CELL DISCUSSION GUIDE

Date: 11 Aug 2024 | Speaker: Ps Lam Zheng Xin | Topic: Faith | Scripture: Joshua 10:1-15

SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Understand that knowing the Word is not the same as believing in it.
- 2. Express our faith through our works.

SERMON SUMMARY

We are to bring God's love and shalom into our families, our workplaces, our neighbourhoods, and to the nations. We do this by our faith in God, and then working out what God has called us to do.

Joshua and the Israelites overcame the Amorites by faith. Through God's Word to them, they went into battle knowing that God will fight for them. But they still needed to take action and fight. Faith alone was not sufficient. Their faith needed to be expressed through their works.

The message today was built on 3 points:

- Our faith is based on God's Word to us.
- Our faith is expressed through our works.
- Our works is to be done in faith.

SERMON RECAP

1) Our faith is based on God's Word to us

- Our faith is rooted in God's Word, as demonstrated by Joshua's faith, which came from God's promise in Joshua
 10:8. God's Word provides the assurance and confidence needed to face challenges. It is about knowing and trusting in who God is and what He says. Our faith is based on His character and promises.
- Our faith is built up from hearing the rhema word of Christ (Romans 10:17). Hearing God's Word involves more
 than just listening; it requires spiritual understanding and receptivity. It is essential to hear God speaking to us
 personally through Scripture, allowing it to transform our beliefs. Remember that knowing God's Word is
 different from believing in it.
- Faith involves believing in what we cannot see with our natural eyes, trusting that God is working in the unseen (Hebrews 11:1). Therefore, we are to believe that God loves us and is working in our lives, even when circumstances suggest otherwise.

2) Our faith is expressed through our works

- Joshua responded to the Gibeonites' plea for help by honouring the covenant with them, despite its flawed origin. He understood that a wrong should not be corrected with another wrong, and that keeping promises was crucial.
- God supported Joshua's faith-driven actions in three ways: causing confusion among the Amorite army, sending
 hailstones that targeted only the enemies, and halting the sun to ensure victory. This highlights the partnership
 between divine intervention and human effort. Faith involves trusting God to act, while works involve us taking
 action aligned with that trust. Both are necessary to achieve God's purposes.
- We should avoid the extremes, i.e., living solely by faith without action, or relying only on works without faith. Balance is essential, where faith inspires our actions, and our actions are grounded in faith.
- God desires to partner with us in our endeavours. We are called to work diligently while relying on God's wisdom and provision, recognising that our efforts are enhanced by His presence and support.



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3) Our works is to be done in faith

- Hebrews 11:6 emphasises that faith is essential to please God. God desires us to live by faith, recognising His presence in our daily lives and trusting in His guidance. This relationship is personal and unique for each individual.
- Obedience to God involves both faith and works. We pursue our goals and overcome challenges by trusting God and taking action. We should regularly assess whether we are living by faith or relying solely on our efforts. Do we seek God's guidance and believe in His promises, or do we depend only on our abilities?
- God is constantly working in ways we may not perceive, and faith requires trusting in His invisible actions. We live out that faith by stepping out in obedience when He calls.



1. What areas of your life do you find it challenging to trust in God's promises, and how might hearing God's word strengthen your belief and trust in Him?

Leader's Notes

"Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ." – **Romans 10:17**

Reflect on the times when you struggled to believe in God's love, provision, or guidance. Consider how immersing yourself in God's Word can transform doubt into trust. How can the stories and promises in Scripture help you overcome disbelief and strengthen your faith in God's presence and promises?

Transition

When we are doubtful, we must turn to His Word to regain our faith.

2. How can we discern when to wait for God's timing versus when to take action, and what role does faith play in that discernment process?

Leader's Notes

In life, we often face moments where we are unsure whether to act or wait. Discuss how faith can guide you in discerning God's timing. What signs or confirmations do you look for to know that it's time to move forward or hold back?

Reflect on Biblical examples where individuals either waited on God or took bold steps in faith. How do prayer, seeking counsel, and reading Scripture help in understanding God's will in these situations? Share personal experiences where you faced similar decisions and how you balanced waiting with action.

Transition

Discernment comes from knowing the word of God and being sensitive to the Holy Spirit.

3. Identify one area of your life where you need to balance faith with action. What specific steps can you take to trust God and to actively work towards achieving your "Promised Land"?

Leader's Notes

Reflect on a specific area in your life (such as your career, relationships, or spiritual growth) where you've been praying a lot but not taking action. How can you actively involve God in this situation while taking concrete steps forward? Discuss how you can incorporate both faith and works and consider how living in this balance can help you reach your "Promised Land" and fulfil God's purposes for you.

Closing

Joshua and the Israelites knew that the war is already won. Yet, they still had to take action in order to win it. May we do likewise as we seek to reach and conquer our own "Promised Land".

Prayer Pointers

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- Pray for that the men will live out their God-given responsibilities with spiritual authority.
- Pray that we will obey and respect the authorities that God has placed over us.
- Pray for our family members and friends, especially for those who have yet to know Him.
- To commit 2024 to God and allow Him to work in us and through us as we continue to seek Him.

2. RiverLife

Let us continue to pray for God's hand to be upon our church, its leaders and that all its members will grow in maturity.

3. World

- Continue to pray for the various nations that are at war:
 - a. Russia and Ukraine
 - b. Myanmar (Civil War) Pray for the situation where military service was made compulsory for man and woman between the ages of 18 and 35.
 - c. Israel & Hamas For any retaliation from Hamas and Iran as a result of the killing of Hamas' leader
- Continue to pray for countries that have an escalated conflict situation:
 - a. Japan, China and the Philippines in the South China Sea
 - b. North & South Korea
- Continue to pray for countries recovering from recent natural disasters:
 - a. Taiwan (Earthquake)
 - b. Indonesia (Volcanic Eruption)
 - c. South East Asia Heatwave across various countries
 - d. North Korea Flooding
 - e. Japan Earthquake (and the possibility of a megaquake)
 - f. India Heatwave
- Pray for Singapore
 - a. Pray for PM Lawrence Wong and his cabinet as they begin a new chapter for Singapore
 - b. Pray for a stability in the cost of living in Singapore
- Other Global Issues
 - a. Pray for the United States of America as they recover from the assassination attempt of Donald Trump
 - b. Pray for the Britain as it battles racist riots

4. Opportunities for Outreach

- ∉ Ask the Lord to bless us as we step out to reach a pre-believer.
- Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.
