SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Understand what it means to live as sons and daughters of God
- 2. Desire to model after Jesus in living out our lives as sons and daughters
- 3. Desire to see the restoration of families and reconciliation of broken relationships in our lives.

SERMON SUMMARY

We learned from the Parable of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32) that both the younger and the elder brother had an orphan spirit. While the younger brother was the prodigal who was lost, the elder brother also had a transactional relationship with both the father and brother, and lived as an orphan in the home. He too was lost.

Sonship is not learned in a day. It is a journey that requires a lifelong relationship with God the Father and with His children.

The Bible tells us from Malachi 4:5-6 that the ministry of reconciliation between fathers and sons will be a key feature before Jesus' return. We live in an hour where it is important for the Church to understand what it means to live as sons to our Heavenly Father.

Jesus is our True Elder Brother, who showed us the way into sonship and right relationship with the Father.

SERMON RECAP

In Luke 15, Jesus outlines 3 parables – (1) the parable of the lost sheep, (2) the parable of the lost coin, and (3) the parable of the lost son. In the first 2 parables, someone goes out in search of the thing that was lost – the shepherd goes to search for the lost sheep, and the woman searches for her lost coin. However, in the third parable, the striking difference is that nobody goes to search for the younger brother. Jesus is inviting the listeners of the parables to ask the question: Who then should have gone to search for the younger brother?

To help answer the question, we need to go back to the first time where brothers are mentioned in the Bible – in Genesis 4. This is the story of Cain and Abel, where God asked Cain (the elder brother) - "Where is your brother?", to which Cain replied: "Am I my brother's keeper?".

Jesus is reminding us (and His listeners) that <u>You are your brother's keeper</u>. And that it was the elder brother who should have gone to search for the younger brother.

As we think about the prodigals in our lives, God is still asking us the same question today: "What kind of brother or sister are you going to be?" For the younger brother in the parable to be reinstated into the family (who had lost his inheritance), it had to be done at the cost of the older brother.

"Mercy and forgiveness must be free and unmerited to the wrongdoer. If the wrongdoer has to do something to merit it, then it isn't mercy. But forgiveness always comes at a cost to the one granting the forgiveness." – **Timothy Keller**

Josh shared with us that Jesus (the Son that was telling the parable) is our older brother. While we were dead in our sins, we needed an older brother to come to us and to bring us home. Jesus did that when He gave up everything in order to bring us home. He is our true elder brother. Josh Yeoh highlighted 3 characteristics of Jesus who showed us the way to live in sonship:

#1: The elder brother was angry, proud and unloving. Jesus our true elder brother is gentle, humble and loving.

- In what ways have we been like the elder brother in our dealings with people? Have we been proud and unloving? If we strive to earn God's love, we are often judging and unloving.
- But Jesus is gentle, humble and loving. And Jesus invites us:
 "Come to Me, all who labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you, and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls."- Matthew 11:28-29
- Jesus "humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross." (Philippians 2:5-8)

#2: The elder brother is driven by a performance mindset. Jesus, our true elder brother, is rested in His identity as a son.

- In performance-driven Singapore, how have we been driven by this mindset? We often take on a Master-Servant relationship with God. We can unintentionally become transactional with God and others. But Jesus rested in His identity as a son.
- "But whoever would be great among you must be your servant, and whoever would be first among you must be slave of all. For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many." (Mark 10:43-45)
- "We are called to rule with the heart of a servant but serve with the heart of a king." Bill Johnson

#3: The elder brother is selfish. Jesus our true elder brother is selfless.

- When we strive, we are almost always self-centred, and our decisions are often made based on "me" at the centre. But Jesus is selfless.
- "There was no way for the younger brother to return to the family unless the older brother bore the cost himself. Our true elder brother paid our debt, on the cross, in our place" Timothy Keller
- Jesus also invites us to be co-heirs with Him. Everything that Jesus has also belongs to us. We are recipients of Jesus' inheritance.
- "...you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, "Abba! Father!" The Spirit himself bears witness
 with our spirit that we are children of God, and <u>if children, then heirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ</u>"
 (Romans 8:15-17)

We are living in the days before the great and awesome day of the Lord. The primary sign of the ministry of Elijah going to be the ministry of reconciliation and the restoration of families (Malachi 4: 5-6):

"And he will <u>turn the hearts of fathers to their children and the hearts of children to their fathers</u>, lest I come and strike the land with a decree of utter destruction." – Malachi 4:6

In closing, Josh Yeoh challenged (i) those who were Fathers and Mothers to understand what a heart turned towards their children looked like by examining whether their hearts have turned away from their children, and (ii) the younger generation – sons and daughters, to ask God to give them a Father's heart and learn how to be a son/daughter of God.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

iscussion Ques

1. What difference does it make for you to see yourself as a child of God?

Leader's Notes

Many of us have a faulty view of God and His grace which causes us to remain in slavery to sin when He really wants to restore us as sons and daughters. Galatians 4:7 tells that us that as Christians, we have moved from being slaves to sons (and daughters) of God. We do not need to perform or earn the Father's love. We do not do good works in order to earn God's love. God's love has already been poured out on us and it has changed us. Therefore, we can't help but do good works because of our identity as God's children. We also cannot help but live from a position of rest, victory and obedience.

Leaders can invite members to share how this truth impacts the way they feel toward God and relate to Him.

2. Josh Yeoh shared the key characteristics of Jesus, the true elder brother, in contrast to the elder brother's characteristics in the parable. Share which of the elder brother's characteristics you identify most with, and how you can model after Jesus to live as children of God and be your brother's keeper.

Leader's Notes

Unlike the elder brother in the parable, Jesus celebrates when we come home. Jesus gave His life to give you and me the blessings we do not deserve. Unlike the elder brother of the parable, Jesus gladly shares with us the blessings of His father. He suffered so that you and I could be reconciled and brought into the family of God. Jesus showed us how to live as a Son during his time on earth.

All of us have some aspects of the older brother in us. Leaders can invite members to share which of these characteristics or aspects we resonate most with and how this impacts the way we live and relate to God and others around us.

The cell can discuss practical ways to deepen your father-son or father-daughter relationship with God and how to keep each other accountable.

Transition

Sonship is not learned in a day; it is a journey that requires a relationship with God the Father and with His children.

3. Malachi 4:5-6 says that we are living in the days where God will turn the hearts of fathers to their children and the hearts of children to their fathers. Share if there are relationships in your family that you wish to see restoration.

Leader's Notes

This is a response question. Many of us would have experienced strained relationships with our family members and loved ones. Leaders can invite members to share if there are strained or broken relationships that they desire to see God bring reconciliation and restoration. The cell can spend some time praying for each other to see breakthroughs and reconciliation in these relationships.

Closing

May God turn the hearts of fathers to their children and the hearts of children to their fathers (Malachi 4:6) and teach us how to relate rightly to Him as sons and daughters.



Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- Pray for God to help us relate rightly to Him, and live our lives as sons and daughters of God
- Pray for the restoration of families and reconciliation of broken and strained relationships in our lives.

2. RiverLife

• Pray for our church, that as we enter into a season of prayer and fasting, that God will align all of our hearts and do what He needs to do so that we can live in a new normal that glorifies Him.

3. World

- Continue to pray for the various nations that are at war:
 - a. Russia and Ukraine
 - b. Myanmar (Civil War) Pray for the situation where military service was made compulsory for man and woman between the ages of 18 and 35.
 - c. Israel & Hamas
- Continue to pray for countries that have an escalated conflict situation:
 - a. Japan, China and the Philippines in the South China Sea
 - b. North & South Korea
- Continue to pray for countries recovering from recent natural disasters:
 - a. Taiwan (Earthquake)
 - b. Indonesia (Volcanic Eruption)
- Pray for Singapore
 - a. Pray for the family of the 2 victims that were killed in a road accident at Tampines
 - b. Pray for a smooth transition from PM Lee to incoming PM Lawrence Wong
 - c. Pray for a stability in the cost of living in Singapore
- Other Global Issues
 - a. Pray for the at Columbia University where pro-Palestinian demonstrations are turning violent.

4. Opportunities for Outreach

- Ask the Lord to bless us as we step out to reach a pre-believer.
- Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.
