significance of Israel's sacrificial system, culminating in the central theology of the atonement, while the second half explores the specific instructions concerning different aspects of daily lives and how they are meant to reflect the holiness of God.
