

Date: 7 Jan 2024 | **Speaker:** Elder Lee Ee Yang | **Topic:** God First, People Next, Then the Earth | **Scripture:** Genesis 1:26 – 2:3

SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Achieve a profound personal connection with God through practical steps inspired by the Bible Deeper Connection.
- Cultivate a spiritually aligned community applying 'God First, People Next, Then the Earth,' as a collective <u>Unified</u> <u>Community</u>.

SERMON SUMMARY

The first sermon kicking off the New Year emphasises the importance of prioritising God, people, and the Earth in the context of a fast-paced and stressful society. Eld. Ee Yang reflects on the challenges faced in 2023, highlighting stress levels and the concept of "revenge bedtime procrastination." The key to thriving in such an environment, he suggests, is aligning priorities with the spiritual principle of "God First, People Next, Then the Earth."

Drawing from the creation account in Genesis 1:26-2:3, he explores the divine order of creation, emphasising humanity's unique role as bearers of God's image. The order of importance, according to Eld. Ee Yang, is God, people (starting with the family), and then the Earth (encompassing work, ministry, and other aspects of life).

The practical application involves prioritising a relationship with God, listening to His guidance, and taking steps in faith, as seen in the examples of Abraham's journey and the corporate example of the Israelites camping around the Presence of God.

Furthermore, the message stresses the significance of family over work and ministry as Eld. Ee Yang shared a personal testimony of reprioritising family in his own life. The blessings of provision and rest, outlined in Genesis 1:29 and 2:3, are presented as rewards for following God's order. Eld. Ee Yang encourages us to trust in God by providing examples from Scripture and emphasising the need to seek His guidance in uncertain times. The message concludes with an altar call, urging RiverLifers to commit to trust and follow God in the coming year and inviting families to prioritise God and receive His blessings.

SERMON RECAP

Eld. Ee Yang welcomes the congregation to 2024 with excitement, reflecting on a watch night service filled with the joy of being in the Lord's presence. Addressing the challenges of 2023, he compassionately acknowledges the overwhelming impact of COVID, travel, work, and school stresses. The sermon, titled "God first, people next, then the Earth," draws inspiration from Genesis, presenting a spiritual principle for a fruitful and strife-free life.

Delving into the creation narrative, Eld. Ee Yang emphasizes a divine order, highlighting humans as the pinnacle of creation, recipients of God's clear intention. He deepens the exploration, establishing the divine order that places humans at the apex, profoundly loved and treasured by God. Eld. Ee Yang addresses the modern tendency to prioritize careers, children, and even pets over God, urging a return to the divine order of prioritizing God, people, and the Earth.

The message includes application points, drawing inspiration from Abraham's faith journey. Eld. Ee Yang shares personal stories, illustrating the consequences of misplaced priorities. He emphasizes the ongoing challenge of prioritizing God above all and shares a poignant personal story from 2012, encouraging faith in uncertain times. The metaphor of the Israelites camping around the Tabernacle underscores the importance of corporately following God's leading.

Reflecting on the church's recent journey, Eld. Ee Yang emphasizes the importance of following God's order. In 2022, the focus was on God's manifest presence, followed by a missional orientation in 2023 with impactful testimonies of revival and restoration. Looking ahead to 2024, Eld. Ee Yang desires the multiplication of blessings, urging the congregation to trust in God's current rather than personal strength.

He also shares a personal revelation in 2023: the priority of family over work and ministry, highlighting practical steps for reprioritization. The sermon concludes with a call to repentance and trust in God's strength, using Isaiah 30:15. Eld. Ee Yang encourages the congregation to respond in worship, acknowledging Christ as their source of trust and strength, expressing hope for the church community in 2024.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Reflecting on the message's emphasis on priorities (God first, people next, then the Earth), how can individuals practically implement this principle in their daily lives, considering the various demands such as work, family, and personal commitments? Share specific examples or strategies that can help maintain this order in a hectic and demanding world. How do Bible verses such as Matthew 6:33 ('But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.') resonate with this principle?

Leader's Notes

Leaders can encourage cell members to integrate biblical principles for life into the discussions. Explore how Matthew 6:33 provides a foundational directive to prioritize seeking God's kingdom above all, trusting in His provision. Additionally, consider Proverbs 3:5-6, emphasizing the importance of trusting in the Lord with all your heart and acknowledging His guidance in all areas of life. In the discussion, leaders can encourage participants to share personal experiences aligning their priorities with God's order and how these Biblical principles have impacted their lives. Foster a dialogue on the challenges faced in maintaining this order and collectively brainstorm practical solutions grounded in Scripture.

Transition

As we explore the practical aspects of aligning our priorities with God's order, let's now delve into the collective application of these principles within a community or church setting.

2. How can a community or church collectively apply the 'God First, People Next, Then the Earth' principle to fulfil their shared purpose? Discuss the impact on decision-making, goal-setting, and the overall atmosphere within the community or church. Consider Proverbs 3:5-6 ('Trust in the Lord with all your heart...') as a foundation for collective trust in God.

Leader's Notes

Leaders can prompt members to delve into the application of the discussed principle on a collective level, drawing inspiration from relevant Biblical verses.

Consider Numbers 2:1-2 as a case study, highlighting the Israelites' collective trust in God's guidance as they camped around the Presence of God. Explore other passages such as Acts 2:42-47, emphasizing the early church's communal approach to following God and prioritizing relationships.

Facilitate a discussion on how these Biblical examples can inform decision-making, goal-setting, and the overall atmosphere within the community or church. Encourage cell members to share insights on building a sense of unity and shared purpose within the community grounded in trust in God.

Transition

As we consider the collective trust within a community, let's now turn our attention to the blessings mentioned in the message and their significance in today's society. May our discussions inspire tangible steps toward aligning our lives with God's order, both individually and within our communities. Let's actively seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit in implementing these principles and fostering a culture of trust and unity within our collective journey of faith.

3. Reflecting on the blessings mentioned in the sermon – provision (Genesis 1:29) and rest (Genesis 2:3) – how do these blessings seem lacking in today's society? Explore ways in which aligning with God's order and priorities can lead to experiencing these blessings individually and collectively. Consider verses like Isaiah 30:15 ('In repentance and rest you will be saved, in quietness and trust is your strength.') and discuss their relevance in our pursuit of God's blessings in a fast-paced world.

Leader's Notes

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Engage members in a discussion on the perceived lack of blessings, such as provision and rest, in our fast-paced society. Lead members to explore the potential connection between aligning with God's order and experiencing these blessings. Refer to verses like Isaiah 30:15 to deepen the understanding of the importance of repentance, rest, and trust in our pursuit of God's blessings. Encourage members to share their insights and experiences in seeking these blessings in their lives, especially as they relate to the plans and hopes for 2024.

Closing

As we contemplate these principles and their implications in our lives, let's not merely reflect but take action. Let's commit to prioritizing God, fostering collective trust, and seeking the blessings He promises. May our discussions inspire tangible steps toward aligning our lives with God's order, both individually and within our communities!

- Pray for the situation at the Red Sea where militants from Yemen are attacking various ships
- Pray for Indonesia as it approaches its elections.
