SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Understand the significance of a new name (identity) and spiritual brokenness.
- 2. Prioritise their relationship with God and build on it daily.

SERMON SUMMARY

We often allow our past to define who we are. We embrace the identity the world gives to us. For those of us who struggle with a stigma from the past, God desires to give you a new name. We also often rely on self-effort to grow in Christlikeness, but Scripture tells us otherwise. For those of us who have relied on ourselves in our lives, God desires to give us a new limp where we would learn to depend and rely on God.

SERMON RECAP

Jacob Wrestles with God: Context

- At this point, Jacob has been through two major deceptions in his life.
- The first one is after deceiving Esau of his birth-right and blessing from Isaac. Jacob sought refuge with Laban his uncle after Esau vows to kill Jacob.
- The second one is when Jacob was deceived. Laban deceived Jacob by giving Leah to him instead of Rachel. Then Laban tried to cheat Jacob of his fortune, and they tried to out-cheat each other, which caused Jacob to flee Laban.
- Jacob's life is filled with the theme of deception and manipulation.

Part 1: The Crisis

- Jacob fled Laban by returning home, but he was afraid as remembers that Esau wanted to kill him.
 Therefore, he sent out parties to recce and received news that Esau was coming to meet him with 400 men (Genesis 32:3-6).
- Jacob was greatly distressed. In his fear and distress, Jacob did three things (refer to notes)
 - 1) He divided his contingent into two camps so that if one was attacked, the other camp might flee (v7-8).
 - 2) He prayed to God to deliver him from the hand of Esau (v9-12).
 - 3) He presented a peace offering to Esau in hopes that it would appease him so that Esau might spare his life (v13-21).
- It was in this moment of crisis that Jacob had an encounter with God.

Part 2: The Encounter

- Genesis 32:22-24
- For the first time in his life, Jacob found himself in a position of helplessness. He has done everything that he could. He was now at the mercy of Esau.
- At this juncture, Jacob wrestled with God. Scripture does not make clear what God was wrestling with Jacob about. But we can infer two significant things from the result of this wrestling:
 - 1) Jacob was given a new name.
 - 2) Jacob was given a new limp.
- The blessing came in the form of a new name. In the OT, the giving of a new name is significant (e.g., Abram to Abraham and Sarai to Sarah).

Application #1

A New Name: God gives us our identity. Our past does not.

- Jacob has been a cheater and manipulator since birth. His name, which means heel grabber, supplanter, or cheater, bears testament to that too.
- Genesis 27:36 We allow our past and the identity that others gave us to define who we are.
- In his encounter with God, Jacob received a new name (<u>Genesis 32:27-28</u>), Israel, which means God fights, God rules, God prevails.
- The significance of the name Israel is that now God fights for Jacob. God rules over Jacob.
- "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!"
 2 Corinthians 5:17

Application #2

A New Limp: Spiritual Brokenness – Coming to the end of ourselves.

- Genesis 32:25
- Jacob has always been self-reliant through manipulation and deception.
- God was removing Jacob's self-sufficiency and broke his self-will.
- Jacob now recognised that he is not a self-made man. He is now a God-made man.

Part 3: The Transformation

- Jacob is now a new man. He is transformed (Genesis 33:1-3):
 - 1) He placed others before himself.
 - He no longer tries to manipulate the situation but is now surrendered to God's sovereignty.
 - 3) He came before Esau with humility.

Conclusion

- The mystery of Christian maturity is found in the paradox of weakness and brokenness. It is only when we come to the end of ourselves that true maturity in Christ can take place. This usually takes place in two scenarios.
 - 1) When a crisis happens in our lives.
 - 2) When we tried everything but still fell short.
- There is this self-sufficiency that we carry, that until it is broken, will always be the lid in our Christian maturity.
- The essence of our faith is not to try harder, but to become more dependent on God. This means
 placing a greater emphasis on our relationship with God and less emphasis on our Christian
 behaviour.
- The new work is this: God wants to give you a new name (identity) and to create a permanent cripple in you so that from this moment on, you will recognise that we cannot do anything on our own. We must learn to depend on God.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. As you bring yourself to the Lord, what does He speak over you? What is the new name that God wants to give you today?

Leader's Notes

Are you defining yourself:

- By your past?
- By how others see you?
- By external factors such as your job, your position, your station in life?

All these are not important because they are not your identity. Your identity is God-given. Jacob was defined by his life experiences (deceiver, manipulator) and lives by them, but God bestowed a new identity and name upon him – Israel – meaning God fights, God rules, and God prevails.

Go to God today and ask Him for a new identity. Or perhaps you've heard from God during the sermon. Do share what you received from Him.

Transition

Our identity does not come from our self-effort. Our identity comes from God's grace.

2. Reflect on spiritual brokenness. What does spiritual brokenness mean to you? Have you been spiritually broken before?

<u>Leader's Notes</u>

This question calls us to reflect on what we think spiritual brokenness is. Brokenness is widely applied to various situations and experiences, and we may conceive the wrong idea. By sharing our experiences, we can also learn from each other what spiritual brokenness is.

Transition

It's important to have a healthy perspective on spiritual brokenness so that we will not shun from it.

3. Today you might be facing some difficulties or going through a crisis. Will you continue to try and fight in your own strength, or will you surrender to God?

Leader's Notes

"But Christ says to you, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." – 2 Corinthians 12:9

What you are facing today may be an opportunity for God to do a new work in you. The new work is to create a permanent limp in you. Once you allow God to create a permanent limp in you, you will forever recognise that you are weak.

The essence of our faith is not to try harder, but to become more dependent on Him who holds our life in His loving hands. How can we be more dependent on Him? By placing less emphasis on our Christian behaviour and a greater emphasis on our relationship with God.

<u>Closing</u>

Your life is not in your hands but in God's. When you recognise that you are dependent on God, this new dependence will become your newfound strength.

WORKS

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- Pray for God to give you a new identity and to constantly reaffirm it.
- Pray for complete surrender so that we rely on Him totally.

2. RiverLife

- Pray for our church that as we have concluded the 21 days of prayer and fasting, we will determine to live in a new normal one that follows after the example of Christ.
- Pray for our upcoming mission trips, as well as the Marriage Retreat that will be happening soon.

3. World

- Pray for Singapore as we experience a new wave of COVID-19 and haze.
- Pray for the conflict in the Gaza Strip between Israel and Hamas, that a peaceful resolution can be reached soon.
- Pray for the escalation of violence between Myanmar's military and ethnic armed groups.
- Pray for Italy as they encounter Storm Ciaran
- Continue to pray for the Russia-Ukraine war and the avoidance of using nuclear weapons.

4. Opportunities for Outreach

- Ask the Lord to bless us as we step out to reach a pre-believer.
- Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.

1. **Bible Equipping Sessions** by Pastor David Lim - Book of Leviticus Set Apart for The Gospel: Encountering God's Holiness. "Rules and regulations" are unfortunately what go through many believers' minds whenever they encounter the book of Leviticus. In fact, its current name can be traced to a misconception that the book contained merely instructions to the priesthood, and thus was not relevant to the rest of God's people.

But why did God give this book to Israel right after the completion of the Tabernacle? How were the various rules related to the fact that God's holy presence was now dwelling among His people? The first half of Leviticus focuses on the significance of Israel's sacrificial system, culminating in the central theology of the atonement, while the second half explores the specific instructions concerning different aspects of daily lives and how they are meant to reflect the holiness of God.
