SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Reflect about the areas of our lives we need to consecrate before God
- 2. Be reminded about the importance of trusting and obeying God

SERMON SUMMARY

Ps Benny shares about conquering the walls of Jericho. We will all face Jerichos in life and the key lesson is to trust and obey. Trusting and obeying are intricately linked as our struggle to obey God is rooted in our ability to trust Him. When we truly trust God, we will obey Him!

Canaan is not so much a picture of heaven because in heaven, there are no enemies to overcome. It is a picture of the eternal inheritance of the believer. Jericho is a picture of the things that stands against us as we seek to live in the victory of God.

Ps Benny also shared about strongholds. Cindy Jacobs defines "A stronghold is when we accept as unchangeable something that is contrary to the will of God." What we accept as unchangeable and contrary to the will of God is a stronghold and a Jericho we need to face.

3 Key lessons from Conquering Jericho:

- 1. It is premised on God's Promise (Joshua 6:2)
- 2. It is proven by Obedient Actions
- 3. It is preceded by Personal Consecration (Joshua 3:5)

Let us learn to trust and obey even as we continue to conquer our Jerichos!

SERMON RECAP

Ps Benny shares about conquering the walls of Jericho. We all face our "Jericho's" in life. It appears in various forms - A difficult situation, a fractured relationship, an insurmountable problem, a stubborn sin, an on-going addiction and an overwhelming obstacle. The solution is to trust and obey! Trusting and Obeying are intricately linked as our struggle to obey God is rooted in our ability to trust Him. When we truly trust God, we will obey Him!

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3 key lessons from Conquering Jericho -

1. It is premised on God's Promise (Joshua 6:2)

- Biblical archaeology indicates that the walls of Jericho fell outward and not inward. It became a ramp that the solders could scale and enter the city directly (Joshua 6:5)!
- > It was a fulfilment of God's promises, and His promises are "Yes" and "Amen" in Christ (2 Corinthians 12:20).
- What God promises, He delivers! The power of God is present to pull down every stronghold in Jesus' Name, we will need to go back to the Word of God and do what it says!

2. It is proven by Obedient Actions

- Trust in God is proven by obedient actions. Though the promise was given by God to the Israelites, the eventual victory will be an act of God and the Israelites are still expected to do their part. The Israelites had to march and go around the city, blowing the trumpet for the first 6 days and had to shout together on the 7th day!
- We learn to trust by learning to obey. The greatest challenge in life is **NOT** the *stone walls* we face outside but it is the *self-will* inside! What are the aspects of our lives we need to let go of and to obey God in?
- Through the story of Jericho, we see how God worked through the obedience of His people. What the Israelites did at Jericho made no military sense! It was possible that even the Israelites were not allowed to speak on the first six days of walking around the walk so that no one could speak any negative words to cast doubt. The enemies were also confident that walls of Jericho would stand strong as there were two sets of walls. However, whatever is impossible with men is possible with God. Through this, it showed how the Israelites needed to hear and obey (James 1:22).

3. It is preceded by Personal Consecration

- The Conquest of Joshua 6 is rooted in the Consecration found in Joshua 5. Joshua consecrated himself when he met with the Lord (Joshua 5:15). The pilgrimage to trust and obey God's promises begins with a posture of worship.
- The starting point of any breakthrough is in the Presence of God! Consecration comes before conquest (Joshua 3:5). After the Israelites crossed the Jordan River, they built a memorial as an act of worship and they were also circumcised after. Consecration came before and after every breakthrough moment. Let us bring our Jerichos to the Presence of God!

As we reflect on the 3 key lessons above, it is important for us to remember that consecration is rooted in the redemption of Jesus Christ. Faith is based on who God is and what God says (Hebrews 6:11-12).

Ps Benny also shared how *periods of faith are built through being in God's waiting room*, where we continue to earnestly wait for God's breakthrough. There, our faith is tested, our soul is sanctified and our discipleship is deepened.

He also shares about how waiting has both a passive and active dimension – the passive dimension is where we wait in surrender – quiet and yielded upon the sovereignty of God and the active dimension is one where we are actively holding onto the promises of God and refusing to let go.

Let us learn to trust and obey even as we continue to conquer our Jerichos!

1. Consecration comes before Conquest. What are some Jerichos that we have faced or will face in life? Share with the cell and discuss on how we have allowed situations to become strongholds in our lives. What are some aspects of our lives we will need to surrender to God before we can conquer them?

Leader's Notes

Leaders can choose to break this question into two portions if they wish to pace it for the cell. The question aims for members to consider what are some strongholds of today – what in our culture, values or circumstances have influenced and shaped our beliefs and have caused us to accept things as they are; when these things are strongholds that need to be submitted and surrendered to God? These things can be difficult situations, problems, sins, addictions, fractured relationships

The second part of the question aims for members to reflect on their own walk with God and to consider if there are aspects in their lives they need to surrender and consecrate before God as they seek God for a breakthrough in their circumstances.

Transition

Consecration comes before conquest. As we live surrendered to Him, we will also see His victory.

2. Ps Benny shared about God's waiting room and how there is both an active and passive dimension in waiting. Share your own experience of being in the waiting room and how it has or had been a moulding process for you.

Leader's Notes

Leaders can invite members to share about an area they are seeking God's breakthrough in. Allow members to see there is both an active and passive dimension in waiting, and not either-or. If members struggle with the active dimension, they could also use some time in cell to consider what are the truths in God's word to hold on to while waiting actively. Should members struggle more with the passive dimension, leaders can also encourage members to share and to consider what are the characteristics of God to hold on to during these trying times. In both dimensions, allow members to share their struggles and also to turn to the word of God as an anchor.

Transition

May we continue to be people who trust and obey God wholeheartedly and we will not only see breakthrough, but we will also know God more intimately in this process and allow Him to mould us.

3. We are called to trust and obey. Share a time where you saw God's provision as you sought, trusted and obeyed Him or a situation where you are seeking Him for breakthrough in this season.

Leader's Notes

Leaders can invite members to elaborate more on what trusting and obeying would look like in their everyday life as a first part to the question. Members are invited to share about their experience of trusting and obeying God – their struggles and how it was for them seeing the breakthrough Or trusting God for the breakthrough in their current season. The cell can break into small groups to pray.

Closing

Let us continue to bring our Jerichos to the Presence of God, to consecrate ourselves and seek Him for breakthroughs!



Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- Pray for God to reveal to us what are some strongholds we hold on to and to seek Him for breakthrough
- Pray that we will continue to submit our will to God as we trust and obey Him.
- Pray that we will desire a greater intimacy and knowledge of God

2. World

- Continue to pray for the various nations that are at war:
 - a. Russia and Ukraine
 - b. Myanmar (Civil War) Pray for the situation where military service was made compulsory for man and woman between the ages of 18 and 35.
 - c. Israel & Hamas
- Continue to pray for countries that have an escalated conflict situation:
 - a. Japan, China and the Philippines in the South China Sea
 - b. North & South Korea
- Continue to pray for countries recovering from recent natural disasters:
 - a. Taiwan (Typhoon Gaemi)
 - b. Indonesia (Volcanic Eruption)
 - c. South East Asia Heatwave across various countries
 - d. Canada (Wildfire)
 - e. Guangdong, China Flash floods
 - f. India Heatwave
- Pray for Singapore
 - a. Pray for PM Lawrence Wong and his cabinet as they begin a new chapter for Singapore
 - b. Pray for a stability in the cost of living in Singapore
 - c. Pray for the rising number of dengue cases in Singapore
- Other Global Issues
 - a. Pray for the United States of America as they recover from the assassination attempt of Donald Trump
 - b. Pray for the UK as a new Prime Minister and Cabinet governs the nation
 - c. Pray for Thailand as it goes through a case seeking the dismissal of its Prime Minister
 - d. Pray for the political situation in France
 - e. Pray for the shortage of surgeons situation in Malaysia
