SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

1. Reflect about the moments of God's grace through our difficult moments.
2. Reflect and share about our Sonship in Christ

SERMON SUMMARY

Ps Ernie preached from the parable of the Prodigal Son. He provided more insights from the Jewish context for us to have a deeper understanding of the various scenes from the younger son's leaving, his realisation about his own actions, how he returned home and was restored back to Sonship. It represents us as sinners, who had strayed away due to different circumstances, and how God restores us to Him as we repent and return to Him. Through this parable, we see the Father heart of God and how He desires for us to know Him as our Heavenly Father and we as His children.

SERMON RECAP

Ps Ernie preached from the parable of the Prodigal Son. It is a story to remind us that God's love is freely given and not earned.

a. Scene 1: The Departure (vv. 11 – 13)

- This passage must be read in the context of [Luke 15:1-2](#). The story of the Prodigal son was in the context of Jesus addressing the religious leaders (pharisees) and their relationship with the sinners.
- It is very likely, given the context, that the younger brother was mistreated by the elder brother. This caused the younger brother to have a tough family life (isolation and rejection).
- He had thirst that was not satisfied in the current family state.
- He came to a breaking point where he decided to cut all ties with his family, out of frustration.
- Although the father was sad with the situation (and possibly persuaded him the two brothers to make peace), he obliged because of "freewill". He gave 1/3 of the inheritance to the younger son because in the Jewish culture, the older brother receives a double portion of the inheritance as a mark of respect and affirmation of him as the new head of the house (once the father passes away).
- The inheritance received is in the form of land and belongings.

b. Scene 2: A Famine called Grace (vv. 14 – 16)

- The younger son took a while to convert his inheritance into money before leaving the family home.
- He went to a faraway Gentile country where he lived recklessly (out of frustration); spending everything that he had. This would not have gone down well for the citizens of that country.
- However, a famine soon arrived and he was at a disadvantaged, being the reckless foreigner that everyone knew to be reckless.
- When seen in perspective, the famine can be seen as God's grace, causing the younger son to yearn for home.

c. Scene 3: The Epiphany (vv. 17 – 19)

- The younger son recognizes that all he needs and wants is in his father's house and wanted to return back as a hired hand. A hired hand is different from a slave because slaves stayed in the home, while hired-hands lived elsewhere. The son positioned himself to do so because of a Jewish ceremony called Kezazah where the whole village will cut off all ties with a son that brought dishonour to the father.
- Thus, the younger son knew that there was no way he was ever going to be a part of the family again; not even a slave. He wanting to become a hired-hand was just his way of acknowledging his sin and trying to make up for it by paying back his father.

d. Scene 4: The Homecoming (vv. 20 – 24)

- Having all of these in mind, it is then understandable as to why the father ran to embrace the younger son – he wanted to get there first before the villagers met the younger son and performed the Kezazah ceremony of cutting him off from the family and from the village community.
- The father instead had compassion for the son, ran and embraced him. He also restored back the son’s identity through the giving of the signet ring, the robe and the sandals.
 - The best robe in the house belonged to the father and he gave it to the prodigal son
 - The signet ring represents the authority of the Father because the ring was usually used to stamp approvals for official documents
- Because of what the father did, the village had no choice but to receive the prodigal son back as part of the family.

Application

This story highlights to us the immense measure of the love of God. Like the prodigal son, we were sinners trying to quench a thirst in our lives. We tried all sorts of ways – love, self-actualisation, climbing the cooperate ladder, money, etc. But that thirst can only be quenched by God’s love. God placed fathers here on this earth because they were meant to reflect who God is to their children. However, many fathers (or parents) are unable to give what they themselves had never received from their parents. As a result, many of us are left hurt and with an un-quenched thirst in our lives – the longing for the love of God.

God desires for us to “come home” and to receive and experience His love for us. He is the source of living water. Like the prodigal son, may we respond by coming home to the Father and allowing us to heal, restore and love us as His children

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. **Were there times in your life where a famine was actually a provision of God's grace? Share your experience.**

Leader's Notes

This is a relate question for members to think and reflect about times where they were going through difficult situations (either of or not of their own actions) that led them to realise the things that truly matter in eternity, and brought them back to a deeper relationship with God.

Transition

Some moments in our lives are blessings in disguise to draw us back closer to the Father's embrace.

2. **Share with the cell your relationship with your parents. How has this impacted your relationship with God?**

Leader's Notes

Whether we realise it or not, our relationship with our earthly parents does impact our relationship with our heavenly father. This question is designed to help cell members to see if how they approach God is similar to how they approach their parents.

Transition

These patterns can cause us to approach God in a fearful way or even a way where we unknowingly feel the need to earn God's love.

3. **Are there any challenges you face(d) that hinder you from embracing your identity as a child of God? Share how you overcame it or how you would like the cell to pray for you.**

Leader's Notes

This question aims for members to share about possible challenges in beliefs, struggles with God or others that may have affected them in seeing themselves as children of God, where love is freely given and not earned. The cell can also break into smaller groups to pray for one another.

Closing

Let us continue to remember how dearly loved we are in God and hold on to His unconditional love for us. As we freely receive, may we continue to be transformed into His likeness.

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- Pray for all of us to freely receive the Father's love
- Pray for each other, especially those who have been hurt by past relationships and have difficulties receiving the Father's love freely.

2. RiverLife

- Pray for our church, that as we enter into a season of prayer and fasting, that God will align all of our hearts and do what He needs to do so that we can live in a new normal that glorifies Him.

3. World

- Continue to pray for the various nations that are at war:
 - a. Russia and Ukraine
 - b. Myanmar (Civil War) – Pray for the situation where military service was made compulsory for man and woman between the ages of 18 and 35.
 - c. Israel & Hamas
- Continue to pray for countries that have an escalated conflict situation:
 - a. Japan, China and the Philippines in the South China Sea
 - b. North & South Korea
- Continue to pray for countries recovering from recent natural disasters:
 - a. Japan (Earthquake)
 - b. Iceland (Volcanic Eruption)
- Pray for Singapore
 - a. Pray against the rise of young drug abusers
 - b. Pray for a stability in the cost of living in Singapore
- Other Global Issues
 - a. Pray for Sydney as it recovers from a case of multiple stabbings
 - b. Pray for the situation in Thailand where a mass migration of Burmese refugees are seeking to enter the country

4. Opportunities for Outreach

- € Ask the Lord to bless us as we step out to reach a pre-believer.
- € Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.
