

CELL DISCUSSION GUIDE

Date: 18 Aug 2024 | Speaker: Ps Joachim Tan | Topic: Caleb and One More Mountain | Scripture: Joshua 14:6-15

SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Be renewed in their desire to follow God wholeheartedly
- 2. Know that God is in full control despite challenges in our lives, and amidst the pains of church leadership transition.
- 3. Desire to hold on to God's promises for our lives and for RiverLife Church.

SERMON SUMMARY

There is much to learn about the faith and life of Caleb. Though Caleb was getting on in age, he was unsatisfied as there were still promises by God that were unfulfilled. God desires to fulfil His promises and he used Caleb to not only win the battle against the Anakites, but it broke the cycle of fear and stigma within the Israelite community.

"In the history of Caleb, three things are illustrated concerning faith.

- Faith sees and dares in the day of overwhelming difficulty
- Faith waits patiently through delays caused by failures in others.
- Faith acts with courage in the day of opportunity."

SERMON RECAP

Ps Joachim shared three spiritual lessons we can learn from Caleb's life and faith, and God's message for us and RiverLife Church.

3 Lessons from Caleb's life and faith

- 1. Caleb followed the Lord wholeheartedly (Joshua 14:8-9, 14)
- 2. Caleb saw in his spirit (heart) what God had promised (Joshua 14:7, Numbers 14:9)
- 3. Caleb did not allow the wanderings to break him (Joshua 14:10-11)

God is looking for His people, to conquer mountains and break the stigma and cycle of wanderings, like Caleb.

Although the Israelites looked unstoppable and was winning many battles with God on their side, the land only had rest from war after Caleb fought and conquered the land filled with giants, the Anakites, and the reproach / stigma of Israel was broken (Joshua 14:12-15)

God's message for RiverLife Church

1. God is in control

• Through the ups and downs of our lives, as well as the ups and downs of organisational life and leadership challenges, God is still fully in control.

2. God keeps his promises and His promises for RiverLife church remains

- Though Caleb had to wait 45 years, God never forgot His promise to Caleb.
- God longs to keep his promise to His people; it may take time, but He remembers. He is a promise keeping God.
- God's promises to RiverLife church all these years still remain true. It may take time and we may have to wait patiently, but God is a promise keeper.

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3. We are called to follow the Lord wholeheartedly, like Caleb

Caleb's life demonstrated what it looked like to follow the Lord wholeheartedly.

4. We are exhorted not to lose heart and not allow the wanderings to break us.

- Caleb's determination showed that his faith did not break in the 45 years of wandering, despite having done no wrong.
- Caleb could have been a bitter man, a man that broke ranks and left to set up a new family, new people and nation. But he chose to remain and he did not allow the wanderings to break him.



1. Was there a time or situation where you had to trust God's promises despite many challenges? How does Caleb's story inspire you in your own spiritual life and journey?

Leader's Notes

Caleb followed the Lord wholeheartedly and did not allow the 40 years of wandering in the desert to break him. Leaders can invite the cell to share their personal reflections on the life and faith of Caleb. Leaders can also invite members to share if they had encountered trials and challenging situations/seasons of "wilderness" with no answers, and how they overcame or walk through those situation(s).

Transition

Caleb's story illustrates the relationship between human obedience, and God's promises and faithfulness. Although he had done nothing to deserve the 40 years of wandering, he did not give up and continued to follow God wholeheartedly and believed that God would fulfil His promise.

2. Ps Joachim exhorted us not to allow the wanderings, including the pains of church leadership transitions, to break us. What are your thoughts concerning RiverLife church's leadership transition? Like Caleb, how can we respond?

Leader's Notes

Ps Joachim shared his personal journey of how he grew up in and with the RiverLife family to become the Missions Pastor today, despite going through earlier church leadership transitions and crisis. Leaders can invite members to share their own spiritual journey and experience being part of the RiverLife family and how they feel about the leadership transition.

Leaders can encourage the cell to remember that despite these moments of uncertainty, questions and hurts/disappointments, we have the assurance of an unfailing God – He is a promise keeper and His promises for RiverLife remain.

3. In what areas of your life do you need to demonstrate Caleb-like faith and obedience? How can you cultivate a faith like Caleb in your daily life?

Leader's Notes

Leaders can consider going deeper into specific areas and ask follow-up questions:

- Obedience Are you following God wholeheartedly like Caleb in every area of your life? Are there areas where you need to surrender to God and turn from your own ways?
- Faith Caleb waited 40 years before seeing God's promise fulfilled. What might God have waited so long to fulfil
 His promise? How long are you willing to wait to receive God's answer / see God's promise fulfilled in your life or
 in the church? Can you trust Him even if you do not receive immediate answers? What does Caleb's experience
 teach us about waiting for God's promises?
- Church Despite the church leadership transition, can we trust that God is in full control and His promises to RiverLife Church remain true?

Closing

Just as how Caleb did not allow the wandering in the desert to break him, may we not allow the wanderings in our lives, and the pains of leadership transitions (or heartfelt disappointments) break us. May we be like Caleb who wholeheartedly followed the Lord and continued to stay within his community (with his fellow Israelites).

Prayer Pointers

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

1. Sermon Application

- Pray for help to trust that God is in full control despite the challenges and trials we face in our personal life, and the pains of church leadership transition.
- Pray that God will give us faith to believe and hold on to His promises even in difficult times, and to help us follow Him wholeheartedly.

2. RiverLife

Let us continue to pray for God's hand to be upon our church, its leaders and that all its members will grow in maturity.

3. World

- Continue to pray for the various nations that are at war:
 - a. Russia and Ukraine
 - b. Myanmar (Civil War) Pray for the situation where military service was made compulsory for man and woman between the ages of 18 and 35.
 - c. Israel & Hamas For any retaliation from Hamas and Iran as a result of the killing of Hamas' leader
- Continue to pray for countries that have an escalated conflict situation:
 - a. Japan, China and the Philippines in the South China Sea
 - b. North & South Korea
- Continue to pray for countries recovering from recent natural disasters:
 - a. Taiwan (Earthquake)
 - b. Indonesia (Volcanic Eruption)
 - c. South East Asia Heatwave across various countries
 - d. North Korea Flooding
 - e. Japan Typhoon Ampil
 - f. Hong Kong Heatwave
- Pray for Singapore
 - a. Pray for PM Lawrence Wong and his cabinet as they begin a new chapter for Singapore
 - b. Pray for a stability in the cost of living in Singapore
- Other Global Issues
 - a. Pray for the resurgence of the mpox virus in Africa.
 - b. Pray for Bangladesh as the country recovers after the ousting of its Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina

4. Opportunities for Outreach

- ∉ Ask the Lord to bless us as we step out to reach a pre-believer.
- Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.
