

# CELL DISCUSSION GUIDE

Date: 29 Sep 2024 | Speaker: Ps. Joachim Tan | Topic: Let Us Not Ignore the Great Commission

Scripture: Matthew 28:16-20, Acts 1:8

#### SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

- 1. Seek to let go of personal hindrances and prioritize God's mission, surrendering to His will and purpose.
- 2. Have a deeper desire to love God and obey Him, fuelled by a renewed passion to fulfil the Great Commission.
- 3. Commit to intentional actions, such as prayer, outreach, and discipleship, to extend God's Kingdom locally and globally.

## **SERMON SUMMARY**

Pastor Joachim Tan issues a timely and urgent call for RiverLifers to embrace the Great Commission wholeheartedly. Drawing from Matthew 28:16-20 and Acts 1:8, Pastor Joachim reminds the congregation of their responsibility to make disciples of all nations. He emphasizes that this sermon follows the spiritual awakening from the previous week, where many responded to God's call for service. Now, the challenge is to ensure that the Great Commission is not ignored or treated with complacency. He stresses that this call is central to the mission of every believer and must not become something we grow weary of or indifferent to.

- 1. God has commissioned His Church to fulfil the Great Commission.
- 2. God has sent the whole Church into the whole world
- 3. God has empowered His Church so that the world will know His Son.

# **SERMON RECAP**

Pastor Joachim Tan issues a timely and urgent call to RiverLifers to wholeheartedly embrace the Great Commission, emphasizing its centrality to every believer's mission. Drawing from Matthew 28:16-20 and Acts 1:8, he reminds the congregation of their responsibility to make disciples of all nations.

Following last Sunday's powerful testimony from Lam Bao Yan on war-torn Ukraine, many RiverLifers responded to God's call for service. Now, the challenge is to ensure that the Great Commission is not ignored or treated with complacency.

Three Truths About the Great Commission:

God has commissioned His Church: The task of making disciples rests solely on the Church (Matthew 28:16-20, Acts 1:1-2, 8). In 1 Timothy 2:3-4, Paul emphasizes that God desires all people to be saved and come to know the truth. The greatest challenge is not clarity but obedience.

The early disciples understood this mandate clearly, and their lives were transformed by it. They knew Jesus had entrusted them with the greatest mission of their lives, and every fibre of their being was used to fulfil the Great Commission.

# **CELL DISCUSSION GUIDI**

God has sent the whole Church into the whole world: Every believer plays a crucial role in advancing God's
Kingdom (Matthew 28:19-20). To make converts, some men are needed, but to make disciples, everyone is needed.

In Acts 2, after the baptism of the Holy Spirit, it took one man to convert 3,000 people, but it took the whole church to disciple 3,000 converts. The Church needs:

- Teachers to teach sound theology and doctrines
- Spiritual parents to nurture new Christians
- Evangelists to sharpen the way we share the gospel
- Pastors to care for the flock

Together, the Church demonstrates generosity, servanthood, love, compassion, and forgiveness.

3. **God has empowered His Church**: The Holy Spirit empowers believers to reach the ends of the earth with the gospel (Acts 1:8). The disciples knew they were empowered for a greater purpose – not only for spiritual growth but to make disciples of all nations.

Despite trouble and persecution, they did not allow obstacles to stop them (Acts 7-8, Acts 15). They did not allow differences and church disputes to hinder the gospel's advancement.

## Response

As time is running short, Pastor Joachim challenges RiverLifers to recognize the empowerment available and overcome obstacles to engaging fully in this mission. He asks, "What is stopping you from obeying the Great Commission?"

John MacArthur's words resonate: "Satan continues his efforts to make sin less offensive, heaven less appealing, hell less horrific, and the Gospel less urgent." May we not fall prey to these tactics.

# Conclusion

In conclusion, Pastor Joachim's sermon served as a powerful reminder of the Church's responsibility to fulfil the Great Commission. May RiverLifers and believers worldwide respond to this call with obedience, unity, and empowerment, proclaiming the good news to all nations.

As we live in the 11th hour, may we prioritize the Great Commission, recognizing its centrality to our mission as believers! May we overcome complacency, embracing the urgent call to make disciples of all nations!



# 1. What do you think is currently hindering you from fully participating in the Great Commission, either personally or as a cell group?

#### Leader's Notes

Encourage the group to reflect on both personal and collective obstacles, such as fear, busyness, lack of training, or a misunderstanding of the Great Commission (Matthew 28:18-20).

Some may feel they don't have the right skills or platform to contribute. Guide the discussion to explore both practical and spiritual barriers (2 Corinthians 3:5-6). You can prompt them with: "What are some internal (e.g., doubts, insecurities) or external factors (e.g., time, resources) that might be stopping you from engaging in discipleship or evangelism?"

Acknowledge the real challenges but steer the conversation toward solutions and faith in God's empowerment (Ephesians 2:10).

#### Transition

As we have discussed, there are real barriers we face in fulfilling the Great Commission. But let's now consider how we can overcome these challenges, remembering that God has empowered each of us for this mission.

#### 2. How can we, as a cell group, intentionally support each other to be more missional in our daily lives?

#### Leader's Notes

Encourage the group to think of practical ways they can support one another, both spiritually and tangibly. Here are some ideas:

- <u>Accountability partners</u>: Pair up members to regularly check in and encourage each other in sharing the gospel or discipling someone.
- <u>Prayer focus</u>: Dedicate time during each cell meeting to pray for specific people or groups who need to know Christ (Colossians 4:2-4).
- <u>Outreach activities</u>: Plan simple outreach events like inviting friends or neighbours to a casual meal or a church service.
- <u>Testimony sharing</u>: Encourage members to share testimonies of how God is working through them in their workplaces, schools, or families.

As Francis Chan says, "We're not called to find purpose; we're called to align ourselves with God's purpose." Use Hebrews 10:24-25 to emphasize the importance of mutual encouragement: "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together... but encouraging one another." Additionally, share Romans 12:4-5 to remind the group of our interconnectedness.

#### Transition

As we explore ways to support one another, let's also consider how we can extend our missional impact beyond our cell group.

# Discussion Questions

3. How can we, as a cell group, extend our missional impact locally and globally, and what role can mission trips and practical giving play in this endeavour?

#### Leader's Notes

Encourage the group to explore ways to reach beyond their immediate community:

- Local outreach: Workplace relationships (1 Corinthians 3:9), neighbourhood connections, social media platforms, and local community events.
- Global outreach: Participating in mission trips (Matthew 28:18-20), supporting missionaries, and praying for nations (Revelation 7:9).
- Practical giving: Collecting gifts, sponsoring children, or providing disaster relief (Proverbs 19:17, 2 Corinthians 9:6-7).

#### Ask:

- What are some opportunities for our cell group to engage in mission trips?
- How can we support missionaries and organizations already working among unreached peoples?
- What practical gifts can we collect or provide to demonstrate God's love and care to those in need?

Emphasize the importance of being globally minded and practically involved in missions, as stated in Psalm 2:8 and Matthew 24:14.

#### Closing

As we close, remember that being missional is not just local, but global. Let's take small, practical steps together to reach the nations. Whether through prayer, giving, or going, we can each play a part. As we commit to supporting each other, trust that God will provide the strength and opportunities we need to fulfil the Great Commission (Philippians 4:13).

# Prayer Pointers

Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

#### 1. Sermon Application

- Pray for us to embrace and obey the Great Commission, asking God to remove any hindrances that keep us from fully participating in His mission.
- Pray that we will be empowered by the Holy Spirit to boldly share the gospel and make disciples in our daily lives.
- Pray for our cell group, that we will grow closer to God and support each other in becoming more missional, living
  out our faith with intentionality.
- Pray for our family members, friends, and colleagues who have yet to know Christ, asking God to open their hearts and provide opportunities for us to share His love with them.
- To commit the rest of 2024 to God, trusting Him to work in and through us as we seek to fulfil the Great Commission, both locally and globally.

#### 2. RiverLife

 Pray for our church, as we navigate through this season of transition. Pray for our leaders (pastors, elders, senior leadership team, etc.) to abide in Christ as they work together as one to move the church forward to fulfil our vision and mission.

#### 3. World

- Continue to pray for the various nations that are at war:
  - a. Russia and Ukraine
  - b. Myanmar (Civil War) Pray for the situation where military service was made compulsory for man and woman between the ages of 18 and 35.
  - c. Israel, Hamas, Hezbollah & Lebanon For the conflict to end quickly.
- Continue to pray for countries that have an escalated conflict situation:
  - a. Japan, China and the Philippines in the South China Sea
  - b. North & South Korea
- Continue to pray for countries recovering from recent natural disasters:
  - a. Bangladesh Flooding
  - b. Vietnam Super Typhoon Yogi
  - c. Indonesia Landslide at Illegal mine
- Pray for Singapore
  - a. Pray for a stability in the cost of living in Singapore
- Other Global Issues
  - a. Pray for the resurgence of the mpox virus in Africa.

#### 4. Opportunities for Outreach

- Ask the Lord to bless us as we step out to reach a pre-believer.
- Ask the Lord to grant you opportunities to reach out to a non-believing loved one, friend, or colleague this week as we seek to mature in Christlikeness.
